## Message from the Principal

### The Silent Curriculum : The Enduring Importance of Principles in Education

When we think of education, we often picture classrooms buzzing with equations, grammar rules, and historical dates. We focus on academic performance, competitive results, and rankings that seem to define a school or student's worth. Yet beneath this visible surface lies a silent curriculum one not written on boards or measured by marks. This is the curriculum of principles.

As a Principal, I have learned that education's true purpose extends beyond preparing students for exams; it equips them for life, guided by empathy, honesty, discipline, and respect. In the race for results, we must not overlook the foundation of character built daily through experience, example, and environment.

A school is a garden where principles take root, with teachers as gardeners and students as tender plants. What grows depends on what we sow not only through lessons but through how we live each day.

#### The Power of Principles

Imagine a ship with powerful engines and a skilled crew but no compass drifting aimlessly. So it is with a person without principles. Knowledge provides skills, but principles give direction. Knowledge may earn a living, but principles create a life worth living.

Honesty, respect, responsibility, compassion, and perseverance are not outdated; they are timeless tools for navigating modern complexities. A child who learns respect becomes a law-abiding citizen. A student who embraces responsibility grows into an adult trusted with freedom. These qualities transform knowledge into wisdom.

In every school, classrooms, corridors, and playgrounds become silent teachers, whispering lessons of conduct, cooperation, and care. When a teacher greets a student with warmth, patience, and fairness, they begin a lesson in humanity before the bell rings. When a teacher listens calmly to a child's mistake instead of reacting with anger, the student learns that guidance and forgiveness outweigh punishment. Principles are caught, not taught. Children imitate far more than they obey. The tone a teacher uses, the fairness in grading, the discipline in assemblies all these quietly convey what a school truly stands for.



### **Why Principles Matter Today**

In today's fast-paced, technology-driven world, connections are instant, yet hearts often feel distant. Success is measured by wealth or status, but restlessness grows among youth. Depression, anxiety, and a loss of inner peace are increasingly common.

This makes principle-based education a necessity, not a luxury. A student who can code a robot but lacks teamwork or humility may be brilliant but not humane. A child who masters science without sincerity might innovate but misuse knowledge. In an information-saturated world, principles are the filters that guide us toward what is right, fair and meaningful.

### **Teachers: The Living Textbooks**

No digital tool can replace a teacher's moral presence. Teachers do not just deliver lessons; they embody them. Every action, decision and reaction sends a moral message to students.

Years ago, an incident reinforced this truth for me. A student accidentally broke a windowpane and fled, fearing punishment. The next morning, instead of demanding the culprit, the class teacher calmly invited the responsible student to leave an anonymous apology note. An envelope was placed on her desk. The next day, it contained a note and a small coin the student had confessed. The teacher never revealed the name but later spoke to the class about honesty and courage. That single act taught more about responsibility and trust than any textbook could.

Teachers are the curriculum. Students remember not what we say but what we do. The alignment of our words and actions form the backbone of their moral growth.

### **When Teachers Stray from Their Compass**

While most educators uphold high ethical standards, a troubling trend has emerged where some lose sight of their moral duty, swayed by personal gain, ego, or resentment. It is disheartening to acknowledge this shadow over our profession, but honesty compels us to address it.

Some teachers have encouraged students to misuse social platforms to air grievances, criticize school authorities, or spread half-truths. Such actions not only tarnish the institution and profession but also sow seeds of rebellion and disrespect in young minds. A teacher's frustration must never burden a student's conscience. When educators manipulate students for personal battles, they betray their calling and damage the moral fabric of those who trust them.

True teachers rise above personal grievances, modelling dignity, patience, and constructive dialogue. Even in disagreement with policies or leadership, they demonstrate integrity and professionalism, teaching students how to handle adversity with grace. How we manage conflict teaches more than any lesson plan.

To restore teaching's prestige, educators must recommit to ethics honesty in work, respect for leadership, empathy for colleagues, and loyalty to the sacred duty of shaping young minds, not manipulating them.

### **Principles in the Digital Age**

Connecting principles to the digital generation is a challenge. Students grow up where social media defines popularity and instant gratification overshadows patience. How do we teach empathy, humility, and perseverance in this context?

