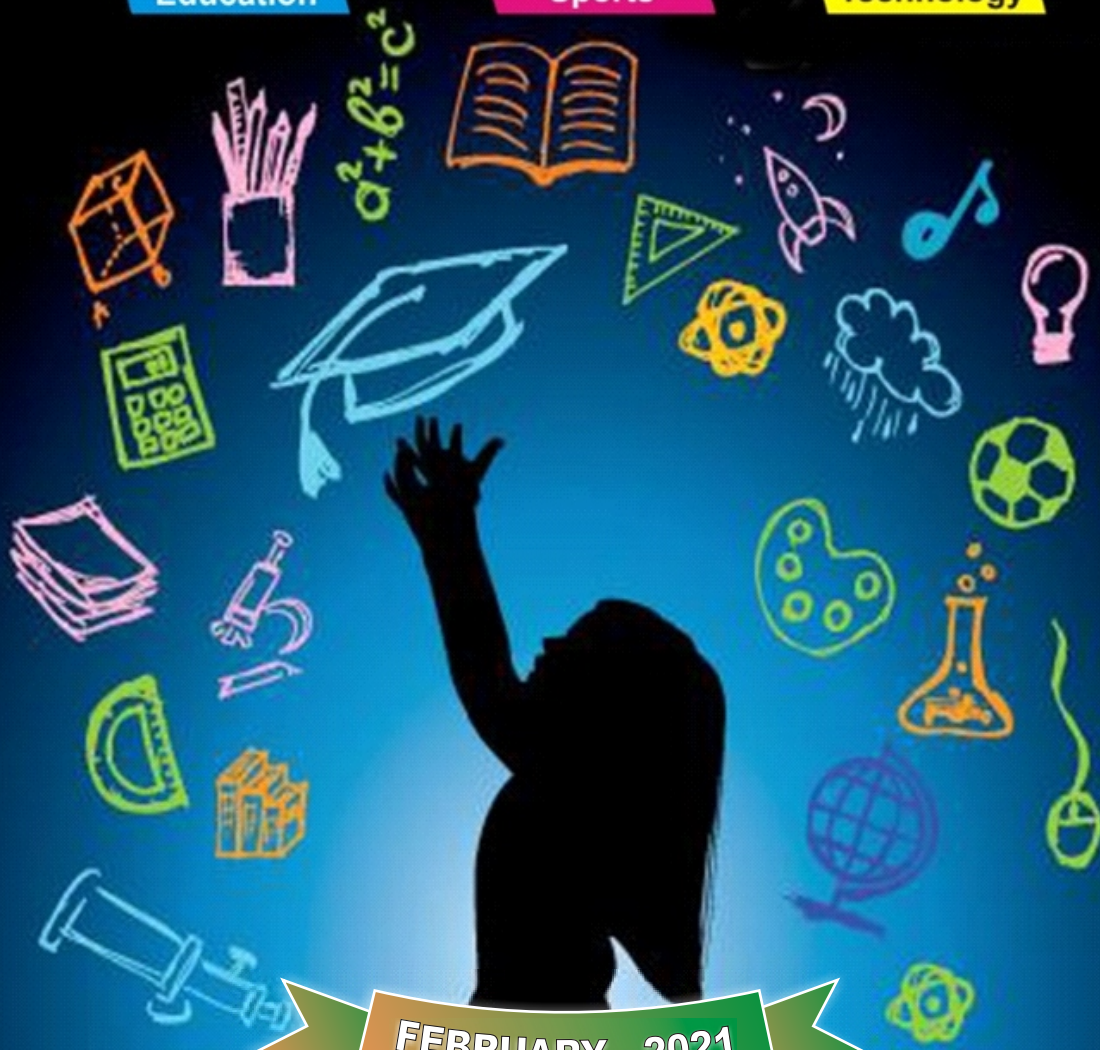

A SIGH OF RELIEF !!!

CORONA VIRUS VACCINATION PROGRAMME IN INDIA



We all know that 2020 has been an extremely rough year for almost all of us as we were struck hard by the COVID-19. This virus was first discovered on November 29th, 2019 by the Wuhan Institute of Virology and first Interhuman transmission was observed in a sea food market in the Wuhan city of China. It is a contagious virus which causes extreme lung complications such as dry cough accompanied with fever for several days, in most severe cases the infected person may suffer from Acute Respiratory Distress Syndrome (ARDS) and can cause long lasting effect on the lungs as well as on the nervous system of the human body.

