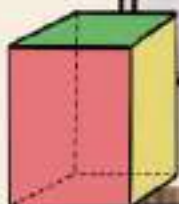


## Mathematical Theatre - Beyond Numbers

## SAVE OUR GIRLS

National Girl Child Day is observed every year on January 24 in India. It was started by the Government of India in 2008 to highlight the importance of valuing, protecting and educating girls. The day reminds us that every girl deserves equal rights, equal opportunities and a safe environment to grow and flourish in.

The purpose of this day is to raise awareness about issues that many girls face even today - gender discrimination, early marriage, unequal access to education, health problems and unfair treatment in the family or society. The day encourages people to reflect on how we can treat every girl with dignity and respect.

National Girl Child Day also celebrates the achievements of girls in sports, science, art, defence, academics and many other fields. On this day, many state and central government schemes are highlighted, such as 'Beti Bachao Beti Padhao', which aims to protect the girl child and promote her education.

The day reminds us that empowering girls benefits the entire nation - when girls learn, families grow; when girls lead, communities progress; and when girls feel safe, the country becomes stronger.

### Shocking Facts About Girls:

1. Many girls under the age of 15 years face challenges like unsafe travel routes, household responsibilities or discrimination, which prevent them from attending school every day.
  2. Around 119 million girls worldwide don't go to school.
  3. Only 49% of countries have achieved gender parity between girls and boys in primary education, 42% in lower Secondary Education and 24% in upper Secondary Education.
  4. In low income countries only about 38% of the girls complete lower Secondary School, compared with 43% of boys.
  5. According to 2024 data more than 2.4 billion girls and women live in countries rated as having 'poor' or 'very poor' gender equality scores.
  6. The World Economic Forum's Global Gender Gap Report (2025) shows that at the current pace full parity is still more than a century away.
- So, let's take a pledge that we will protect and educate the girls.

## BE IMPECCABLE WITH YOUR WORDS

Words may seem small, but they carry great power. They can heal , encourage, and uplift, or they can hurt, break confidence and silently change lives. Many of us don't realize how deeply our words affect others until it is too late.

Imagine this: You attend the first lecture of a teacher with an open mind. Later, a senior tells you that the teacher is rude and unpleasant. From the next lecture onward, even before the teacher speaks, you already see them through that negative opinion. Slowly, you discuss it with others, and soon the entire class starts believing the same thing. The atmosphere changes, not because of truth, but because of words passed from one person to another. This is how gossip spreads, opinions turn into beliefs , and reality gets distorted.

Often, people speak negatively because of their own pain or personal experiences. However, their words do not remain limited to them – they influence many others who may never know the full truth.

What we give through our words always come back to us. Love creates love. Respect invites respect. Harsh words create distance. When we insult others, we don't just hurt them – we harm ourselves too. Words are like toothpaste: once they come out, they cannot be put back.

Consider the story of a hard-working father and his young daughter. One day, exhausted and in pain, the father lost his temper when his happy daughter was singing loudly. In anger, he spoke harshly about her voice. Those words stayed with the child forever. Though she had a beautiful voice, she stopped singing, believing what was said to her in a moment of anger. One sentence changed her confidence - and her life. This is the power of words.

History also shows us how words can influence millions- spreading fear, hatred, or unity. Even our scriptures remind us to think before speaking, because once words are released, they never return.

Being impeccable with your words means choosing honesty, kindness , and awareness. Speak in a way that you would like others to speak to you. If your words can hurt someone, pause; if they can heal, speak freely.