The answer lies in relevance and action. Instead of moral lectures, foster meaningful discussions about online behaviour, respectful comments, the dangers of misinformation, and the courage to oppose cyber bullying. Teach students that digital footprints are moral footprints.



Service projects, peer mentoring, and environmental initiatives bring principles to life. A child who plants a tree and watches it grow feels compassion for nature. Visiting an old-age home makes empathy tangible. The classroom must extend to the world beyond its walls.

### **Parents: Partners in Principle-Building**

No school can nurture principles alone. Parents, as the first teachers, and educators, as second parents, must align. A child who sees respect at home brings it to school. But in contradiction, parents demanding high marks over honesty or teachers preaching truth but acting otherwise undermine principles.

Stories, not sermons, teach best. Every culture offers tales where right triumphs over wrong. In assemblies, I share stories from the Ramayana and Mahabharata, ancient Indian epics of duty and righteousness, or modern examples like Malala's courage, alongside tales of students helping peers selflessly. Children listen, reflect, and connect these to their lives.

Teachers can weave principles into every subject: curiosity and ethics in science, tolerance and peace in history, empathy and moral choices in literature. When principles blend into academics, they become a way of thinking, not a separate subject.

### **The Challenge of Upholding Principles**

Nurturing principles is not easy. Teachers face pressure for results, parents demand visible success, and society often rewards shortcuts. Yet, the true test of education is standing firm when principles are challenged.

A student may cheat for marks; a teacher may overlook misbehaviour for convenience. Choosing the harder right over the easier wrong protects not just our integrity but the soul of the school.

As a principal, I have faced tough decisions that invited criticism but upheld fairness. Over time, I learned that respect earned through integrity outlasts popularity gained through compromise.

### **A Call to Nurture the Soul**

Education without principles is like a lamp without light structured but cold. The goal is not only successful individuals but good human beings who think critically, act ethically, and live compassionately. As Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam said, "A person with values, even if not the topper, is far more valuable to the nation than a topper without values." In a world prizing competition, we need hearts that value cooperation; in a society focused on self-interest, we need minds that embrace service.

Each morning, as I walk through school corridors and hear children's laughter, I am reminded of education's immense responsibility and privilege. We are not just preparing students for jobs but shaping the conscience of a generation. Every student who learns honesty, kindness, and responsibility adds hope to the future.

To teachers: Your lessons echo beyond the classroom. To students: Every act of integrity builds your destiny. To parents: Your home is the heart's first classroom.

Principles are not relics of a bygone era; they are anchors for life's storms. Let us educate not only the mind but also the soul. Success without principles is hollow, but a life rooted in principles is eternally full.

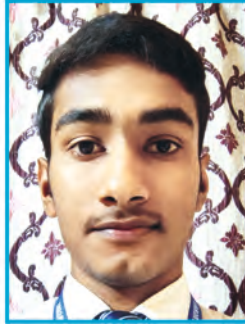

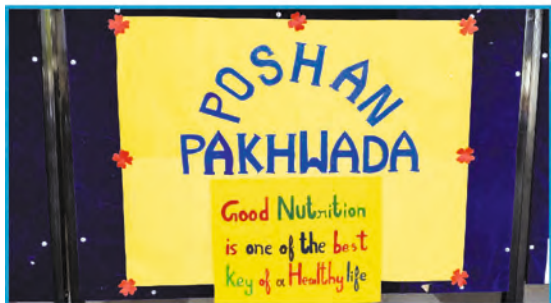
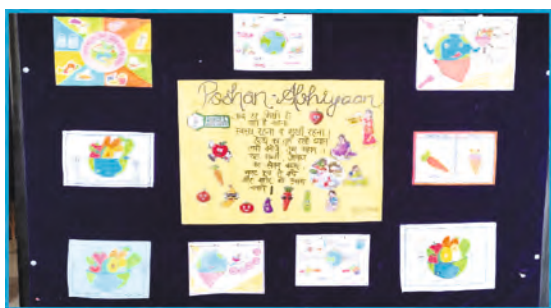


# JT Golden Jubilee School Celebrates **Yoga Day** for Global Harmony

### From Oven to Needle A Student Learns Skills for Life

To nurture creativity and confidence and keeping with NEP vision of holistic education, the school has introduced Baking and Embroidery as Skill Subjects for Class VI, providing students with meaningful opportunities to learn practical life skills, alongside academic learning.

