LADAKH : THE COLD DESERT



Adited Sixch Born: Seven-A

Last winter I had the opportunity of visiting Ladakh, since my father was posted there. My stay there was an experience of a lifetime! I wish to share some facts about this beautiful land.

I adalch is indeed a wonderland in the sweet lap of the Kashmir Himalayas. It is a land where earth and sky seem to meet and it looks like the roof of the world. It is one of the lettrest and remotest inhabited regions of the world. It is a high-altitude cold desert, bounded by two of the world's mightnest mountain natges, the Great Himalayan and Karakoram. Ladakh lics at alliquides ranging from 9000 fect (2,750 m) at Kargil to 25,200 feet (7,670m) at Saser Kangri in the Kankoram.

The sommer temperature rarely exceeds 27°C while in winter it may plumanet to 30°C. Sarprisingly, though, the thin air makes the heat of the sun even more increase than at lower electricies. It is said that only in Ladelth can a men sitting in the sun with his feet in the shade suffer from sunstroke and frostbite at the same time!

Ladakhis are very honest and straightforward people. They are polite, gentle and baspitable. The incidence of crime is the lowest in the state.

The cirinks of the Ludalchis include the salted and buttered tea, which is very popular. The other popular drink is 'chang' (burley beer) which is a mild intexicant. Their favourite dishes are Mohmong, Zan and Thipkin. Most of the handscrafts found in Ladakh are made either wool or metal. There are

DR R R AMREDKAR

FATHER OF THE INDIAN CONSTITUTION 1893-1956



As the unquestioned leader of the depressed classes and the principal architect of the Indian constitution, the name of Dr. Bhimros Ambedkar will always be remembered in Indian history. His was the main insulration behind the inclusion of special provisions in the constitution of India for the development of schedule caste people. Dr. Ambedkar was the law minister of India from 1947 to 1951, During 1942 -1946, he also served as the member of viceroy's executive

council and from 1926 to 1934 he was a nominated member of the Bombov logislative council. He attended the round table conferences in London as a representative of the depressed classes of India, Dr. Ambedkar also took part in the satyagraha of untouchables at Nasik in 1930 for opening the Hindu temples to them To strike at the consciouse of the orthodox Hindus, Dr. Ambedkar, together with his 2-lakh followers, embraced Buddhism on 14 October, 1956. Bhimeos Ramini Ambedkar was born on 14th April 1893 in a very poor untouchable

family of Madiya Pradeah. Being an untouchable, the young Ambedkar had to face all the indignities suffered by the rest of the members of his class. The then ruler of Baroda was highly impressed with his talents and he helped Ambedian to travel to U.S.A. for higher studies. In U.S.A. he did his M.A. in 1915 and PhD in 1916. From 1918 to 1920. Dr. Ambedkar was a professor of law. In 1925, Dr. Ambedkar set up his lessal practice of a lower at the Bombay high court.

This widely learned man and liberator of the downtredden passed away on 6th December, 1956.
