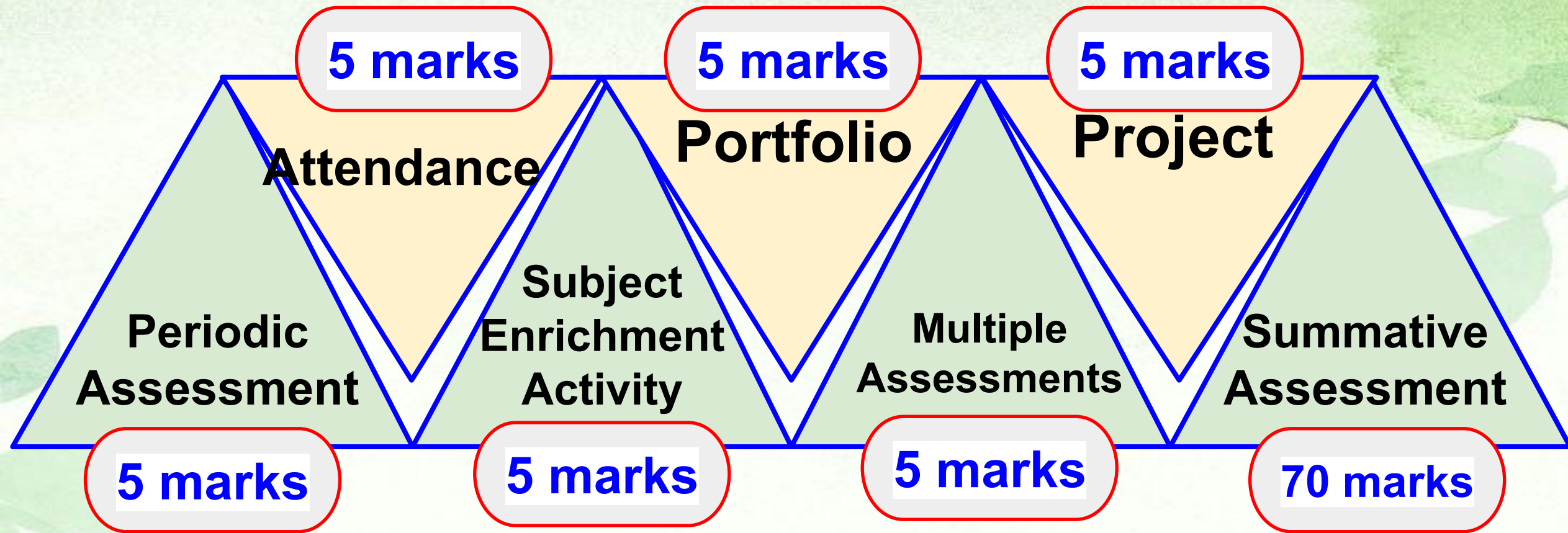
Assessment Structure for the 5 Scholastic Subjects (2026-27)

Navigating the School Year: A Counselor's guide for parents

What are we seeing in Children Today?

- **Struggle to hear “No”** → Expect things immediately
- **Give up easily** → Don’t want to try if it feels difficult
- **Blame others** → “It’s not my fault”
- **Get upset quickly** → Small issues feel very big
- **Test limits** → Keep pushing to get their way
- **Less respect for rules** → Especially when messages differ at home & school
- **Stop sharing** → Fear of being scolded or compared

How Can We Be The Parents They need?

- **Be consistent** → Same rules and responses from both parents
- **Allow small struggles** → Let them try, fail, and try again
- **Set clear, calm rules** → Firm but not harsh
- **Listen fully** → Don't interrupt, judge, or compare
- **Model behaviour** → Show respect, patience, honesty
- **Support school in front of your child** → Builds respect for teachers
- **Stay involved daily** → Check school diary, E care, know their routine
