

HISTORY OF THE SCHOOL

- Loreto Day School, Dharamtala, dates back to 1879.
- However, from sources available its roots dates back to 1863, when the Catholic Young Men's Society (CYMS) set up a Sunday School in the Sacred Heart Church with fourteen children.
- From 1865, the Loreto Sisters of the Institute Of The Blessed Virgin Mary (IBVM) started teaching these children.
- The Free School that had been run by the CYMS since 1879, was taken over by the Loreto Sisters on 21st April, 1879, under the charge of Mother Gonzaga McCarthy and Sister Dympna.
- The building in which the School was housed had been taken on rent for a few months and was situated on 154 Dharamtala Street with only twenty five pupils.
- The School was thereafter shifted to another vacant house at 164 Dharamtala Street, in December that year.
- As the number of pupils increased, it became necessary to find a bigger place and on the 1st of May,1880, Loreto Dharamtala moved to its new premises at 169, Lenin Sarani.
- The ground floor accommodated the Free School while the first floor was given to the Pay School.
- In 1883, owing to the high costs involved in repairing the building, it was pulled down and rebuilt.
- The school expanded rapidly with its strength increasing from almost three hundred in 1883 to four hundred and eight in 1900 (209 of them paid fees).