Baking as a skill subject has been an exciting and enriching experience for students. They were introduced to the basics of kitchen hygiene, safety rules, and the correct use of ingredients and tools. Under guided supervision, students learned essential techniques such as measuring, mixing, kneading, and baking. A variety of activities were conducted, including the preparation of cakes like Vanilla sponge, Chocolate cake, fruit cake, cookies and Christmas cake. The classes also encouraged teamwork, as students worked in groups, sharing responsibilities and learning cooperation.



Alongside baking, Embroidery brought students closer to traditional craftsmanship and fine motor skills. # Understanding ADHD in Adults

Have you ever wondered why some adults struggle to stay focused, keep things organised, or sit still for long periods? These difficulties might point to ADHD Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, a neurodevelopmental condition that affects how the brain manages attention, impulses, and activity levels. The good news is that ADHD is highly manageable, and many adults with the condition lead successful, fulfilling lives.

## What Exactly Is ADHD?

ADHD is not just “being hyper” or “lazy”. It’s a lifelong condition in which the brain processes information, regulates energy, and controls impulses differently from most people’s brains. It usually begins in childhood but often continues into adulthood, sometimes only being recognised later in life.

## Symptoms of ADHD in Adults

Adult ADHD typically shows up in three core areas: inattention, hyperactivity, and impulsivity. Not everyone has all symptoms, and their intensity can vary.

### Inattention

- Getting easily distracted or sidetracked
- Difficulty organising tasks and managing time
- Frequently losing items (keys, wallet, phone, etc.)
- Struggling to follow instructions or complete tasks

### Hyperactivity and Impulsivity

- Feeling restless or fidgety
- Talking excessively or interrupting others
- Making hasty decisions without considering consequences
- Difficulty waiting or staying seated when expected

## What Causes ADHD?

The exact cause isn’t fully understood, but research points to a strong genetic component ADHD often runs in families. Other factors that may increase the risk include:

- Premature birth (before 37 weeks)
- Brain injury or epilepsy
- Low birth weight

Many adults with ADHD identify as neurodivergent. The term celebrates neurodiversity, the idea that neurological differences are a natural and valuable part of human variation.





## How Is ADHD Diagnosed?

There is no single test for ADHD. Diagnosis involves a detailed assessment by a psychiatrist, clinical psychologist, or specialist doctor. They will explore your childhood history, current symptoms, and how these affect work, relationships, and daily life.

## Managing ADHD in Adulthood

There's no cure, but symptoms can be effectively managed through a combination of strategies. Treatment is tailored to each person.

**1. Medication** Stimulant and non-stimulant medications can help many adults improve focus and reduce impulsivity. Not everyone needs or wants medication.

### 2. Therapy and Coaching

- Cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT)
- ADHD coaching to build practical skills

### 3. Lifestyle Changes (often the most powerful tools)

- Exercise regularly: Choose enjoyable activities to channel energy and reduce anxiety.
- Prioritise sleep: Keep a consistent schedule and create a screen-free, calm bedroom environment.
- Eat balanced meals at regular times.
- Limit caffeine, sugar, and alcohol, especially in the evening.

**4. Workplace or Study Adjustments** in many countries (e.g., under the Equality Act in the UK), you have the right to “reasonable adjustments” such as:

- A quieter or personalised workspace
- Written instructions in addition to verbal ones
- Extra time for tasks or exams
- Support from a mentor or job coach

## ADHD and Mental Health

Adults with ADHD are at higher risk of anxiety, depression, low self-esteem, and, in some cases, suicidal thoughts. If you ever feel overwhelmed or that you don't want to go on, please reach out immediately help is available 24/7, and you are not alone.

## Final Thought

ADHD doesn't define you; it's just one part of who you are. With the right understanding, support, and strategies, many adults with ADHD thrive in their careers, relationships, and personal passions.

If you suspect you or someone close to you might have ADHD, speak to a GP or mental health professional. Getting assessed is the first step toward a clearer, calmer, and more empowered life.

## Rajasthan Odyssey: A Royal Adventure Unveiled
