



BIRTH OF A LEGACY



HISTORY OF ALL SAINTS' COLLEGE, NAINITAL

All Saints' College was founded in July 1869 with only 2 students and Miss Bradbury as their teacher. The School, which was called the "Diocesan Girls' High School', was set up at 'Stoneleigh' where Ramsay Hospital now stands.

It was then shifted to Petersfield, the present site of Balika Vidya Mandir and then to 'Barnsdale', which now houses the Uttarakhand High Court. The School was eventually shifted to Ayarpata Hill in 1892.

The same year All Saints' sisters', an Anglican religious order, took charge of the school; after which it was known as All Saints' School. The foundation stone of the present main building was laid in 1893. The School came under the management of the Holy Family Sisters in 1915. The present Junior School Building, which was originally the training college for teachers was built in 1925.

Finally in the year 1945 on the departure of the Holy Sisters, the responsibility of the institution was taken over by the All Saints' College Society, of which the Bishop of Agra Diocese (The Church of North India) is the Chairman.

This educational institution is an English Medium residential-cum-day girls' college. It is under the management of the All Saints' College Society and is registered under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860.





SUKHINDER (SUKHI) GILL'S memories of school life and times

Ex-student Dame Sukhinder "Sukhi" Kaur Gill Turner DNZM (1962-1967) is an Indian-born-New Zealand politician who served as the Mayor of Dunedin, New Zealand, from 1995 until her retirement from the position in 2004.

She married New Zealand cricketer, Glenn Turner, in 1973. She is also regarded by some as New Zealand's most prominent politician from the country's Indian community. She was awarded The Distinguished Companion of the New Zealand Order of Merit (DCNZM) in 2002 and Pravasi Bharitiya Samman, India's highest honour for Non-Resident Indians in 2004.

When I talk to my class mates now, the batch of 1967, about their school days, they invariably say, "It was the best time of my life." I concur whole heartedly! My time at All Saints' was the halcvon days of my life!

Looking back at the 7 years that I spent at All Saints', the memories are overwhelmingly full of light, vitality, outdoor activities, sports, having fun with friends and being completely involved with the culture of the school community.

I loved the life of a border. Having a peer group to grow up with, interaction with class mates and others, who were constantly on tap was wonderful. We were one big, lively family! We all generally got along well with each other, and if there was any disharmony, we had the guidance and good judgement of our Principal Ruth Compton and teachers, who were good role models and mentors. Though I must say, during all those years, I cannot remember any significant problems.

Our daily schedule kept us so busy and interested, that there was no time for being bored or having time on our hands to cook up naughtiness!! I loved school work and also enjoyed sports. By 4.00pm we were on the playground, either playing netball, volleyball or rounders. During the weekend, we played tennis, or went for nature walks. We also organised ourselves and played an elaborate outdoor game called Colours, had hop scotch competitions and played badminton. We read books from the school library by Georgette Heyer and Daphne Du Maurier or books borrowed from others, which needed to have Miss Compton's signature, as approved and suitable to read by girls of our age! One of favourite time was Miss Compton reading to us on a Sunday evening in her "Drawing room". Oh the delights of Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe, the Hobbit, TS Eliot's cat poems!

As we did not have a swimming pool at All Saints', we would walk to Sherwood College, to use their pool. Walking all over the Naini Hills was commonplace for us All Saints' girls. Fresh air and exercise was deemed important for our health. We walked to Tiffin Top and Dorothy's Peak, the gardens at Governor House and down to Mallital to see the movies or exhibitions and plays. The Sound of Music was a big hit with everyone. We were lucky to have the sound track at school and it was played to us as a special treat.

As I got to the higher classes, I remember reading the daily newspaper which was left in the ping pong room. I will never forget the day when we heard of the assassination of President John Kennedy.

We were happy, well looked after, ate all the food that was offered us, especially those butter biscuits at morning break! Our tuck boxes never lasted for more than a month or so!! But the canteen was always there for the occasional Cadbury chocolate treat. That is, if you still had any pocket-money left.

