


फैसी द्रेस प्रतियोगिता में बच्चों ने दिखाई प्रतिभा



There were a lot of spectators cheering on their houses since it was exciting to watch friends play and comagainst each other.


The atmosphere was electrifying with the cheering of the students and the enthusiasm of the participants second half of the tournament started with the Girls.

Mrs. Deb gave some valuable information to the students about Education and ersonality development. The ideologies and achievements of Abul Kalam Ji were also iscussed.



WHAT IS WATER?

Hardness of water

Water is the most common fluid on Earth. It covers about 71.4% of the earth. Pure water has no colour, smell or taste. Lakes, oceans, rivers are made up of water. It may be rain (liquid) if warm or it may be frozen if cold. If it gets very cold at (O degree celcius) it freezes and becomes ice. It is the only chemical substance on earth that exists naturally in three states. Unlike alcohol or oil when it freezes it expands only by 9%. This expansion can cause pipes to break if the water inside them freezes. However some studies suggest that by 2025, more than half of the people around the world will not have enough water.

USES OF WATER IN OUR DAILY LIFE

Water is one of the most vital natural resources for all life on Earth. The availability and quality of water have always played an important part in determining not only where people can live but also their quality of life. Plants and animals, which are mostly inside water, need water to survive. It gives a medium for chemical reactions to take place and is the main part of blood. It keeps the body temperature same by sweating from the skin. Water helps the blood to carry nutrients from the stomach to all parts of the body to keep it active. It is the main component of drinks like milk, juice and wine.

WHAT CAUSES HARDNESS OF WATER

The term hardness or softness are expression of the amount of Ca and Mg salts dissolved in the water. Ca and Mg salts react with the fatty acids in soap to produce a scum and if there is a high amount of Ca salt present in it it makes the water difficult for washing clothes. Some modern detergents are unaffected by Ca and Mg. The Ca and Mg salts get into the water when it shows on the surface of the Earth:
