Dramatics are a great fun for children and usually it is done throughout the world.

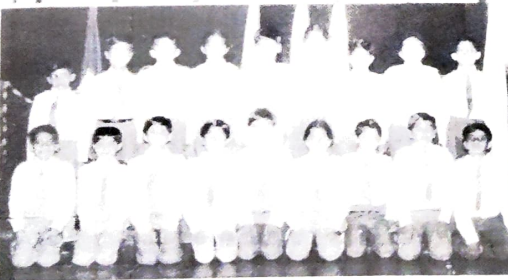
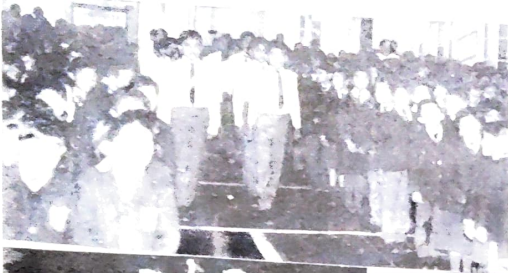

I like doing dramatics and dramatics should be done all over the world.

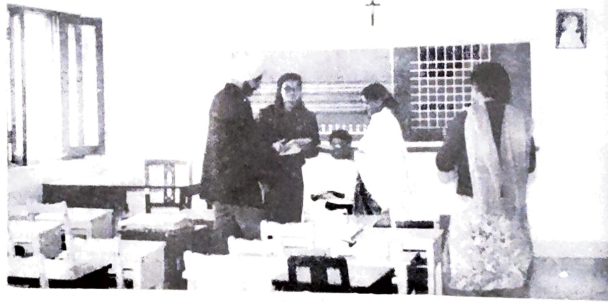

I was going to bed. It was 9.00 at night as I said my prayer and went to bed. I had a dream, an adventurous one.

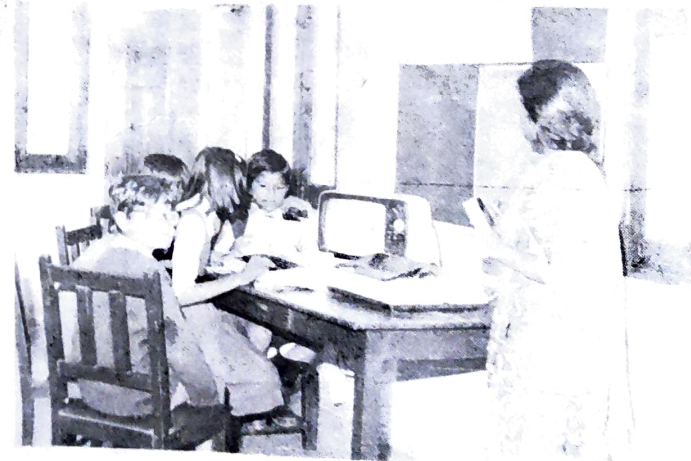
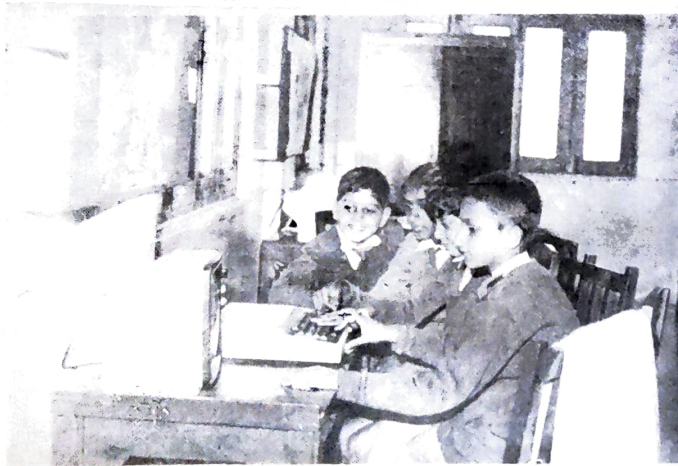

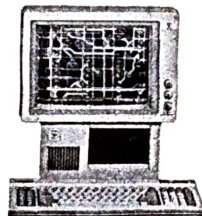
The measurements of a computer memory are:

Children spend most of their time in school and hence the foundation for healthy competition should be laid in school.

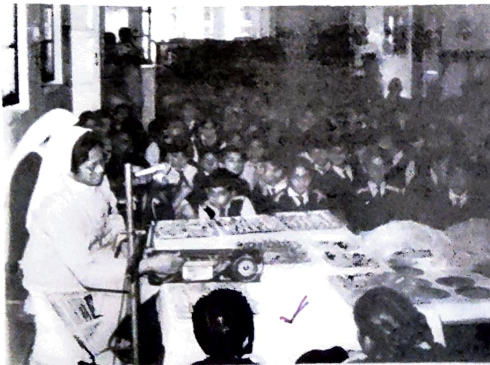
These days people are making fortunes by taking up sports as their careers. The government is doing a lot to improve the potential of players in various games. The grants by the government can be properly used only through an institution.

Rakshabandan is a very nice festival which shows sister's love to a brother. I hope everybody has a sister and every sister has a brother to take care of them.

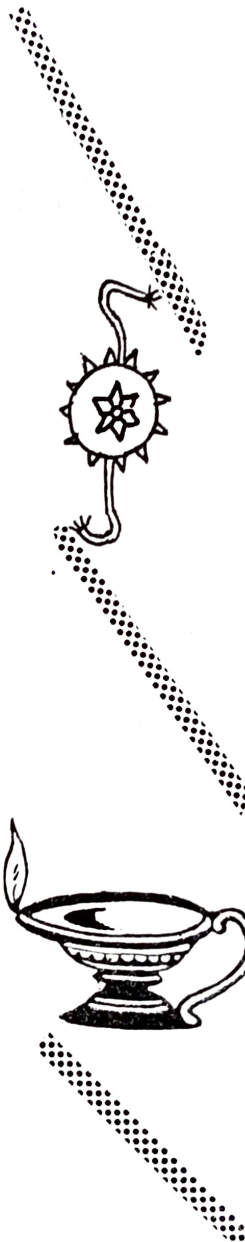
