Subject and career choices are discussed and advised by experts in the field. A follow up program is constantly upgraded for students who have further queries to be tackled. The Middle School is given special communication workshops where they can augment skills of better communication by 'One Step Up'. Institute of Career Studies, Lucknow, conducts individual career counseling sessions for classes 8 and 10.

The students also attended a workshop on Drug Abuse in colleges and universities, conducted by Major General Professor O.P.Soni.

The Indian School of Business and Finances, New Delhi, conducted a workshop on 'International Trade' with a purpose to enhance the learning of Economics. The workshop included activities like 'win-win' game which demonstrated how international trade takes place and why economies engage in international trade. It was an authentic workshop which helped the students to gain knowhow about the use of limited resources to produce various goods and services. It was a very enriching experience for the students of Commerce and Economics.

CO CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Co-curricular activities prepare students practically for the future. They broaden and enrich student

experiences as an integral part of the curriculum and let them enhance their capabilities. Elocution, debates, quizzes, creative writings, declamations both in Hindi and English, have always been an active part of the school and the girls are sent out of school as well to participate in various activities that help them gain experience and better themselves from the experience.

Founded in July 1869, All Saints' College had two students and Miss Bradbury as their teacher. Back then, the school was called the Diocesan Girls' High School and was set up at Stoneleigh, where Ramsay Hospital now stands. It was then shifted to Petersfield, and then to Brandsdale, which now houses the Uttarakhand High Court. The School was eventually shifted to Ayarpata Hill, Nainital in 1892. The same year All Saints' sisters', an Anglican religious order, took charge of the school; after which it was known as All Saints' School.

This educational institution is an English Medium residential-cum-day girls' college. It functions under the management of the All Saints' College Society and is registered under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860. The motto of the school is, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom." The school works under the mission statement, "To provide quality and moral driven values to the girl child and to thus empower the women of tomorrow."

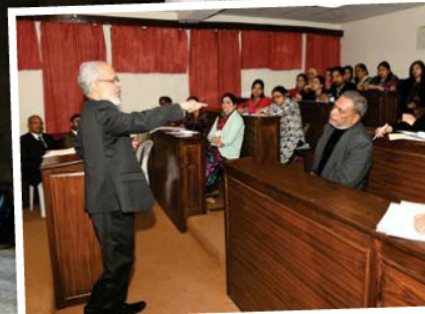

A Workshop By Univariety

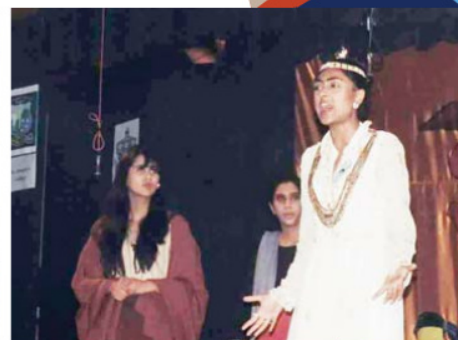

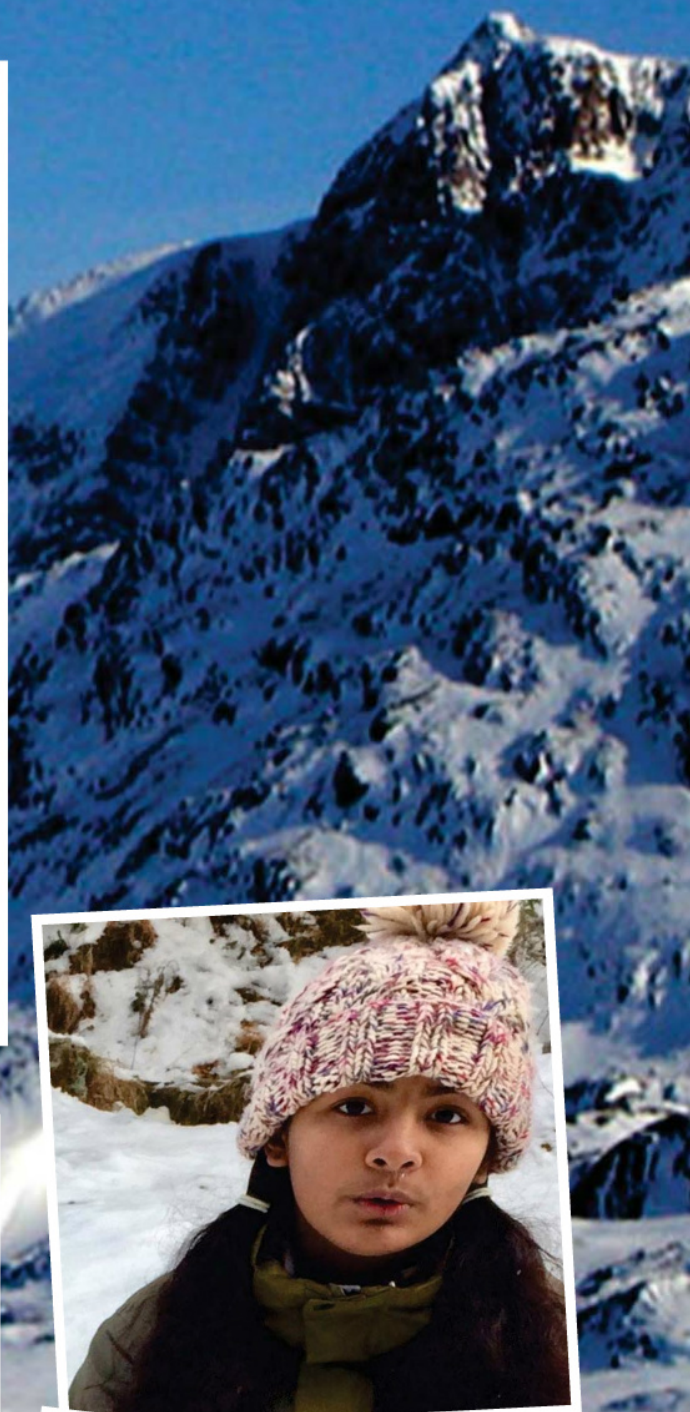
Summit of Mt Elbrus
