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Delhi Public School, Mohali Celebrates Environment Week with Creativity, Awareness, and Action

Delhi Public School Mohali observed Environment Week from July 14, to July 18, 2025, with enthusiasm and concern for the planet. A week-long series of thoughtfully designed activities combined environmental awareness with students' creativity and expression. Students across Classes III to X actively participated in a variety of artistic, reflective, and research-based activities centred on the theme of sustainability and ecological responsibility.