Though most of us were not Christians, I was very fond of our first period of the day, which was Scripture. Miss Compton made the Bible come alive and I enjoyed doing the reading at the chapel when it was my turn. We prayed every day for peace in the Middle East and then when the war started in Vietnam, we prayed for peace there as well. At the end of the morning chapel, we would file out while Mrs Prabhakar played a rousing march on the piano.

Although we counted down the days at the end of the school year, as some of us had not seen our parents for 9 months, it was always a wrench to leave our friends and school behind. It truly was a home away from home! Happy 150th All Saints' College. Hope you go on for another 150 years, providing quality education for our young girls.

My mother was a much loved music teacher in the school and thanks to her we were given this brilliant educational kick start that was to be the formative diving board into what has been an exciting, challenging life.



My eleven years at All Saints' were truly formative and played a big part in shaping me. I was five and a half, when I first made the breathless climb up that unforgettable front drive.

My eleven years at All Saints' School were truly formative and played a big part in shaping me. I was five and a half, when I first made the breathless climb up that unforgettable front drive. I was 16 when I ended my schooling at this beloved institution, honored to be Head Girl in my final year and occupy the coveted 'head girl's dorm' that enjoyed a vantage view of that some front drive! Those unforgettable years were packed full of memories: childhood play with precious friends, lessons learned with a host of remarkable teachers, a nine-month home with a different kind of family - all in the scenic environment of Kumaon's gently rolling hills. Those years brought us anxiety and jubilation, laughter and tears, hope and disappointment and each experience helped temper us and make us the strong women we became.

I was in Class VII when we celebrated 1969, as the Centenary Year. Everything was special that year and, for the first time, Sherwood and All Saints performed the annual concert jointly that year. It was Shakespeare's Macbeth and the two leading characters were nicely (and quite fittingly) played by Christine Storey and Dalip Tahil- the All Saints' Head Girl and Sherwood Head Boy. The Centenary celebrations for the two schools culminated with the final performance of Shakespeare's masterpiece in Sherwood's Milman Hall. Old Sherwoodian Field Marshall Sam Manekshaw was Chief Guest and gave a rousing speech that included the welcome declaration of a generous number of additional holidays! It seems impossible that half a century has passed since then...

In these intervening 50 years, my daughter Bianca Smetacek has also passed through All Saints'- running down the same corridors and passages and playgrounds as did her mom, twenty years before. Today, Bianca lives in Calgary, with children of her own, and I live in Washington DC. We have experienced All Saints' in different ways, separated by two decades, but this institution has been transformational for us both. Interestingly, my husband and son did their schooling in St. Joseph's just down the road, so our connection with Nainital runs deep. We have chosen to keep a home in nearby Bhimtal, which I would certainly like to visit more often.

(Chief Commissioner of Income Tax, Mumbai)

Going down memory lane in respect of my life at All Saints School, as it was then called, has been a far more difficult assignment than the work I do daily in my capacity as Chief Commissioner in Income Tax.

And only because the flood of memories has clouded my sentiments. making it not only an emotional journey but also difficult to shortlist a few which I should pen down, ignoring the rest. The task becomes even more problematic because the memories that rush to the forefront are those which are related to the 'not allowed' category and therefore, may be a no-no for a School Coffee Book but at the same time, were truly the most joyous and fun moments which are recalled and laughed over whenever a group of us 'All C' friends connect. That is an inevitable event at every gathering of ours.

My life in All Saints began in the year 1965 when I joined in Class 1 in Junior School. Though the memories of these years are blurred but what I can never forget is that it was here that I made my best friends, who remained with me throughout school and though separated by distances and our own individual commitments now, remain my best friends till date. The memory of the dread that I felt when I realized that the vacations were over and during the journey back to school after each holiday, used to disappear the minute my parents turned around the corner of the building after dropping me in Junior school and were out of sight. Running into a squealing bunch of friends, all eager to narrate their holiday stories and to dive into the 'tuck' that we all had brought, was all that mattered. The chill-blains brought about by the winter chill, the chapped cheeks, elbows and knees were only noticed when we went back home to our concerned mothers. For usthese were synonymous with the life in Junior School, where despite the watchful eyes of Ms. Ducket, our Vice Principal in Junior School, we still managed to steal the raw apricots from the solitary Apricot tree in the front yard; a theft which always cost us dear. The teaspoons of Castor Oil poured down our throats as the punishment for the theft was only a momentary set-back because given a chance, the raw apricot would again be broken and the spoils shared, even though the spoil was anything but sweet.

