ST. IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA

FOUNDER OF THE SOCIETY OF JESUS

OCTOBER 23, 1491 - JULY 31, 1556

St. Ignatius of Loyola, the Founder of the Society of Jesus, was born on October 23rd, 1491. He was one of the 13 children of a noble family in Northern Spain, Loyola. As a young man, Ignatius was very ambitious and had dreams of becoming a great leader. In 1521, while defending the town of Pamplona against the French attack, Ignatius was struck by a cannon ball in his legs. While recuperating, Ignatius experienced a conversion. He read about the lives of the saints and Christ. This made him a devout missionary and he wanted to serve the Catholic Church. With a small group of friends, Ignatius founded the Society of Jesus in 1540. The Society soon found its niche in education. Ignatius passed away on July 31st, 1556, at the age of 64. Even before his death his order had established 35 schools. Today, the Society of Jesus is known for its work in educating the youth around the world. Several Schools, Colleges and Universities have been named after him. The Jesuits are also engaged in many other important social works around the globe. The Feast of St. Ignatius of Loyola is celebrated on July 31 every year.



ST. FRANCIS XAVIER

THE PATRON SAINT

APRIL 7, 1506 - DECEMBER 3, 1552

Francis Xavier was born in the kingdom of Navarre, Spain on April 7, 1506. When he came of age, he was sent to study at the University of Paris where he met his friend, Peter Favre. They were highly influenced by Ignatius of Loyola, who encouraged Francis to become a priest. In 1530, Francis Xavier earned his Master's Degree and went on to teach Philosophy at the University of Paris. On August 15, 1534, Francis Xavier along with Peter Favre, and several other friends, made vows of Poverty, Chastity and Obedience. Francis Xavier left for India in 1541 on his 35th birthday. He arrived in Goa on May 6, 1542. He travelled extensively to Malacca, Maluku Islands and Japan. He died on December 3, 1552 while he was on his way to China. St. Francis Xavier is honoured as the Patron Saint of India and the Patron of all Xavier Institutions run by the Jesuits. The Feast of St. Francis Xavier is celebrated on December 3 every year.

JESUIT EDUCATION

Following the vision of Jesus and the MAGIS of Ignatius, we, the members of the Xavier family promote the emergence of a humane and egalitarian Indian society.

“There are two types of education one that teaches you how to make a living and other that teaches you how to live.”

The aim of education at Xavier's is to focus more on the formation of the youth rather than just imparting knowledge. In a world that is getting more and more bankrupt on basic human values, Xaverians are trained to become better human beings. The school inculcates the qualities of a passion for excellence, desire for freedom, courage, confidence, spirit of inquisitiveness etc. in its students. Education at Xavier's transcends the boundaries of the classrooms. The four walls of the classroom and what happens there do not define education. The teachers as well as students are infused with a rare passion much like that of our Patron, St. Francis Xavier and the Founder of the Society of Jesus, St. Ignatius of Loyola. Without being overtly spoken about, these great saints have found their way into the life of every Xaverian.

WE AIM...

1. **To develop an attitude of openness in each student:** to enable him/her to grow and begin to take up responsibility for his/her own growth.
2. **To prepare the students to be intellectually competent:** to promote the development of the intellectual skills, understanding and mastery of the academic requirements necessary for higher education and for life.
3. **To help the students to become mature religiously:** to help him/her know the major doctrines and practices of various religions and to learn to examine critically his/her own religious feelings and beliefs/ practices.
4. **To help the students to become loving persons:** to assist him/her in the establishment of his/her own identity and in his/her movement beyond self-centeredness towards more significant relationship with others.
5. **To foster in the students a commitment to do justice:** to help him/her develop as a person for others and to prepare him/her to take his/her place as a conscious, competent and compassionate member of the society.

JESUIT MISSION

By participating in the mission of Jesus Christ, we work for the transformation of society and care of Nature. We, together with others, build humane communities of freedom, fellowship, justice, equality, truth, integrity, forgiveness and reconciliation.

"We aim to form leaders in service, men and women of competence, conscience and compassionate commitment."

FOUR PILLARS OF JESUIT EDUCATION:

1. **Social Transformation:** Jesuit education aims not merely at economic enhancement of the individual or the society but creating men and women for others.
2. **Spiritual Transformation:** Jesuit education focuses on the formation of values and attitudes in the students. We believe that true knowledge leads us to God ultimately.
3. **Intellectual Transformation:** To develop imaginative, affective and creative dimension of the students.
4. **Personal Transformation:** To develop to the fullest possible extent, the God given talents or the self image of the learners.

OBJECTIVES OF JESUIT EDUCATION

The aim of Jesuit education is the formation of principled, value-oriented persons for others after the example of Jesus Christ. Jesuit education tries to instill a joy in learning and a desire to learn that will remain beyond the days in schools or colleges.

Jesuit Education:

1. Proposes Christ as the model for human life.
2. Aims at bringing about a true **Metanoia** - a change of heart by which a person turns from selfish concerns to complete and unreserved generosity towards God and His Kingdom.
3. Seeks to form '*Men and Women for others*'.
4. Aims to create leaders with the potential for influencing and transforming the society.
5. Imparts right values through education.
6. Manifests a particular concern for the poor.

The Society of Jesus has announced our Universal Apostolic Preferences to guide the Society in terms of focus of attention and resources for the next ten years (2019-2029).

They are :

1. To show the way to God through the Spiritual Exercises and discernment;
2. To walk with the poor, the outcasts of the world, those whose dignity has been violated, in a mission of reconciliation and justice;
3. To accompany the youth in the creation of a hope-filled future;
4. To collaborate in the care of our Common Home (Mother Earth).

The Universal Apostolic Preferences are the fruit of a process of discernment lasting almost two years. All Jesuits were invited to take part in it with our mission partners. It concluded with a confirmation from Pope Francis in a special meeting with Fr. General Arturo Sosa. The preferences give a horizon, a point of reference to the whole Society of Jesus. They capture our imaginations and awaken our desires. They unite us in our mission. The new Preferences are four areas vital for our world today. The Society of Jesus will pay special attention to them in the next ten years (2019-2029).

ST. XAVIER'S SR. SEC. SCHOOL, DELHI-54

St. Xavier's Senior Secondary School, Delhi-54 is a **Christian Minority School** established by the Society of Jesus, (JESUITS) in 1960. The School is recognized by the Directorate of Education, Government of NCT of Delhi and is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education.



THE SCHOOL MANAGEMENT

St. Xavier's School is run by the Society of Jesus that was founded by St. Ignatius of Loyola in 1540. It is an international Christian religious order that follows the teachings of the Roman Catholic Church. The members of the Society are popularly known as **Jesuits**. The Society is headquartered in Rome. The Jesuits are primarily known for their work in education (like establishing schools, colleges, universities and seminaries), intellectual research, and cultural pursuits, and for their missionary efforts in human rights and social justice. They are one of the largest known educational bodies in the world. From their humble beginning in Europe in 1540, today they have etched their presence in 112 nations in six continents. Today perhaps the best known education in India is imparted by the Jesuits. Hundreds of students belonging to every religious, linguistic and socio-economic group receive their education in the Jesuit educational institutions across the country each year.

