2. Model

GROWTH OF A PLANT FROM A SEED

Use clay or cardboard to show.

Project: "My Seed Diary" – Grow 2–3 seeds in small pots. Record their growth for 7 days with drawings/photos and paste it in scrapbook.

2. FOOD AND HEALTH (Roll No. 15 to 19)

Project: "Healthy Plate Model" – Divide a paper plate into food groups and paste/draw items.

Presentation: Poster: "Junk vs Healthy Food" – include labels and food cut outs.

Scrapbook Title: "Fuel for My Body"

Make it colourful with food stickers, hand-drawn fruits, and mini booklets.

It includes cover Page --**Title: Food and Health – My Nutrition Journal**

Decorate with cut outs of fruits, veggies, or stickers. Add your photo as a "Little Nutritionist"!

TOPICS COVERED

1. TYPES OF FOOD (USE PICTURES ALSO) .Label each with a short line about its function.

2. Balanced Diet Plate: Draw or cut out a plate and paste different food groups on it. Use coloured paper to show proteins, vitamins, carbohydrates, etc. Add labels like "Strong Bones", "Healthy Eyes", "Energy".

3. Junk Food vs. Healthy Food: Paste wrappers of chips, chocolate vs. real fruit, salad, milk cartons.

4. Good eating habits.

3.THE WORLD OF ANIMALS (Roll No. 10 to 14)

Choose any one project

Project: "Animal Habitat Diorama" – Use a shoebox to create jungle, ocean, or desert habitats.

OR

PROJECT Create a 3D Animal Habitat Shoebox

Make a rainforest, desert, or ocean scene inside a shoebox using clay animals, real leaves, sand, blue paper, etc.

Label each animal and describe how they survive there.

Animal Superpowers Poster

Make a poster titled “Animal Superpowers”

Show 5 animals with their special adaptations (includes pictures also).

4. AIR AND WATER (Roll No. 5 to 9)

Project: “Mini Water Filter Model” – Use gravel, sand, cotton in a bottle to show how filtration works.

Presentation: “Clean Air, Clear Water” – A poster with pollution sources and solutions.

Scrap book:-

Topic: Pollution: The Silent Enemy"

Explore how pollution quietly affects the environment, health, and future generations without much notice. Create a mysterious, engaging scrapbook with hidden facts and pop-ups.

Use real images or hand-draw factories, traffic, forest fires.

Add a “Dos and Don’ts” list also.

5. OUR ENVIRONMENT (Roll No. 1 to 4)

Project: “Trash to Treasure” – Create something useful from old bottles, newspapers, etc.

Model: The Green vs Polluted Earth.

(Model Design Idea: Two Sections (Compare & Learn)

Section 1: Clean Environment

Trees made of green paper or sponge, Houses with solar panels (paper/foil), A park with kids, a pond (blue paper), Windmill (made from paper and stick), Animals and birds living happily

Label: “Healthy Earth – Clean, Green, and Happy

Section 2: Polluted Environment

Smoke (cotton with black paint) from factories, Dirty river (plastic bags, wrappers), Littered roads, fallen trees, Sad animals or no birds, Noise area with horns and traffic.

Label: “Polluted Earth – Sad and Suffering!”