Senior School, which started from Class 6, had me cornered by the

Hindi teacher, Ms. Joshi, because though I excelled in her subject- I was a back-bencher and hence always engaged in my favourite past-time of distracting the front row studious lot. Her repeated disappointment at me giving the correct answer to a question which she thought had caught me unawares, resulted in me being sent out of class on more occasions than I can recall. The memories of Ms. Keelor, Ms. Higgins, Ms. Gilby, Ms. Ludwig, the indefatigable Mr. Pandey and so many more who gave their all to bring out the best in all of us and my constant run-ins with most of them represent a rare treasure-trove for me.

Ranging from the routine of squatting in Ms. Compton's room (our Principal) on a Sunday evening where she read out stories for us, sitting lady-like in her chair, to the trip to Snow-View and then down to the 'Flatties' to play a base-ball match against St. Mary's with the whole town crowding around to see us play to the occasional trip to Capitol or Ashoka theater to watch a movie, were heavenly experiences. It was in Senior School that each one of us must have had our mouths washed with soap dozens of times for using cuss words! Each one of my class mates knew the Bible by heart because we prayed in our chapel every day, kneeling on a stone-cold floor in the winters, but the trip to town on 'Janmashtami' day was incentive enough for us to turn devout Hindus and fast throughout the day! A memory very

dear but exclusive to me was the bashing I got from my group of friends for topping the class after all of us gave our examinations without adequate preparation because we were too busy having fun, rather than studying, and they all barely scraped through, facing the obvious ire of the teachers and parents alike. But the penalty I paid for this was that I ended up doing every group project on my own while the rest of my associates took time out to have fun!

- The memories which are the highlights of my school life however, all seem to be linked to the interaction with the opposite sex and in the years when we were seniors: my class having the unique distinction of being the seniors for two years since we were the first batch of 10 +2 and with the added advantage that Sherwood was a pure boy's school in my time.
- The joyous trip made every week up the hill to use the Sherwood swimming pool, complete with the swimming gear, and shyly looking up at the barred windows hoping to catch a glimpse of some lucky Sherwoodian who was in that class, was always an event which made us hate the winter because that spelled the end of the trudge up the mountain.
- The 'tuck-wala and the fruit-wala' whose trips coincided with the 'brother Sunday' trip to school by the Sherwoodians was an event I always looked forward to because all my 'cousins' trips to school meant a swelling of my tuck-trove while I released them to meet their 'cousins'.
- The first-ever social between All Saints' and Sherwood in Sherwood's Milman Hall, if I recall correctly, in my senior years was almost a historic event, given the feverish levels of excitement and discussions that followed not to forget the preparations on our part to 'look our best'. This event would have set Twitter on fire, if it had existed at that time. The 'high' to set the record straight, was mutual.
- Equally historic was the first ever mixed Debate which took place between us and the Sherwoodians, under the able guidance of Ms. Ludwig with the hall bursting at its seams with the crowd, not all of whom were necessarily interested in the Debate!
- This was followed closely by a joint-production between Sherwood and All Saints' of the legendary play 'The Diary of Anne Frank' in which I bagged the part of Margot Frank, the elder sister of Anne Frank. The rave reviews that the play received and the path-breaking action to do a joint collaboration between the 2 schools remained the stuff legends for many years thereafter.
- And of course, how can I forget that my last 2 years in school were the first and only time that All Saints' turned into a co-educational institution, with the advent of 10 local Semians who joined us for Classes 11 & a 12 as Day-Scholars. The feverish excitement at this news coupled with the uniform skirts rising a few inches higher and the sudden conversion of my boisterous and unruly classmates, me included, into shy, well-behaved but ever watchful of each ex-Semians move, whom we became very possessive about, can probably be summed up as an event which would go down into the annals of history in so far as me and my friends are

Having spent 12 years of my life in the glorious All Saints School, leaving it as an ICSE topper not only of the School but in the entire country, there are too many memories that are swirling in my mind; memories that I love and want to hold onto, never wanting to let-go or lose because these are from some of the happiest days of my life.

