





## A Hundred Years Ago An Extract from the College Annals - 1909

The number of new specifications was as numerous as in former years. The new experiments were not pushed forward so rapidly as we expected. However, fair progress was made and everything should be completely finished off by the end of February. The staff was strengthened by an additional Brother, Dr. August Anton. On the 27<sup>th</sup> of March the Superior General of the Brothers, Fr. J. Hennessy, arrived in Nairobi for visitation of the College. He remained a week and he was pleased with everything, especially with the new extensions.

The health of the College was very good on the whole. We had a few cases of enteric, known of course in mild form, of these attacked were two Brothers, Fr. A. Conroy and Fr. Gabriel Mole. Both were removed to the Army Hospital where every care and attention was bestowed upon them. At the end of July Captain Craig, a specialist from Kenya, was sent here by the Government of India to make a thorough examination of the patients who were attacked five years and last year as well as the accounts connected with the food. He found the outbreak was due, both years, to a carrier amongst the servants who had a great deal to do with the handling of the food. Needless to say this servant was dismissed at once and cases of enteric fever, need, to occur.

## THE YEAR OF ASTRONOMY

The word 'astronomy' is derived from the Greek words 'astron' meaning 'star' and 'nomos' meaning 'law', and is the scientific study of celestial bodies and phenomena that originate outside the earth's atmosphere. It is concerned with the evolution, physical chemistry, astrometry and motion of celestial objects as well as the formation and development of the universe. The six main fields of astronomy are:

1. Theoretical astronomy, which is focused on the development of mathematical models for diverse astronomical objects.
2. Stellar astronomy, which deals with the study of stars.
3. Solar astronomy is the study of our sun.
4. Galactic astronomy is the study of the galaxy.
5. Extragalactic astronomy is the study of other galaxies and the structure of the Universe.
6. Cosmology is the study of the origin and evolution of the Universe.

In early times, as a society often depended for observation and predictions of the motions of celestial bodies in the visible sky. These observations could be employed to determine the seasons, an important factor in knowing when to plant crops, as well as understanding the length of the year. Before tools such as telescopes were invented, ideas about the motions of the planet were limited, and the nature of rain, moon and the work in the universe were explored primarily through observation. This work was not limited by the nature of the universe with theories, observations relating astronomy. This is known as the geocentric model of the universe.

In the 16th century, Nicolaus Copernicus proposed a heliocentric model of the solar system. His work was followed, expanded and corrected by Galileo Galilei and Johannes Kepler. Some of the great ancient astronomers like Ptolemy, Aristotle, Ptolemy and some more. These people made great contributions to astronomy. The ancient Indian astronomers were

Imagine receiving a letter from a great author. You could feel your heart and waterfalls flow from tears and flaming volcanoes.

A French writer named Jules Verne imagined such a journey many years ago. He wrote about it in a book called "The World as a Ballroom" (1873). I was struck by some of the strange journey. The first one was called "A Journey to the Centre of the Earth" (1864). It was about all the wonderful and scary things people might find inside the Earth. As a young boy, Verne often read books, with his father on the floor. Verne's father would hang out for him reading a huge pile of books in a cage of silver wire. He wrote about his own, very adventures to the top of "Twenty Thousand Leagues Under the Sea" (1870). He named his imaginary submarine the "Nautilus", after an actual whale that he found in 1800. In "Twenty Thousand Leagues Under the Sea" Verne wrote about traveling to the Moon in a rocket ship, but he never printed it. It was never possible.

There is a lot to say that he was the best to live and write. Like Cervantes was discovered and I was that wonderful man for the help of wild dreams, hope, joy and interest to get him for his stories.

An environment, which is the hallmark of democracy, an environment which will help us make our dreams of India shining!







My second visit to Europe was to travel across Europe and it was an exciting day after flying to my second visit to a land.




## A STUDY ON DAY-DREAMERS