St. Xavier's is a **Christian Minority School**. It not only gives preferential admission to the Christian/Catholic students but also makes a constant and sincere effort to inculcate Christian ethos and a secular outlook in its students. While all the students are provided with regular value education, special attention is provided to the Christian/Catholic students through Catechism classes. Scripture reading is encouraged among the students and the students recite the Lord's Prayer with devotion. At the end of each day, the students are given a guided meditation which is known as '**Atmachintan**' or **daily examen** which is a technique of prayerful reflection on the events of the day in order to acknowledge God's presence and discern God's direction for us. **Without exception all Xaverians imbibe the Gospel values while at school and become agents of social change in their later life.**



SCHOOL EMBLEM



(The following is the interpretation of the school emblem as originally conceived by Fr. Thomas M. Mackessack, S.J. and Fr. Robert J. Mayer, S.J.)

The Coat-of-Arms of St. Xavier's School, originally designed by Fr. Thomas M. Mackessack S.J., is majestic and meaningful. The beautiful symbolism contained in it provides a wealth of meaning and inspiration. At the top of the shield is emblazoned the lotus, the flower par excellence of India, signifying our country.

On the right below, the moon-like checkered and inverted crescent is taken from the coat of arms of the House of Xavier, symbolizing the special patronage of the Apostle of India, St. Francis Xavier, after whom our school is named. The third symbol in the crest is the sun like Jesuit sigillum or seal that indicates our school is conducted by the Society of Jesus, by Xavier's fellow Jesuits.

The sun like seal contains the name of Jesus, represented by 'IHS', the first three letters in Greek of the name of Jesus, surmounted by a Cross. The Sun is a symbol of the light of knowledge and the quest for perfection. Jesus Christ said: "I am the light of the world." And He said this to his disciples, "You are light of the world." The inscription written at the bottom proclaims that St. Xavier's School was founded in 1960.

Our inspiring motto, 'Esto Vir' (Be a Man/Play the Man), is taken from the parting instructions of King David to his son and royal successor, Solomon: "I am about to go the way of all flesh. Be strong, and **SHOW YOURSELF A MAN** (Esto Vir), and keep the charge of the Lord your God, walking in His ways and keeping His statutes and His commandments so that you may prosper in all you do." **'Esto Vir' urges every Xaverian to become strong and courageous and take charge of his/her life by being responsible and self-dependent.**

On the outside, an eagle can be seen holding the shield with its wings. Since the eagle is famous for soaring high, it is used as symbol of 'trying to reach the heights', reminding Xaverians of the watchword of St. Ignatius of Loyola: **'Seek the Greater Glory of God'** (A.M.D.G.-Ad Majorem Dei Gloriam). The two lions, standing on their hind legs and supporting the shield with their forefeet—similar to the four lions at the top of Ashoka Pillar, are meant to hold and uphold the dharma chakra, the wheel of order and carry the spirit of law and order to the four corners of the land. Like the two lions that hold the Xavier crest aloft, every Xaverian must protect and proudly proclaim the noble ideals of the Republic of India and its rich heritage, and the ideals of the Society of Jesus—the ideals for which St. Francis Xavier lived and died. **These ideals are enshrined in St. Xavier's School, Delhi, challenging all of us to be men and women for others.**

SCHOOL TRADITIONS

In our school we take pride in following **certain traditions**. They are

1. Always be friendly with one another; both on and off the campus.
2. Avoid vulgarity in talk and behaviour.
3. Accept whatever work is assigned to you as your rightful share.
4. Offer assistance to a visitor on the School campus.
5. Rise and greet when a teacher or visitor enters your class room.
6. Be courteous and sporting towards the opposing teams and the officials on the sports field.
7. Respect the School library and the rights of the other students using it.
8. Help to maintain the beauty of the School premises and report immediately to the office if any damage is done to school property.
9. Keep the school premises free from littering and pick up any litter dropped even by others.
10. Observe and learn good manners.
11. Always be punctual in reaching school (before 7.40 a.m.) / in completing the school work.
12. Take pride in wearing school uniform/school badges.

These traditions are small things in themselves, but they go a long way in the formation of our students. These traditions must be put into practice voluntarily because we believe that forcing them to follow rules would destroy their value. The desire to observe them must come from within and must be genuine; only then can one's character be formed.

EDUCATIONAL POLICIES OF XAVIER'S

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

For two decades, after its inception, St. Xavier's was primarily an English medium School. The School catered to the educational needs of the elite and thus it maintained its high standard through imparting education in English. During this time, English, both written and spoken was more emphasized so that our students would be able to compete with other schools of great reputation.

But by the late 70's and early 80's, there was a growing awareness among the Jesuits to help the poor by empowering them through education. Hence, most of the Jesuit schools began admitting students from the lower strata of the society. In order to facilitate the education of poor students, the medium of instruction too had to be in mother tongue. Thus from 1980 onwards, the medium of instruction upto class 5 was changed to Hindi. The Jesuit educators realized that education is imparted best in the mother tongue, as it facilitates better assimilation of difficult concepts. They argued that in most leading countries of the world (like Japan, France, Germany etc.) the students are taught in their own language rather than in a foreign tongue. But in the context of globalization in the 1990's and the IT boom that started in India, the Jesuit educators gave a re-thinking on the policy of medium of instruction. The utility of English became all the more prominent when India became a destination for global investment. Once again English language became predominantly the global link language for education and business. Hence, there arose the need to focus more on learning English. Therefore, in 2009 the medium of instruction was reverted to English and the new policy was implemented from the year 2010. **Now St. Xavier's is a fully English Medium School.**

CO-EDUCATION

When established in 1960, St. Xavier's School was a Boys' only school. The founding Fathers followed the age-old Jesuit educational policy of providing educational assistance to boys as they thought that men were supposed to take the lead in the society and the women were considered to play only a secondary role in the family and the society.

But with the ushering of the modern era, nuclear families became very popular and women began to play a major role in every society world over. They not only have to look after their children but even go out to work. Hence, it became imperative that they too are given proper educational opportunities to grow. A country like India has tremendous potentialities in its women population which has been totally neglected for centuries. The Delhi Jesuits read the writings on the wall and in 1984 they decided to convert Xavier's into a co-ed school from the academic year 1985-86. The first batch of co-ed students graduated from Xavier's in 1998.



HOUSE SYSTEM

The pioneers were not merely satisfied with imparting the 3-R's (Reading, Writing, Arithmetic), but focussed more on character formation and personality development. They encouraged healthy competition among students in various activities and for that purpose the students were divided into four different Houses. The House system was started in 1960 itself and the Houses were named after different colours. From 1961, it was changed into the names of animals and the Houses were known as 'Lions', 'Leopards', 'Panthers' and 'Tigers'. In 1971 the Houses were re-named as '**BHABHA**', '**GANDHI**', '**NEHRU**', and '**TAGORE**', a system that the school had been continuing till date.

SOCIAL COMMITMENT OF THE SCHOOL

Since its foundation, St. Xavier's School, does its bit in empowering the powerless and giving voice to the voiceless through the education of the economically weaker sections. Every year the school organises many programmes to familiarize our students with the social realities of the world at large and our country in particular. Regular exposure programmes are held with this end in view. Students are taken to nearby slums, orphanages and homes for the aged.

The Xaverian family has established numerous scholarships to help the education of the economically weaker students. Many alumni support the education of the children from less privileged sections of the society who are admitted to St. Xavier's School. In this context it is worthwhile to mention about the contributions made by the batch of 1985. They have set a Trust to raise funds for the education of students from the weaker section of the society. Presently they are educating 16 students from their contribution.

