Let's make this season a little warmer — not just with sweaters, but with sharing, care, and compassion.

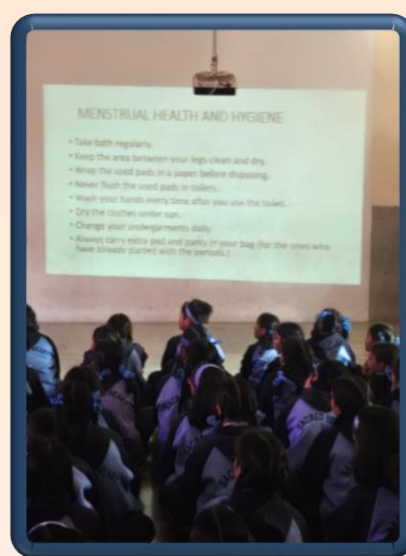


SESSION ON PUBERTAL CHANGES IN GIRLS

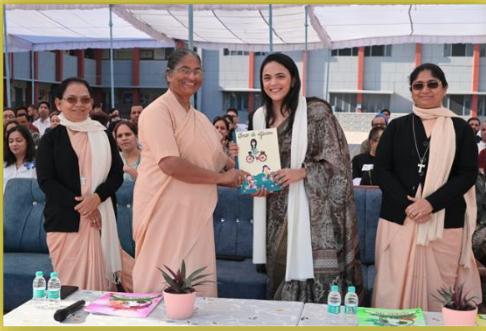
Jour de Gloire: Sports Day 2025

The Woodsia Alpina Eco Club organised an enriching educational visit to the Chandigarh Bird Park for the students of Class 8 on 22 November 2024.

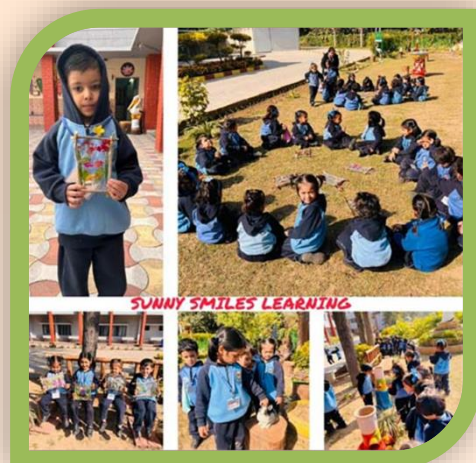
