## Israel-Palestine Conflict: A Century-long struggle



The Israel-Palestinian conflict, spanning over a century, remains one of the world's most enduring and complex disputes. Its origins and developments are deeply rooted in religious, territorial, and nationalistic aspirations. In the late 19th Century, the rise of Zionism called for a Jewish homeland in Palestine, then under the Ottoman Simultaneously, Empire. Arab nationalism began to flourish. Post-World War I, the Balfour Declaration of 1917 saw Britain endors-

ing a Jewish homeland in Palestine. The subsequent British Mandate witnessed increasing tensions tween Jews, Arabs, and the British administration. The pivotal moment arrived in 1947 when the UN proposed partitioning Palestine into separate Jewish and Arab territories. While accepted by the Jewish leadership, the Arab side declined. 1948 marked Israel's declaration of independence, triggering the first Arab-Israeli war. The aftermath saw Israel's ter-

ritorial expansion and the significant Palestinian exodus, termed the Nakba. Fast forward to 1967's Six-Day War, Israel captured significant territories, including the West Bank and Gaza Strip, which remain contentious points today. The Yom Kippur War of 1973, initiated by a coalition of Arab states, ended in an Israeli victory but intensified regional tensions. The late 20th century witsignificant nessed two Palestinian uprisings or Intifadas. The Oslo Accords of 1993, though a landmark peace attempt, couldn't achieve a lasting solution. In 2005, Israel's unilateral withdrawal from Gaza seemed promising. However, when Palestinian Authority (PA), which represents Palestinians at international bodies led by President Mahmoud Abbas, was ousted from the

Gaza Strip after the Islamist political group Hamas won the Palestinian Legislative Council (PLC) elections in the Gaza Strip in the year 2005 & 2006 led to multiple conflicts. Unexpectedly, the conflict between Israel and Palestine escalated to unforeseen levels on October 7, 2023 when Hamas, launched an unprecedented attack on Israel from Gaza resulted in the tragic death of at least 700 Israelis. In response to this attack, Israel initiated retaliatory bombardments of the Gaza Strip. It declared war against Hamas and vowed to destroy the "military and governing capabilities" of the enclave's Hamas rulers. Today, the core issues - Jerusalem's status, definitive borders, security concerns, water rights, and the right of return for Palestinian refugees - remain unresolved. While numerous peace initiatives have been explored, a lasting solution remains out of reach.

## India's Records in Hangzhou: Asian Games 2023

The Asian Games, also known as Asiad, is a continental multi-sport event held every fourth year among athletes from all over Asia. After the Second World War, many Asian countries gained independence and Guru Dutt Sondhi, a member of the Indian International Olympic Committee, proposed the idea of Asian Games

as a sporting event, where all Asian nations can be represented. The first-ever Asian Games were held in New Delhi in 1951. Indian athletes achieved unprecedented success at the 19th Asian Games. With an unprecedented haul of 107 medals that included 28 gold, 38 silvers and 41 bronze medals, India set a new benchmark for themselves at the Asian

Games 2023 in Hangzhou, the People's Republic of China. It was the first time in Asian Games history that India's medals tally crossed the three-figure mark. By doing so, they became the only fourth country after China, Japan and the Republic of Korea to win 100 or more medals in a single edition of the Asian Games. India sent 655 athletes to compete in 41 disciplines at the Asian Games 2023 held from September 19 to October 8. It was India's largest representation at the Asian Games in the 19 editions held so far. At the 2018 Asian Games in Jakarta, Indonesia, India had sent 570 athletes and returned with 70 medals, including a haul of 16 gold medals. It was India's previous best medal haul. Shooting led the way for India at the Asian Games 2023 with an unprece-

dented haul of 22 medals, which included seven gold. Athletics, headlined by Neeraj Chopra's successful title defence in the javelin throw, came a close second with six gold along with 14 silver and nine bronze. The archery compound team, meanwhile, clean-swept the five gold medals in the category. The cricket and kabaddi teams also bagged two gold medals each while the men's hockey team's gold secured a spot at the Paris 2024 Olympics. India also earned their first Asian Games badminton gold medal courtesy of the men's doubles pair of Chirag Shetty and Satwiksairaj Rankireddy. Squash, tennis and equestrian completed the 28 gold medals for India in Hangzhou. In addition to medals, Hangzhou offered 74 Paris 2024 Olympic quotas - six in archery, 10 in artistic swim-

ming, 34 in boxing, two in

breaking, two in hockey, 10 in modern pentathlon, six in sailing, two in tennis and two in water polo. India secured six quotas in all – four in boxing (Nikhat Zareen, Preeti Pawar, Parveen Hooda, Lovlina Borgohain) and one each in athletics (Kishore Jena) and men's hockey.