XAVIER FAIR

Xavier Fair, school's annual fiesta, since it's inaugural event on 3rd November 1963, had been one of the most eagerly awaited and appreciated events of the school. The Xavier Fair organised to nurture & foster empathy, kindness, and social responsibility among students. Inspired by the values of St. Francis Xavier, the fair encourages students to understand the needs of others and extend a helping hand to the less fortunate. Through various stalls, activities, and charitable initiatives, students learn the importance of sharing, compassion, and teamwork. The event provides an opportunity to develop sensitivity towards the society and foster a spirit of generosity in the Xaverians. Owing to the active cooperation of the staff, parents, alumni and all other well wishers, the school has set up a Fee Concession Fund with a substantial amount to help the education of the students from economically weaker sections of the society. With the help of the Scholarship Fund, Xavier's provides quality education to numerous underprivileged children, opening the doors of opportunity for a safe & secure future for them.

THE XAVERIAN SPIRIT

The Xaverian Spirit is the sense of belonging and fellowship that the students inherently imbibe and exude throughout their lives, for it's rightly said, 'Once a Xaverian, Always a Xaverian'. This great institution instills in all Xaverians, lessons that they will hold dear to their hearts and will stand them in good stead in their lives. Our students come from different ethnicities, follow different religions, speak different languages and have different accents, customs, costumes and cuisines. Nonetheless, at Xavier's they all learn and grow together, with a common Global Identity- the Xaverians, sharing the same hopes, dreams and aspirations and also helping others to nurture the same. It matters little where one is from, which Indian language one speaks at home, what version of religious faith one espouses. On the school campus they are all one; learning to live with each other in peace, harmony and fellowship. In many educational institutions students learn to answer the questions but at Xavier's they learn to question the answers. Some of them go further; they question the questions. This spirit of knowing and enquiring without fear has, created many merit holders in the Board exams, many professionals with conscience and national political leaders of high calibre.

AFFINITY BETWEEN STUDENTS AND TEACHERS

In a Jesuit school, the chief responsibility for moral as well as for intellectual formation rests finally not upon any procedure or curricular or extra-curricular activity, but upon the teacher, under God's guidance. A Jesuit school is to be a face-to-face community in which an authentic personal relationship between teachers and students may flourish. Without such a relationship of friendship, in fact much of the unique force of our education would be lost. Therefore, at Xavier's there is a strong bonding between the teacher and the taught. It is a rare and strong one. It is not limited to the class a teacher teaches. Every teacher interacts with far more students than he or she teaches in the capacity of a Club Moderator, a House Moderator or as the organizer of an activity. These different levels of interaction highlight different facets of the nature of children and teachers too. Sometimes teachers have a tendency to impose, thinking that they know what is best for their students. It becomes difficult to undermine their position of authority and grant leverage to the kids. But at Xavier's most of us, the teachers, know that at times we need to trust the students and learn from them too. Xavier's is a fertile breeding ground for creativity and innovation and offers rich learning experiences for both the students and the teachers.

Teachers spend valuable time guiding and advising students. There have been times when a simple nod of approval or a word of encouragement has done wonders for a depressed child. An angry rebellious child has often been appeased by an understanding, yet a wise and calm word from a teacher. Like the Mother Seagull (Liam 'O' Flaherty), at times the teachers present demanding or challenging situations before their young fledglings to help them gain confidence. Teachers and Jesuits at Xavier's are the axle around which our students' lives turn. They move ahead but constantly need the axle to be on the right track. Once they reach class 12, they bubble with energy, ready to take a giant leap into the boundless sky, ready to touch new horizons and explore new worlds.



MILESTONES IN THE HISTORY OF XAVIER'S

Hotel Cecil complex, a boys' only boarding school—an exclusive school for the elite, introduction of co-education, the School becoming socially inclusive, change of the medium of teaching, drastic upgradation of the School's Infrastructure at the beginning of the New Millennium, a modern technology driven school-these are some of the landmarks the School has achieved during its 66-year-old journey.

FROM HOTEL CECIL TO XAVIER'S DELHI

The present St. Xavier's School campus used to be a British Five Star hotel named Hotel Cecil, one of the three oldest and most famous British Five Star Hotels of Delhi in the 1950's. It was started in 1904 by Mrs. F.E. Hotz, Mother of the American siblings Mr. Hans Hotz (the Managing Director of the Hotz Hotels in India at the time when the property was purchased by the Jesuits) and his sister Ms. White. In the post independent India, Hotel Cecil in Delhi was known for its homely environment. It had large apartment like suites, which made it a favourite of many European families that visited India in those days.

In 1950's Hotel Cecil was known as the 'Country Club' because there were hosts of beautiful flowers all over the hotel complex. It was “quite popular among the British women who would often come here for idle gossip in the afternoons and would return in the evenings with their husbands for dinner and dance” (Reported by the Hindustan Times dated August 31, 2011). The lawns were well manicured and the neem trees looked absolutely majestic. There were numerous shady trees and a variety of flowers like rose and dahlia on the campus.

By 1958, the Management of Hotel Cecil ran into labour troubles and they decided to sell the property to someone who would look after the campus and not commercialize it. Coincidentally in 1958, Patna Jesuit Vice Provincial Fr. Edward F. Mann, S.J. appointed Fr. Frank Loesch, S.J. to look for a suitable site to begin a school in Delhi. The then Archbishop of Delhi Rev. Joseph Fernandes was more than happy to invite the Jesuits to Delhi.

It was Fr. James Tong, S.J. the Kentucky born Jesuit who was the Chaplain of the Catholic Hospital Association of India who discovered that the Cecil Hotel was up for sale. The Hotel came up for the consideration of the Jesuits as a possible site for the new school in Delhi. This location was more suitable for their purposes and the Archbishop and the Apostolic Internuncio were very much enthusiastic about the Jesuits purchasing it. Fr. James Tong, S.J. then initiated the negotiations between the Patna Jesuit Society and the Cecil Hotel



management for the transaction of the property. In June 1959, Fr. Loesch began discussions with the Cecil owners. Finally, on 1st November, 1959, the Cecil Hotel ceased to function and the property was transferred to Delhi St. Xavier's Society on 21st December 1959. **St. Xavier's School, Delhi was blessed and inaugurated on 6th January 1960 by the most Rev. James R. Knox, The Apostolic Internuncio in India.**

BOYS' ONLY BOARDING SCHOOL

With his architectural competence, Fr. Loesch, S.J. who was its first Rector, gave the Hotel building a new shape where the lives of many generations of students were to be destined. He got the hotel complex converted into a modern school and built the Senior as well as the Junior school buildings by 1969. Initially, Xavier's was a boys' only school and boarding facilities were provided to the students. By 1970's it had become a school for Delhi's elite.

TRUE NEIGHBOURHOOD SCHOOL

In 1971 the boarding facilities were closed down to provide educational facilities to a large number of students from Delhi. Gradually it became a 'True Neighbourhood' school. The objective of introducing neighbourhood policy was to help the students to use the school facilities even after the school time and on holidays. The parents too found it easy to come to school and meet the teachers of their wards.

FROM AN EXCLUSIVE ELITIST TO AN INCLUSIVE SCHOOL

With their General Chapter of 1974, the Jesuits developed sharper awareness towards the structural dimensions of injustice in the human society and committed themselves to do what they could, to create a just and humane society. It became the policy of the school to create an

egalitarian society by providing quality education to all strata of the society. This includes those without economic means, the marginalised and all those who are, in any sense, unable to live a life of full human dignity. In Jesuit education this option is reflected both in the students that are admitted and in the type of formation that is given.

