NATIONAL TECHNOLOGY DAY

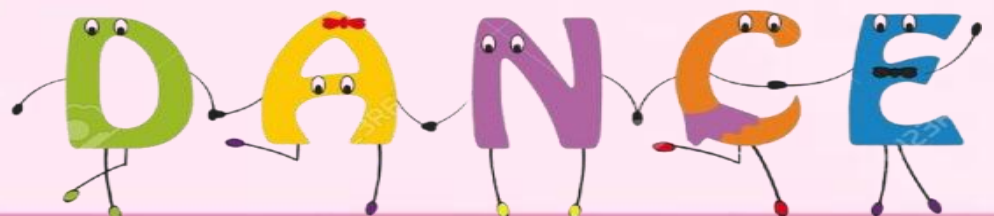
Our school celebrated National Technology Day on 11 May 2026 with great enthusiasm through a special morning assembly.

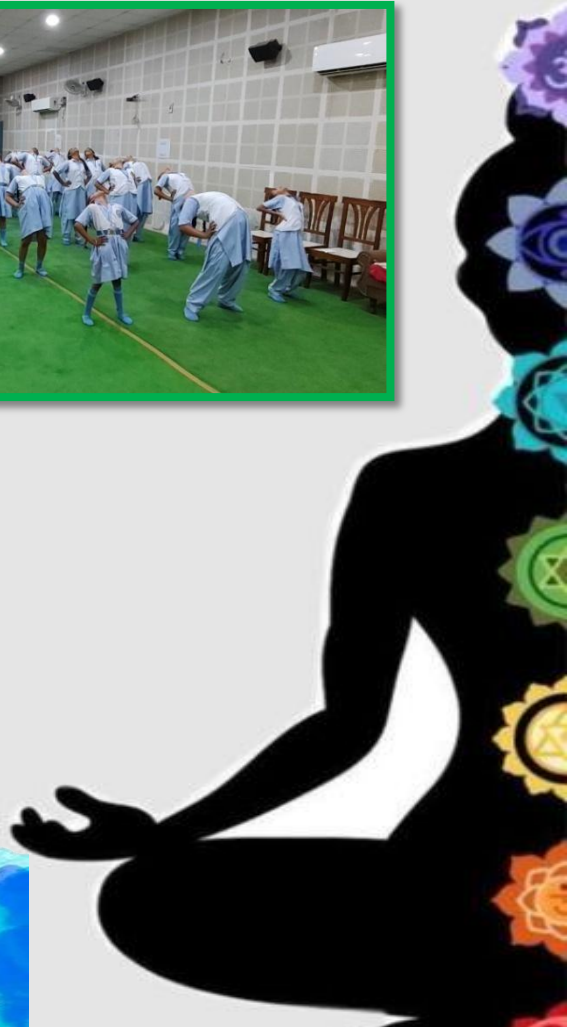
CLAY MODELLING ACTIVITY

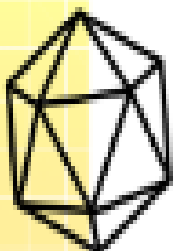

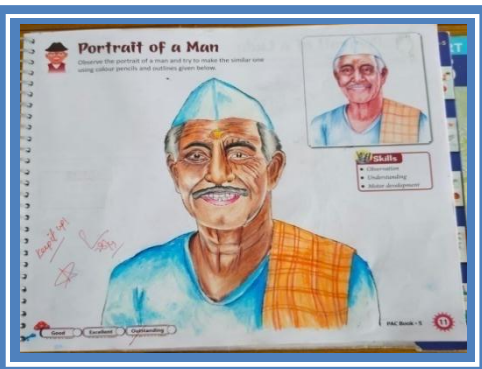

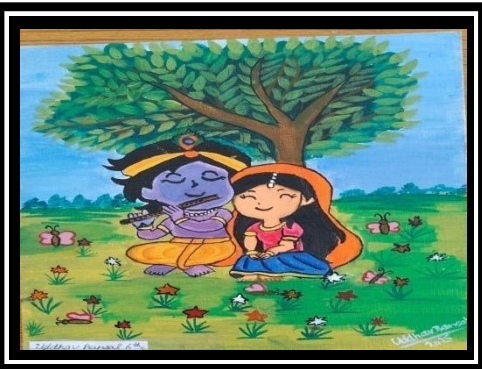
