# "NISCORT's World Wide Web Day Webinar Sheds Light on Cyber Law and Fake News for a Diverse Audience"

n August 1<sup>st</sup>, celebrated as World Wide Web Day, NIS-CORT hosted an enlightening educational webinar featuring Dr. Pavan Duggal, a renowned cyber law expert and Advocate at the Supreme Court of India, and Prof. Dr. Mukul Srivastava, Head of the Department of Journalism and Mass Comamunication at the University of Lucknow. In the first session by Dr. Pavan Duggal emphasized the growing dangers of cybercrime in today's world, highlighting the increased likelihood of cyber fraud. He discussed the challenges in apprehending cybercriminals and stressed the importance of individuals being vigilant with their personal information. Dr. Duggal noted that cybercrime has surged since the COVID-19 pandemic, partly due to the rise of AI tools like GPT that can facilitate malicious activities. He also warned about the risks associated with the careless sharing of personal information on unsecured platforms. His insights underscored the need for greater awareness and caution to protect against these evolving cyber threats.


Whereas in the second session Dr. Mukul Srivastava discussed fake news as an extension of cyber fraud, highlighting the dangers posed by misinformation and its potential for fear-mongering. He elaborated on how fake news and various types of misinformation can manipulate public perception and spread false narratives. Dr. Srivastava also provided practical advice on identifying altered images, including the use of reverse image search techniques to detect fake visuals. His insights offered valuable strategies for recognizing and combating misinformation in the digital age.

The webinar was a success, delivering comprehensive insights into various aspects of cyber law and benefiting a diverse audience.