From 1980 Xavier's gave up its elitist culture of being an exclusive school and decided to be an inclusive school where preferential admission was given to the children from the socio-economically weaker sections of the society. The school at present caters to the educational needs of the students from the poor families in the neighbourhood who otherwise can't afford quality education.

MILLENNIUM CHANGES

St. Xavier's School has had the distinction of setting a benchmark in progressive and innovative changes. The dawn of the new Millennium saw drastic changes in education at Xavier's, especially in terms of creating new infrastructure. The construction of the Millennium Complex, under the aegis of Fr. P.T. Augustine, S.J. in 2001 redefined education in Xavier's.

JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS

SILVER JUBILEE

1985 was a landmark year in the history of St. Xavier's, Delhi. The School celebrated its Silver Jubilee of its inception. Xavier's shed its tag of a young school and matured into adulthood. Two important innovative changes the School underwent at this time, were opening the doors of Xavier's to girls thereby becoming a co-ed school in 1986. Secondly a new block for the Prep. School students was opened, which provided tiny tots the freedom to play around, without being affected by the usual din of the school activities.

GOLDEN JUBILEE

The School celebrated the Golden Jubilee in 2009-2010 with mega shows organized by the three departments of our school.

DIAMOND JUBILEE

2019-2020 saw the school crossing another milestone, 60 Diamond Years, in its service to the cause of education for the people of Delhi. A Musical Mega Show titled '**JOSEPH'S DREAM COAT**', was organized on 22nd and 23rd October 2019 to celebrate the occasion in a befitting way.





NATIONAL CADET CORPS

Jesuit Mission, in and through quality education, aims to form leaders in service, men and women of competence, conscience and compassionate commitment. Resonating the same motto and vision, in 2017, the then Principal Fr. M. Arockiam S.J and the Vice Principal Mr. K.J. Devasia took the decisive step of establishing an NCC COY (Army) under the NCC Unit 1 DELHI GIRLS BATTALION (1DGBN) for the girls of classes 8 &9. As per the protocol, the school then appointed Ms. Jayanti Dewan as the teacher in charge of the NCC Unit. The cadets are given regular Institutional Training to give them an exposure to the 'regimental way of life' and 'Defence Services' work ethos. The in-house training inculcates in them, the values of self- confidence, discipline, punctuality, orderliness, respect for the authorities, sincerity of purpose, secular outlook, comradeship, spirit of adventure and sportspersonship. The cadets attend 10 days Annual Training camp wherein they are given hands-on training in various professional skills like Weapon Training, Map Reading, Field Craft/Battle Craft etc. It is mandatory for the cadets to attend at least one camp during the two year period of their enrolment. The trained cadets represent the school/NCC Unit in various Unit Level, State Level as well as the National level camps/events/competitions under the able guidance and supervision of S/O Jayanti Dewan (Associate NCC Officer). The numerous laurels, awards and recognitions that the Cadets have brought home to school, are indeed the splendid testimonials of their dedication and passion for the way of life that's meant only for the bravehearts. Moreover, the Ceremonial Drills, Piloting and the Guard of Honour of the NCC Contingent, do add a flavour of elegance, grandeur and solemnity to all the major events/ceremonies of the school. The 1DGBN subunit at Xavier's, fosters the process of training and moulding the cadets, to be disciplined and dedicated citizens of the nation and for the nation, thereby taking the vision and mission of the Jesuits, a step closer to it's fulfilment.



SCHOOL MARCHING BAND/CEREMONIAL BAND

The Management of the school, with an aim to develop discipline and infuse love for our rich culture and heritage amongst the budding Xaverians of Classes VI & VII, established a School Marching/Ceremonial Band in 2024. This crucial step was indeed the fruitful result and manifestation of the strenuous effort, determination and perseverance of the Principal Fr. Dr. T.J. Jose S.J. who left no stones unturned in accomplishing the vision and a long cherished dream he had been nursing, ever since he took over as the Principal of the school. The Marching Band training, aims to provide an enriching and disciplined musical experience for the students. It nurtures and fosters teamwork, leadership qualities, a sense of pride and accomplishment by providing them a glimpse/taste of the much elaborate Army Ceremonial Band. Moreover, the Ceremonial Drill by the School Marching Band adds an extra elegance and grandeur to all the major events of the school such as the Swimming Meet, Sports Day, Xavier Fair, and various programmes hosted by the Alumni Association-DOXA. Furthermore, once the Band becomes eligible, the team will get the opportunity to perform at various interschool competitions, State and National Educational events/competitions and the events organized by the CBSE. In addition to these, the training/exposure opens an opportunity for the Band to take part in the Republic Day Parade, performance at the Statue of Unity, performance at the National War Memorial/Police War Memorial and various competitions organized by the Ministry of Education.





BHARAT SCOUTS AND GUIDES PROGRAMME

Holistic development is one of the central pillars of the Jesuit vision and mission. Rooted in the spirituality of St. Ignatius of Loyola and the educational tradition of the Society of Jesus, it seeks the formation of the whole person - intellectually, morally, spiritually, emotionally, and socially. As part of the commitment to the holistic development of the students, the school established Bharat Scouts and Guides Programme in the academic session 2026-'27. This significant initiative has been introduced under the dynamic leadership of the Principal, Fr. Sobin K. Thomas S.J., who strongly believes that the holistic formation is about moulding competent, conscientious, compassionate and committed Xaverians who can guide with purpose, serve with generosity and lead with integrity.



The Scouts and Guides Movement is a globally recognised educational programme that focuses on building character, leadership, discipline, social responsibility, and a spirit of service among young people. It aims to nurture students who are physically fit, mentally alert, morally upright, and socially responsible. In an age where children face increasing academic pressure and social challenges, this programme provides a structured platform

to cultivate essential life skills.

Through carefully designed activities including community service, first-aid training, environmental awareness, adventure camps, disaster preparedness, and leadership workshops, students gain practical exposure that strengthens both character and competence. This initiative aims at transforming individuals into those adopting a more humane approach towards their nation and the world at large, in turn making the world a better place.

THE MILLENNIUM HALL COMPLEX

Constructed at the turn of the new millennium, by the then Principal Fr. P.T. Augustine, S.J., the Millennium Hall is ultra modern, with unmatched facilities and amenities. Creatively designed and skilfully constructed under the craftsmanship of Fr. P.T. Augustine, S.J., this grand building links the Senior School to the Junior School through corridors. The complex consists of a large air-conditioned hall with a spacious stage, balcony, control room and large green rooms at the back stage. Moreover, it houses two Language Labs, two Computer Labs, two AI, Robotics and Innovation Labs, a Music Room, and a Dance and Drama Room in the ground floor. One of the main attractive features of the complex is the beautiful garden in front of it.



AI, ROBOTICS AND INNOVATION LAB

Keeping pace with today's rapidly evolving world with the Artificial Intelligence, Robotics, Automation, and Design Thinking, the school has set up an AI, Robotics & Innovation Lab. The new AI, Robotics and Innovation Lab is designed to empower students not just to use technology, but to understand it, create it, and innovate with it.

In the spirit of the Jesuit education, we believe in forming the whole person, intellectually competent, morally grounded, spiritually aware, and socially responsible. The lab reflects that commitment and it is envisaged to foster:

- * Critical and Creative Thinking
- * Collaboration and Leadership
- * Ethical use of Technology
- * Innovation rooted in Service

The Innovation Lab is more than a room filled with advanced equipment. It is a space where imagination will take flight, where curiosity will be nurtured, and where young minds will transform ideas into meaningful solutions. With gratitude to all who have worked tirelessly to make this vision a reality, the school officially dedicates the Artificial Intelligence, Robotics & Innovation Lab to the growth, excellence, and holistic formation of every Xaverian.