All thanks to our Indian Scientists, on January 16th, 2021 the people of our country took a sigh of relief when the Health Ministry of India kick-started a massive inoculation drive against COVID -19.

Two vaccinations which were given emergency approval by the Drugs Controller General of India (DCGI) for the immunization programme are-

COVAXIN- It is India's indigenous vaccine developed by Bharat Biotech in collaboration with Indian Council of Medical Research and Indian Institute of Virology. The vaccine had been manufactured in Bio-Safety level 3, a high containment facility and had already completed Phase 1 and 2 of human clinical trials. After the interim analysis of these phases it was given approval for Phase 3 trials which had almost 26,000 participants in its 25 centres across India.

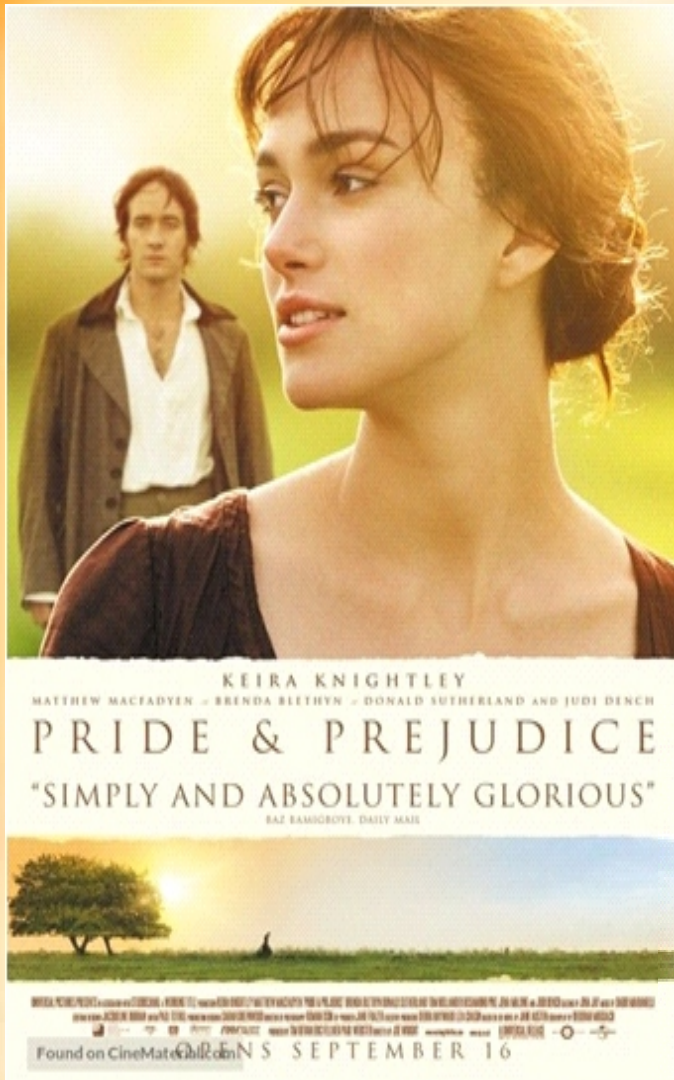
COVISHIELD- It is the second vaccine to receive approval by the DCGI in India. Oxford University's ASTRA ZENECA also known as COVISHIELD was being made available in India by Mr. Adar Poonawala, the Chief of Serum Institute of India and one of the world's largest vaccine makers. The vaccine is from weakened version of virus also known as adenovirus from chimpanzees.

Hyderabad based Pharmaceutical company BIOLOGICAL-E Company's vaccine is already in Phase 2 human clinical trial. As per the company's statement, the company will evaluate the safety and immunogenicity of the vaccine candidate in about 360 healthy subjects between 18- 65 years of age. The vaccination schedule consists of two doses for each participant, administered via intramuscular injection 28 days apart.

Another is Bengaluru based Medical Start up MYNVAX' s vaccine . This vaccine is known to be a heat-tolerant vaccine which can withstand heat of 70°C for about 16 hours and at 37°C for over a month without losing its ability to fight the virus. This vaccine could be a game-changer for India which lacks sufficient cold chain facilities.

The government of India has already ordered 55 million doses of COVAXIN- and 11 million doses of Covishield. Across the country the registrations for COVID -19 vaccinations have already begun .On January 16th,2021 more than two hundred thousand people were vaccinated out of which approximately one hundred thousand were healthcare and frontline workers. More than three hundred and thirty seven thousand team members have been trained for the roll out .As said by the government, for the ease of availability, the vaccine would be of low cost.