I emerged from All Saints' in 1985 as a free spirited, confident woman with an independent thinking streak. I was always known to be stubborn yet driven person, someone who had a keen sense of justice, a fair person and one who saw goodness in everyone and felt that even the worst had a lesson to teach. All Saints' was my oyster, my haven for 7 short years and I knew everyone and everything in the school. And I mean it – everyone and everything.

However, the world that greeted me was not quite like being in All Saints'. The world was BIG and it had its own rhythm and I was suddenly a nobody. This feeling of being a nobody was uncomfortable for someone like me. After all I had been the Head Girl 1985 and if I may say myself, a very popular one amongst the students and the teachers, alike. This new world called the United States of America, scared me. It was cold and always in a hurry; the university was huge and scary; the course work so mechanical that I started to feel lost and unproductive.

I remember sitting awake in my bed one night at the University and I pulled out a blank sheet of paper to regroup and write down what truly mattered to me. Where was that girl from All Saints' – I had to find her again. I had to be her again if I was to make anything worthwhile of my life in an American University. So that night I wrote down what really mattered to me; little did I know that what I wrote was to become my value system; a value system that All Saints' had unknowingly given me.

The words I wrote - independence, confidence, responsibility, a sense of community, tolerance and acceptance. Simple yet critical life lessons that somehow got knitted into my DNA without so much as an effort, just naturally and unknowingly. I had to find them again, I had to believe in them again and I had to make a difference.

I was surrounded by strong women, seniors who I idolized, teachers who I respected (despite the occasional ruler on the knuckles) and my class mates who I loved, protected and relished. The classmates became, and remain, the original Yaya Sisterhood. It is a bond that I carry till today with every one of them. We all came from different walks of life, varied backgrounds with the burden of our families (and our own) expectations weighing us down. However, when we came together it was nothing but a sense of true comradery, of pushing and pulling, of lifting each other up and of celebrating one another. Of course, we had our moments of absolute fear and the chaos (in the form of punishments) that ensued. Such moments usually involved loud music, disobeying a prefect (with my smart mouth) or during my time, the green blazers across the orchard.

There was this word we used to use a lot – cooperation. Little did I know that the seeds of institutional leadership and teamwork had already been sowed at the tender age of 9. What cooperation meant to us when we were young was simple "One for all, all for one". As I grew upand entered the business world as a working woman in America, I

realized that this word was called "team work" in business jargon. Everyone spoke about it but few understood its true meaning or purpose. To me, it came naturally. I was always the one to rally the troops on to a mission or a goal for the betterment of the organization and that is what got recognized by the powers that be.

We all have inherent biases and it would be wrong to even think otherwise. All Saints' taught me how to look beyond all these boundaries. For the fear of getting into a political rhetoric, the world around us is still struggling with this notion of equality, and at the rate we are going, I doubt we will ever get beyond this. This sense of equality, of respectful tolerance, one not higher than the other or lower, one not better than the other, came from all the years spent at School not knowing caste, color, creed or socioeconomic background. We were all the same – just a bunch of young women having the time of our lives, creating moments that would last a life time!

Some of the best memories of my life circle back to my days at School, and not all of it has to do with the studying or the piles of books that surrounded me. So strong was my desire to return to school after the long winter break, that my mother recently admitted to experiencing bouts of jealousy. Even today, when I speak with that filmy flare of my times and trials at All Saints', I can sense pangs of envy from those around me. Yes, I am super proud to be from All Saints'; and I am proud to be the bearer of her legacy.

Now as a woman I feel that at every stage of life there are ups and downs, challenges and commitments. We should all face these and continue working on our dreams to make them happen.