INFORMATION COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY (ICT) LAB

The ICT Lab in the Prep School is named after Fr. Richard Pereira, who was the Director of the Prep School from 1985 to 1988. The lab is fully air-conditioned and spacious. It is well equipped with good speakers, sound mixers and a good quality smart board with a touch screen and a projector. Inside the lab there is a CD collection on various concepts ranging from Mathematics, English Rhymes to Environment. Internet connection has been provided so that the teachers can download the best videos for students. Students of the Prep School visit the ICT lab at least once a week. It is based on Interactive Teaching and Learning process and enables the students to learn by using the interactive Smart Board.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE LABS

St. Xavier's Sr. School is equipped with two English Language labs, for training the junior as well as the senior students. The English language labs have undergone an overall technological upgradation in 2026. With the upgraded Language Labs, the school embraces modern tools that make language learning more interactive, engaging, and immersive. The facility now includes:

- * Advanced audio-visual systems
- * Interactive language learning software
- * Digital pronunciation and speech analysis tools
- * Individual student workstations for personalized practice
- * Multimedia resources for global exposure

COMPUTER LABS

Dr. Shekhar Agarwal, whom we lost on May 10, 2021 due to Covid, had always been a caring, benevolent and a genuine humane being always ready to aid and assist any member of his Xaverian Family.



On 3rd July, 2022, Padma Shri Fr. Thomas Kunnunkal S.J, inaugurated the refurbished Infirmary. It is now equipped with ultra modern medical facilities including separate cubicles for boys and girls, ICU beds with Ventilators, Stretchers, Wheelchairs etc. making it a state-of-the-art facility for the students and the staff in the event of any medical emergency.

DANCE AND DRAMA ROOM AND MUSIC ROOM

On 31st July, 2022 the refurbished Music Room and the new Dance and Drama room were inaugurated in the Senior School by our Jesuit dignitaries. The new Music Room has perforated walls and is ideal for recording and practice. It can accommodate almost 30 students and has all the instruments for practice.



The Dance and Drama room too has perforated walls and ambient lights for drama and dance practice. The 20 feet high mirror along the wall, is the new addition to the room. These two rooms, will definitely prove to be a launch pad for the budding actors, dancers and musicians to hone their skills and master their innate talents

MR. KJ DEVASIA MEMORIAL PAPER RECYCLING PLANT

JR. SCHOOL SCIENCE LABORATORY

The E-Library is a comprehensive digital platform that stores and manages a wide range of educational materials in electronic format. All materials such as animated e-books, encyclopaedias, newspapers, magazines, curriculum based articles are safely stored in a structured digital system with controlled access, ensuring proper management and protection of resources. ASSESSMENT AND PROMOTION CRITERIA

The school follows the guidelines issued by the Directorate of Education, Government of NCT of Delhi and the CBSE for the promotion of students to the next class. Guidelines given by the Directorate of Education, Government of NCT of Delhi and the CBSE are subject to change from time to time.

PROMOTION TO NEXT HIGHER CLASS FOR THE ACADEMIC SESSION 2026-27 WILL BE BASED ON THE GUIDELINES ISSUED BY THE CBSE DURING THE COURSE OF THE CURRENT ACADEMIC SESSION.



COURSES / SUBJECTS OF STUDIES AT THE SENIOR SECONDARY LEVEL

Since study in class XI is designed to be SELECTIVE as per the CBSE rule, students of Class 10 MUST indicate on the prescribed form the choice of subjects in Class XI before their 10th Standard final Examination. If any student does NOT submit the form by the prescribed date, it will be presumed that he/she does not want to continue +2 studies in our School.

Students have to indicate THREE preferences on the form where the choice of subjects is given. **The criteria for selection to various subject options will be based on the average of marks scored by the student in the examinations of Std. IX and X, including the Pre-Board examinations.**

Different subject combinations available in Science, Commerce and Humanities at +2 level in our school for the academic session 2026-27 are:

- OPTION 1 English, Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Mathematics
- OPTION 2 English, Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Psychology
- OPTION 3 English, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Computer Science
- OPTION 4 English, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Economics
- OPTION 5 English, Mathematics, Economics, Business Studies and Accountancy
- OPTION 6 English, Accountancy, Business Studies, Informatics Practices and Entrepreneurship
- OPTION 7 English, Economics, History, Political Science and Mathematics
- OPTION 8 English, Economics, History, Political Science and Psychology
- OPTION 9 English, History, Political Science, Informatics Practices and Psychology

CIRCULAR
MODEL CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS**

The following are the acts and misconduct which amount to forbidden practices

1. Absence from classes without the permission of the teacher/Vice-Principal/ Principal.
2. Misbehaviour towards teachers or any other employee of the school.
3. Disobeying lawful orders of the teacher/Vice Principal/Principal
4. Intentional disturbance of classes.
5. Bullying/Rowdyism and rude behaviour.
6. Eve-teasing/misbehaviour toward girl-students.
7. Bringing unauthorized people/articles inside the school.
8. Bringing electronic gadgets/mobile phones in the school.
9. Indulging in acts of moral turpitude.
10. Any behaviour unbecoming of a student.
11. Smoking/Chewing Gutkha/Paan/Khaini etc.
12. Use of motor vehicle like Scooty/Moped etc., by the student and bringing these in the school.
13. Use of drugs or intoxicant (except on prescription by a registered Medical Practitioner)
14. Any form of gambling.
15. Theft/pilferage of school/students property
16. Disfiguring or otherwise damaging any school property
17. Spitting in or near the school building except where the spiting is made in any spittoon provided by the school.
18. Use of violence in any form.
19. Casteism, Communalism or practice of Untouchability.
20. Propagating a strike/disruption of classes.
21. Association with banned organizations

All these above acts of misconduct are the forbidden practices. In the above acts of misconduct, Principal/HOS shall take suitable action as per observation of the disciplinary committee at school level depending upon gravity of misconduct, which may include:

1. Oral/Written warning to the students and parents
2. Detention during the break for completion of neglected class work.
3. Suspension from attending classes/school for a specified period.
4. Recovery of loss through replacement to school property due to wilful damage.
5. Expulsion/Rustication from school for students of classes IX to XII in rarest of rare cases

DISCIPLINE

All Xaverians are expected to conduct themselves as gentlemen/ladies at all times and in all places. The whole-hearted co-operation of the guardians is expected at all times in the formation of the character of their wards. As the child progresses from the Junior to the Senior classes, increasing opportunities will be given to shift from conforming to externally imposed order to self-imposed discipline. The school will insist on strict punctuality, regular school attendance, cleanliness in dress, general grooming and fidelity to study and work assignments. Absenting oneself from school merely for a social function is strongly discouraged.

Xaverians should behave in a courteous manner wherever they go. The school regards every Xaverian as its brand ambassador.

