PROFILE: KEVIN CARTON

Kovin Carton was horn in Lucknow, India on October 26, 1933, the eldest child of Shollagh and Cyril Carton, Cyril Carton was an officer in the East Indian Railways having commenced his ratilway service after completing his Senior Cambridge and ISC Examinations and then rising to the Official Grade over his service period.

He became a permanent member of CBC Old Boys team the following year (1951) at age 17, the same year being selected in the Western Australia State Colta

Kevin Carton continued to represent the Western Australia Colts Team in 1952, 1953 and 1954 whilst he was still under 21 years of age. Upon reaching his National Champkinships.

Western Australia was again successful in the 1956 Australian Chamoionships and as Australia was to be represented for the first time in Olympic Hockey in the Melhourne Camer, ho was selected to represent Australia as an Olympian in Melbourne.

Keyin Carton continued to represent Western Australia in the years 1938. 1960, 1961, 1963, and 1964, the years he was available for selection

In 1960 Kevin Carton was again selected to represent Australia at the Rome Games and was appointed Vice-Captain of the Australian Team. In 1961

1964. In 1962 he captained Australia in an International Heckey Tournament held in Ahmedaloid, India where Australia firrished 3rd

In the 1960 Rogue games. Australia syached the quarter finals and then drew India the Olympic Champions from the Melbourne Gantes. In a titanic tussle the same ended in a nil-all draw, requiring 20 minutes of extra time to be played. At the end of the first 10 minute period, there was still no score. In the 18th minute of extra time, India scored from a ponalty corner to move into the semi tinals. It was generally considered that the three best teams in Rome were Pakistan (Gold Medals winners), India (Silver Medal Winners) and Australia who were knocked out in the quarter finals by India.

In 1961 and 1963 in addition to being Capasian of Australia, Kevin Carton was also appointed Coach of the Australian Fears. His record as Captain Coach over this period weed 20 marchs for 1984 wins and 2 darway games. In the year 2001 Mr. Carton, accompanied by his wife Annette and his three children, daughter Romilly, and sons Jeremy and Timothy, visited India. The prime reason for this visit was to introduce his family to the country of his birth and to visit the cities he lived in as a boy and the city of his birth, Lucknow.

In addition to this he wanted his family to see St. Joseph's College in Naini Tal where he spent six very happy years as a student of the College and the Irish Christian Brothers who operated the school in those days.

It was during this visit to the College that Mr. Carton oldered to donable hockey to poly to the College as a tolent of bis appreciation of all the school had done for him and his brother. The trophy named "The Kevin Carton Hockey Inophy" is to be played for each year in whateve forum the Principal of the College desires. 



AN EXTRACT FROM THE COLLEGE ANNALS 1905. ATTENDANCE AND CONDUCT.

One of the most interesting paragraphs in each of our succeeding Appeal Reports is that which deals with attendance. Those of our friends who have kept these Annual Records will find on referring to them that each year since 1892 has seen an increase in the number of pupils, a certain index to the popularity of the College. A steady and substantial increase has brought us from 42 in 1892 to 271 in 1905. Each year sees some of the boys leave to enter the larger school of the world. Last year the engineering colleges of Roorkee and Sibpore claimed some while others entered the medical colleges of Calcutta and Bombay. Several were admitted to engineering colleges in England and not less than 20 proceeded thither with a view to continuing their studies. The cape made by these departures are filled un immediately. We have for the post three years reached the limit of our boarding accommodation. The conduct of the pupils has been very good. Infractions of discipline, will, even in the best regulated establishments occur but these have been rare in St. luseph's and it is a pleasure for me to be able to bear testimony to the excellent spirit of lovalty and good fellowship which prevails in the College.


