1931 China floods

~ The deadliest natural disaster ever



1931 China floods were a series of floods that occurred from June to August. It was the worst nightmare China ever faced. Damage of property and immense loss of lives took place during this disaster.

Number of deaths crossed 4,000,000, making it the deadliest natural disaster ever recorded in history, hence proving that our biggest fears can come true.

The 1556 Shaanxi earthquake

Dated 1556 BC, The Shaanxi earthquake is the deadliest earthquake recorded in history, it lasted only a few seconds but it opened fissures up to 66 feet deep in the earth, altered the path of rivers, caused massive flooding, produced massive landslides, and ignited fires. According to the imperial records approximately 830,000 people lost their lives in this earthquake.

This earthquake occurred on the morning of 23rd January, 1556 in Shaanxi with the magnitude of 8.0 during the Ming dynasty.

This earthquake shattered the Ming dynasty forever.





The river replied, "You are firm and fixed in one place, how could you ever get tired? Look at me, I have to be on the move all the time. I don't get to rest for even a single minute!"






On high priority, we should take care of Nature so that we can have a healthy, happy and peaceful future. I pray and hope our young generation understands the importance of nature and takes care accordingly.