RULES CONCERNING DISCIPLINE

Rules of Conduct for Students

1. Every student must bring the **school diary to school daily, with page 1 and 3 duly filled by the parent.**
2. All students must be clean and neatly dressed in school uniform according to the season. Trousers and blazers must be of the prescribed pattern and colour. Uniforms of other shades are not allowed in school.
(FOR DETAILS OF SCHOOL UNIFORM SEE PAGES 59-60)
3. All school property must be taken care of and no student should scratch or spoil the desks or chairs or damage any other school furniture, write or draw anything on the walls or in any way damage things belonging to others. Each class will be responsible for looking after the class property.
4. No books other than textbooks or library books may be brought to the school.
5. Pupils are **forbidden to bring crackers, explosives or any other dangerous/harmful materials to school.** Strict disciplinary action will be taken against such offenders.
6. Bullying on school campus is a serious offence and strict disciplinary action will be taken against those who indulge in it.
7. Students must not bring more money to school than required. School is not responsible for the money lost / stolen.
8. The school is not responsible for any goods/valuables lost. Therefore it is advisable not to bring any valuables (like expensive watches or ornaments) to school.
9. Driving of vehicles to the School by students below the age of 18 and without a valid driving licence is not permitted. If caught doing so, the parents will be held responsible.

10. Bringing I-pods, wrist bands, smart watches etc. to school is forbidden. **As per the advisory received from the Directorate of Education, Government of NCT of Delhi (No. DE.15 (305)/PSB/2020/Pt. File-III/7100/7101) dated 10/08/'23, Smart Phones are strictly prohibited in school under rule 43 of DSER 1973.** Disciplinary action including fine will be initiated against the violators. Once confiscated, it will not be returned until the parent / guardian himself/herself furnishes a letter of apology to the school administration.
11. The school reserves to itself the right to dismiss students whose diligence or progress in studies is steadily unsatisfactory or whose conduct is harmful to the other students or whose guardians show little interest in the progress of their wards.
12. Use of unfair means in tests/exams is considered a serious offence. Strict disciplinary action may be taken against the involved student. Repetition of the same will result in dismissal.
13. **Bunking** school / class will invite serious disciplinary action.
14. Use of abusive language is strictly forbidden in school.
15. School **can withdraw the fee concession** granted to a student if he/she indulges in indisciplined behaviour or does not perform academically well.
16. **DISCIPLINE POLICY – GREY & PURPLE CARD SYSTEM**

To promote a safe, respectful, and disciplined learning environment, the school has implemented a structured GREY and PURPLE Card system. This system ensures fairness, accountability, and consistency in addressing student behaviour.

GREY CARD is issued for minor violations of school rules. GREY Cards serve as formal warnings and reminders to correct behavior promptly.

PURPLE CARD is issued for serious disciplinary offenses.

All cards are cumulative and cannot be withdrawn or cancelled. Students are therefore expected to consistently maintain proper conduct throughout the academic year.

Only the Principal, Vice Principal, Headmaster or Asst. Headmistress are authorized to issue GREY and PURPLE Cards. Their decision shall be considered final and binding. This system is designed not merely as a disciplinary measure, but as a corrective framework to guide students toward responsible behaviour, self-discipline, and respect for the school community. Students are encouraged to uphold the highest standards of conduct at all times.

RULES CONCERNING ABSENCE

1. **Late arrival:** All students must report to school by 7.40 am. Appropriate disciplinary action will be taken against those who arrive late to school for more than three days in a month.
2. No one who is late or has been absent on the previous day will be admitted to the class without the permission of the Class Teacher/Vice Principal/Headmaster/Asst.Headmistress/Director of Prep School.
3. Except in the case of unforeseen illness, no leave may be taken without prior sanction from the school authorities.
4. For leave of absence for 1-3 days, it is sufficient to apply through the pages of the school diary. (Parents may also apply online for leave for the above mentioned period). For leave of absence for more than 3 days a written leave application should be submitted to the department concerned. **In case of sick leave for more than three days an application along with a medical fitness certificate must be submitted** when the student returns to school after the period of sickness; but prior information should be given to the Vice-Principal's office / Reception, Jr. School office / Prep. School / Reception. A student returning to the school after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease should produce a doctor's fitness certificate permitting him/her to rejoin class and stating that the infectious period of the disease is over.
5. Every absence (Sick leave or otherwise) must be entered briefly in the NON-ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE RECORD in the school diary and signed by the parent or guardian.
6. For marriage within the family one day's leave is granted, as a rule. For this, prior sanction is needed.
7. In the event of a student falling sick during the school hours, the parent should come to school and take him/her home. **No student who falls sick in the school will be allowed to go home alone.**
8. **No student will be allowed to leave the school campus during the school hours without the consent of the parents.**
9. Repeated absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than five consecutive days renders the student liable to his/her name being struck off from the rolls. Re-admission, if granted will be done on payment of a re-admission fee.
10. All students are expected to attend school on the re-opening day after each vacation. Those absent because of sickness must inform the school before or on the reopening day and present a medical certificate before they are admitted to the class.

SCHOOL SAFETY POLICY

For the safety and security of the students, **ST. XAVIER'S SR. SEC. SCHOOL, RAJ NIWAS MARG** has instituted a School Safety Policy, compliance of which is solicited from every parent/visitor.

- As per the norms the main gate of the school is to be clear of all obstructions at all times. **Parents who come to drop their wards in the morning are requested to follow the instructions of the staff/security guards on duty.**
- **Entry time for the parents/visitors who intend to meet the school authorities/staff is 9.00 am.** They are expected to wait at the designated waiting area and cooperate with the Security Staff.
- **On entering the campus, the parent/visitor is required to enter the personal details, and the purpose of the visit in the register kept at the security cabin.**
- Entry pass/ID will be issued to the parent/visitor which is to be worn as long as he/she remains in the campus. **The Pass/ID is to be returned to the security guard before exiting the campus.**
- For the stay back/excursion/educational trips the school issues consent form to be filled by the parent/guardian and submitted to the teacher-in-charge. **Without the duly filled Consent Form, NO student will be allowed to join any of the said activities.**
- Parents/guardians, who send their wards in privately arranged vehicles such as cabs, vans or buses, are required to ensure that vehicle used, has **a valid permit** and the driver has **a valid licence**. Moreover, they should ensure that the driver of the vehicle has **a Police Verification Certificate** and **a lady attendant** accompanies the children throughout the journey.
- The parents who send their wards in private cabs/vans or buses are required to ensure that the driver and the vehicle adhere to the **Rules, Regulations and Provisions of the Law and Order** for the safety and security of their wards.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARENTS / GUARDIANS

Education is no longer school centric. Since all students move between the two worlds - home and school, an active participation of all parents is essential in providing quality education to their wards. It is not enough that parents pay the school fees and leave the educational responsibilities of their ward in the hands of the teachers alone, taking little interest in the education of their ward. There should be frequent interaction between the teachers and the parents.

Impose firm parental discipline in cases where the child's behaviour is distracting others from the quality learning opportunities in the school or if he/she is not showing sufficient interest in the educational opportunities provided to him/her.

THE FOLLOWING ARE SOME OF THE OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARENTS:

1. PUNCTUALITY AND REGULARITY

- a. Punctuality and regularity are two essential qualities for effective education. These two qualities should be cultivated in the ward right from the beginning. Do not let the ward take leave from school for flimsy reasons and make sure that the ward reaches the school daily, well in time.
- b. The school starts at 7:45 a.m., with the first bell. Students must reach school latest by 7:40 a.m. **Strict disciplinary action will be taken against those who come to school habitually late.**
- c. All parents/guardians must ensure that their wards complete their projects/home assignments on time. Parents must check the school bag/books/registers of their ward on a daily basis to ensure that all works are completed on time.
- d. **Ensure that the ward brings the School Diary to school everyday.** Fill in the details of the ward on the cover as well as the first pages of the School Diary. Specimen signatures of the parent/guardian are a must on page 3 of the school diary. Sign messages, progress reports or other similar documents when requested to do so, to avoid all inconveniences.

2. SMART XAVERIANS

- a. We expect all Xaverians to be very SMART. The parents / guardians are expected to make sure that the ward is well groomed. He/She should bathe daily, dress up neatly in complete school uniform and comb his/her hair properly. (For all these he/she should be woken up well in advance before starting

for school) See to it that his/her nails are trimmed frequently. No long/polished nails are allowed in school. Boys should trim their hair once in three weeks at least. The school strictly prohibits the boys going for any stylish haircut. The parents of such boys will be called to school and they will have to ensure that the ward is given a proper hair cut before he is allowed to attend class.

- b. The ward is to be trained to become self-dependent and take up the responsibility of his/her life gradually. He/she should be taught how to dress up on his / her own, polish the shoes, tie the knot of the school tie. He/she should get the school bag, uniform, shoes etc. ready on the previous night so that the morning rush can be avoided.
- c. As a rule girls coming to school with mehandi on their hands is not permitted; but on special occasions like marriage in the family, it will be allowed with prior sanction from the Vice Principal/Headmaster. **Colouring of hair is not permitted in school.**

3. SCHOOL UNIFORM

- a. Wearing proper school uniform as per the season is a must. Uniforms with any variation in shades are not allowed in school. In order to maintain uniformity the parents are requested to deal only with our authorized tailor.
- b. Tight fitting trousers for boys and girls are not allowed in school. Parents should see that the students don't alter their trousers to make it skinny tight.
- c. Black shoes with laces for boys, black shoes with buckles or laces for girls to be worn at all times. This specification is made with a view to ensure uniformity and prevent children pressurizing parents into avoidable expenses.
- d. To know more about the school uniform parents are requested to refer to the **School Diary Pages - 59 & 60.**

4. CLEANLINESS

- a. 'Cleanliness is next to Godliness'. All parents must educate their wards about how to keep their environment clean. The parents should not only set an example in this by maintaining their surroundings clean but also engage their wards in keeping the house clean and tidy.
- b. On PTM days or on special occasions, the parents are requested to cooperate in maintaining the aesthetic beauty of the school campus by ensuring a litter-free campus.

- c. At home, the ward is to be trained to keep his/her room tidy, make his/her own bed and maintain cleanliness. The Gandhian Principle "Cleanliness is next to Godliness" must be inculcated in the early life of the ward.
- d. Keep a check on the ward's school bag to ensure that it is clean and tidy and see to that there are no unnecessary items kept in it. Students are not allowed to bring any books other than school books / library books to school.
- e. Bringing I-pods, wrist bands, smart watches etc. to school is not permitted. **As per the advisory received from the Directorate of Education, Government of NCT of Delhi (No. DE.15 (305)/PSB/2020/Pt. File-III/7100/7101) dated 10/08/'23, Smart Phones are strictly prohibited in school under rule 43 of DSER 1973. If impounded, it will not be returned until the parent / guardian himself/herself furnishes a letter of apology to the school administration.**
- f. Kindly ensure that the ward packs the school bag with his/her school diary/books/notebooks/ pen/pencil box as per the daily school time table only, so that school bag is not overloaded and the child doesn't have to carry a heavy bag to school.

5. LEAVE OF ABSENCE/MEDICAL LEAVE

- a. No one who is late or has been absent on the previous day will be admitted to the class without the permission of the Class Teacher/Vice Principal / Headmaster/Director of the Prep School.
- b. Except in the case of unforeseen circumstances, no leave may be taken without prior sanction from school authorities.
- c. All students are expected to attend school on the re-opening day after vacations. Those absent because of sickness must inform the school authorities before or on the reopening day and present a medical certificate before they are admitted to the class, failing which they too will have to face strict disciplinary action. Absence without leave letter for more than five days immediately after a vacation may lead to strict disciplinary action by the school authorities.
- d. For leave to be sanctioned for 1-3 days, it is sufficient to apply through the pages 189-190 of the school diary. Parents may also send online application for the above mentioned period through the e-care panel. For leave of absence for more than 3 days a written leave application should be submitted to the concerned department. In case of sick leave for more than three days, an application along with a medical certificate must be submitted.

- e. Every absence (sick leave or otherwise) must be entered briefly in the **NON-ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE RECORD** page in the school diary and signed by the parent or guardian. Failure to do this will invite strict disciplinary action.
- f. **Parents are discouraged to take their wards from school for family functions or other social gatherings during school hours.** For family functions like marriage, one day's leave is granted as a rule but a prior approval from the school authorities is necessary for the same. Withdrawal of a child from classes for mere social functions is discouraged .
- g. The ward should stay at home if he/she is suffering from contagious diseases like mumps, measles chickenpox, small pox, whooping cough, conjunctivitis. A doctor's fitness certificate is a must when the child returns to school.
- h. When submitting a medical certificate, a letter of application with the name/class/section/roll no. etc of the ward should also be furnished.
- i. In the event of a student falling sick during the school hours, the parent should come and take him/her home. No student who is unwell will be allowed to leave school alone.
- j. **No student will be allowed to leave the school campus during the school hours without the consent of the parent.**
- k. All parents visiting school should carry the parent's ID card. Entry to school will only be permitted when the parent's ID is produced at the school gate.
- l. Repeated absence without leave application or unexplained absence for more than five consecutive days renders the student liable to have his/her name struck off from the rolls. Re-admission if granted will be done on payment of a re-admission fee.
- m. If a student is absent on a day when there is a class test/unit test, no re-test will be conducted for them later.

6. WITHDRAWAL FROM SCHOOL

- a. If a parent wants to withdraw the ward from school during the academic session, it must be communicated to the Principal in writing, one month in advance; or one month's fee will be charged. Those who withdraw from the school in April or May must pay the fee up to June.
- b. However, this is not applicable to the students who apply for T.C. at the end of the academic session.

- c. The school reserves the right to ask the parents to withdraw their ward from school:
 - i. If he/she does not show any progress in the academic performance.
 - ii. If his/her conduct is harmful to the other students.
 - iii. If the school fee is not paid on time or not paid at all;
 - iv. If the school authorities are of the opinion that the continuation of a student in the school is undesirable.
- d. Immorality, grave insubordination, contempt of authority or willful damage to school property are always reasons for such demanded withdrawals.

7. DISCIPLINARY ACTION

- a. Bullying/blackmailing by students on social media by uploading objectionable pictures/ videos / writing abusive words / terminology has become very frequent. All parents must inform their wards that such cyber crimes in the event of any complaint by the victim, will be dealt with as per the law.
- b. Pupils are forbidden to bring crackers, explosives and other dangerous material to school. (Parents of the students in the Prep and the Junior School must ensure that the children don't bring any sharp, pointed articles to school). Disciplinary action will be taken against such offenders.
- c. With due respect to the religious sentiments of all, parents are advised not to allow their wards to wear heavy **karas** in school. They may wear **karas** made up of very light material.
- e. Strict action will be taken against the forbidden practices which include smoking, use of drugs or intoxicants, rowdyism, rude behaviour, casteism and communalism by any student. Bullying, violence or use of indecent language will not be tolerated.
- f. Parents are primarily responsible if their ward brings any prohibited article to school and strict action will be taken against those caught for bringing such articles.
- g. Driving of vehicles to school by students below the age of 18 and without a valid driving license is not permitted. In the event of them being caught doing so, the parents will be held responsible.
- h. If a student uses unfair means, or he/she receives, or gives assistance in any form during the tests/examinations, or tampers with the evaluated answer sheets in any way or alters the marks in the answer sheet or report card, he/she will be

given zero in that subject. Repetition of the same will result in the **DISMISSAL**.

8. CONTACTING THE WARD DURING SCHOOL HOURS.

- a Parents/Guardians/Visitors are not allowed to enter the classrooms and meet their wards during the school hours. In the event of an emergency, the ward should be contacted through the School office only.**
- b. Due to security concerns, kindly avoid sending tiffin to the ward/s through servants. The school authorities may not always be able to ascertain the identity of the person who brings food to school.
- c. Prior permission from the Principal Headmaster/Vice Principal / Assistant Headmistress / Director of Prep is a must, if any parent/guardian wishes to discuss the performance of the ward with the teacher concerned.

9. INFORMATION ABOUT SCHOOL - DIGITAL PLATFORMS

- a. Parents can visit the school's Website: www.stxaviersdelhi.com to get all the information about the school.
- b. The School's E-care provides a panel for all the parents. They can login to this panel to get all information related to their ward's academic and activity reports.
- c. The school sends regular SMS to the parents regarding the general information as well as particular information about their ward's attendance, teacher's remarks, discipline etc. It has come to our notice that sometimes the Senior school students block the SMS from school on their parent's registered mobile. Please feel free to contact the Vice-Principal's office in person, if you don't get SMS update from the School regularly.
- d. Parents can also download the e-care app in their mobile so that they get direct access to the parent's panel. To get more details about this application, please contact the Vice - Principal's office in person.

10. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- a. All special requests, entries of absence, late coming etc., should be made in the school diary and not on any sheet of paper.
- b. For the Prep and the Junior School students an identification tag bearing the name of the child should (invariably) be attached to the school blazer, pullover, water bottles, shoes, uniforms and bags etc.

- c. The school discourages parents giving too much money to their wards for their daily expenses in school. There have been many instances when money was lost/stolen in the school. The school takes no responsibility for the money lost/stolen.
- d. Some students coming to the school might have a tendency of taking other students' articles like pen, pencil, geometry boxes, etc. The parents are requested to keep a strict watch over their child to see if he/she brings home any article which is not his/her own. They are also requested to provide the child with sufficient things so that she/he need not resort to appropriating others' things.
- e. The school sends, SMS alerts regarding a child's absence from school or failure in completing the daily works, not bringing the required texts/books etc. to school. This is to ensure that there is a proper communication channel between the parents and the teachers. These are not to be used to nag/punish children at home.
- f. All SMSs from school should be verified for authenticity. Due to certain technical reasons (or because there are more than one student with the same name in the same class) sometimes the parents might get wrong messages. In case, the parent receives a message **from school stating that the ward is absent from school when he/she is present in school, please cross check** the fact with the school office before getting upset or panic-stricken. Any message from school about declaration of unexpected holidays should be verified with the school office, as it could be a fake message.
- g. The School's e-care facility provides all students/parents a login ID through which they can access all information regarding the performance/attendance of their ward. If parents notice any errors on the e-care panel, they may mail/send an application pointing out the same and it will be rectified as per the school records.
- h. Parents should avoid criticism of their ward's teacher/s and the school in his/her presence. Should parents have a legitimate complaint, they should meet the Principal/Vice Principal/Headmaster/Prep Director, without fear of reprisal.
- i. It is mandatory for all Christian/Catholic students to attend the weekly catechism classes, Holy Mass on First Fridays and special occasions, and participate in all the Christian students' programme organized by the School.
- j. Parents are expected to attend the PTMs organized by the School, especially when their ward is not performing well in

academics. Failure to attend these PTMs will reflect lack of interest in their ward's progress.

- k. Parents of Class 10 & 12 students must ensure that their ward appears for the Pre-Board examinations. Clearing the Pre-Board with 33% in all subjects is mandatory for getting the Admit Card for the Board Examinations.
- l. Parents / guardians have been issued ID cards. They are expected to carry the same whenever they come to school for any work.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PAYMENT OF SCHOOL FEES

1. The school fees are collected in advance monthly or quarterly. For monthly payment of fees, the fees should be deposited by the **10th of every month** and for quarterly payment by the **10th of April/July/October or January**.
2. Fees are to be paid through cheque/UPI at the School Fee Counter or through Online Payment. **No cash will be accepted.**
3. For online payment please visit the School Website: stxaviersdelhi.com and login to **e-care portal**. Online fee may also be paid through Mobile App **E-CARE** (<https://app.franciscanecare.com/Login/Identifier?SchCode=XSXDLI>).
4. Transaction charges will be applicable for the Online Fee Payment, if paid through credit card.
5. Cheques are to be drawn in favour of **St. Xavier's Sr. Sec. School**. Parents are advised to ensure that the Name, the Class, the Admission number of the ward and the Mobile number of the parent, are clearly written behind the cheque. If a fee cheque is dishonored due to insufficient funds, or any other reason, the parent should immediately contact the School Office. In such cases, the fee must be paid by UPI/Demand Draft with bank charges. ***Kindly note that a cheque getting dishonored is considered as a criminal offence.**
6. **Annual Charges and Development Fees should be paid in the month of April.**
7. In case a parent fails to deposit the fees by the due date of the relevant month/quarter, a late payment fine will be charged.

11th - 20th of the Month	Rs. 50/-
21st - 30th/31st of the month concerned	Rs. 100/-
After end of the Month concerned, till the end of the Quarter	Rs. 200/-

If the fees are not paid by the end of the fee quarter concerned, the name of the defaulter shall be struck off the rolls. Fresh admission will then have to be taken (at the sole discretion of the Principal) and in such cases, parents will have to pay Rs. 1,000/- (Fine) + Rs. 200/- (Re-admission Fees).

8. No tuition fees will be refunded by the school authorities even if a student attends class for one day and is subsequently withdrawn from the school. Annual Charges and Development Fee will be refunded proportionately according to the student's attendance

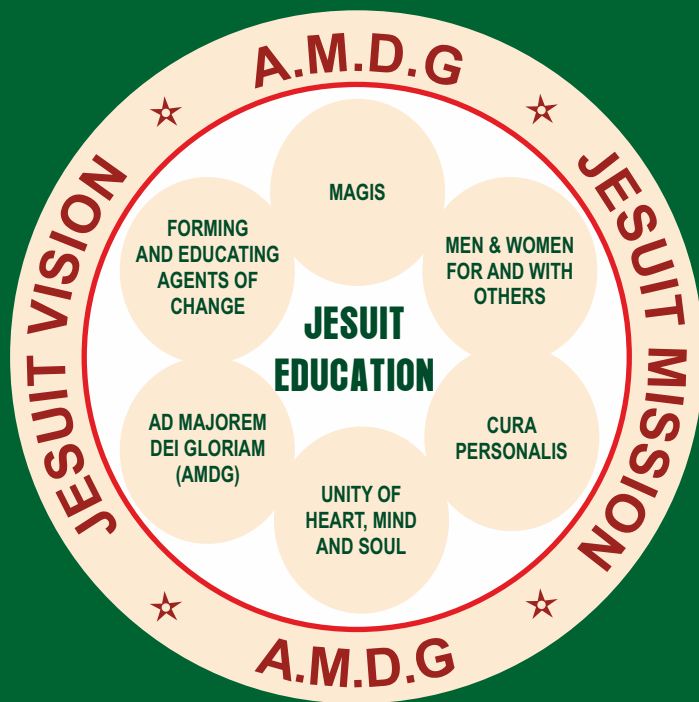
