

A SHORT BIOGRAPHY OF EDMUND RICE FOUNDER OF THE CHRISTIAN BROTHERS


Blessed Edmund Ignatius Rice, was a Roman Catholic missionary and educationalist. Edmund was the founder of two religious institutes of religious brothers: the Congregation of Christian Brothers and the Presentation Brothers.

Born in Callan, Ireland, in 1762, Edmund came to the bustling city port of Waterford as a young man. He was talented and energetic and soon became very wealthy. Married to Mary Elliot, in 1789 he experienced her tragic death soon after she gave

birth to their daughter Mary. Deeply saddened by her loss, Edmund entered a time of mourning. As his daughter continued to open the depths of his love, his relationship with God deepened. In his own brokenness, he was moved with compassion to recognise the brokenness of those around him. He entered more deeply into their struggle and found in the story of Jesus, the call to liberation that is at the heart of what Jesus preached and in which his church is engaged.

The Ireland of Edmund's day was an unjust place where many lived in poverty and social structures deeply oppressed the majority of the population. In 1802 he set up a free school for boys living in poverty. His aim was to promote an education that recognised the dignity of each individual and thus he sought to liberate them from their ignorance of God and of their Catholic faith, while at the same time empowering them with an education which would enable them to rise from the demeaning poverty and sense of hopelessness in which they were trapped. Thus Edmund sought to liberate individuals and indeed to free his society from oppression.

In 1808, seven of the staff including Edmund Rice took religious vows under the authority of Bishop Power of Waterford. Following the example of Nano Nagle's Presentation Sisters, they were called Presentation Brothers.




This was the first congregation of men to be founded in Ireland and one of the few ever founded by a layman. Gradually, a transformation took place amongst the "quay kids" of Waterford, largely attributed to Edmund and his brothers' work, who educated, clothed and fed the boys.

However, the communities were under the bishop's control in each diocese rather than Edmund Rice, which created problems when Brothers were needed to be transferred from one school to another. Rice sought approval

from Pope Pius VII for the community to be made into a pontifical congregation with a Superior General. He obtained this in 1820. The Pope's brief specified that the members were to be bound by vows of obedience, chastity, poverty and perseverance, and to give themselves to the free instruction, religious and literary, of male children, especially the poor. The heads of houses were to elect a Superior General; Rice held this office from 1822 to 1838, and he was then able to move brothers across diocesan boundaries to wherever they were most needed. During this time the institution extended to several English towns (especially in Lancashire), and the course of instruction grew out of the primary stage.

In the 1820s further difficulties emerged owing to the expansion of the society and its becoming two distinct congregations. From this time on they were called Christian Brothers and the Presentation Brothers. The motto of the Christian Brothers was: "The Lord has given, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord forever" (Job 1:21).

In 1828, the North Richmond Street house and schools in Dublin were established by Rice, the foundation stone being laid by the politician Daniel O'Connell. The building housed the Brothers' headquarters for many years and the present residence incorporates the original house built by Rice, who lived here for several years beginning in 1831.



St Joseph's College, Nainital, was established in 1888.

The site was previously the location of a seminary, run by the Italian Capuchin Fathers. The school is still referred to as "SEM" (for Seminary).

In 1892, four Christian Brothers took formal charge of St Joseph's College, and thus began the involvement of the Christian Brothers in the running of the school.

The school is one of 20 educational institutions in India conducted by the Congregation of Christian Brothers, a pontifical institute, founded in Ireland in 1802 by Edmund Ignatius Rice, a wealthy Catholic layman, who was beatified in 1996.



THE PERFECT HAILSTORM – 7 MAY 1998

With only a week left for the most awaited 'Annual Sports Day' everything was in perfect shape. The preparations were in the final stages. Quite a few events had already been decided. The relay teams were in order. The drill practices were going full-fledgedly. Students had been selected for rope work and gymnastics team was finalized. And then came the storm that caught Nainital unawares.

We had late sleeps on the occasion of national holiday, Muharram. Even at 7 am it looked like dusk. The sky looked grey, dark and threatening. No sooner had we all entered the study hall for second studies than it began to rain and hail. It was a day many of us would remember in many years to come. It was the day of the perfect hailstorm.

While in the study hall, one of the students reminded me in the middle of the storm that some of the windows in the dormitories were open. The teacher in-charge (Mr. M. C. Pandey) then sent for the Captains to check for the same only to hear the shocking news of the havoc the storm had caused. Almost all the window panes towards the college front were broken and shattered. The hail and water had entered the dormitories soaking all the beds near the windows. It was like the fury of hell.

The storm was deafening and the wind blew with all fury and rage. Br. Murray's room (adjoining the school church) had its roof blown away to the second field which was just a glimpse of the catastrophic hailstorm. Class 5 B (the class at the end of the old senior building) was torn to pieces. The whole scene was utterly disastrous and unbelievable.

The seniors were then summoned to help around. The drains in the quadrangle had clogged causing the water to overflow. The students cleared the drains using hockey sticks and cricket bats. It was a shocking episode of nature's destruction and a result of climate change. It did not occur to me then but when I look back now, I am thankful to God that no life was lost.

One of the billiard tables was completely wet with pieces of hail on it. Every inch of the ground was covered with hail as if it had snowed. At the college front the plants looked denuded without their leaves.

The college front with the broken panes and leafless plants looked haunted like a scene from a horror movie. The water tank used for the toilets across the first field

was also blown away. At the teachers quarters near the basketball court, the hailstorm had played havoc too.

We were allowed to go for town walks in the evening. As there was no electricity we were made to dine at 6 pm and go to bed at 7 pm. The ensuing day, our Principal, Br. M.R. Beddoe announced to the surprised students about the 'Sports' being cancelled and that we were to go home on a vacation for 19 days till the school was brought back to shape. We had our Sports Day in the month of October that year.




THE WELL-BEING WEBINAR 2021






Br Hector Pinto, Principal received a Certificate of Appreciation from Uttaranchal Punjabi Mahasabha Nainital for his exemplary work towards society.




EDMUND RICE "JUST TOGETHER" WORKSHOP

The declaration of results was based on merit, maximum views, and likes.






CLAUDE MARTIN QUIZ AND DEBATE HELD BY LA MARTINIERE SCHOOL, LUCKNOW

felt gratitude to the management for their support and concern, especially during the lock-down period. Mr. Gopal sang a lively folk song to entertain all present.






NAVRACHANA INTERNATIONAL MODEL UNITED NATIONS CONFERENCE

down.












TABLE TENNIS TOURNAMENT 2021


By learning values and behaviour which are appropriate or necessary in our culture, we make ourselves more suitable to that culture and thus we learn the language, values and rituals of that culture.


One day while I was crying for Lisa and Simba, I saw a mythical fire dragon flying over my house. He threw a



जब महामारी के इलाज के लिए टीकें के संबंध में शोध चल रहा था तब भारत भी पीछे नहीं रहा, भारत के वैज्ञानिकों ने स्वदेशी व कम मूल्य पर टीका (कोविशील्ड व कोवैक्सिन) संपूर्ण विश्व विशेषकर गरीब देशों को उपलब्ध करा कर मानवीय मूल्यों की रक्षा के साथ ही अपनी नैतिक जिम्मेदारी का निर्वहन भी किया। यही कारण है कि आज पूरा विश्व भारत की ओर आशांवित है, और यह भी जान गया है कि भारत की भूमिका विश्व शांति और सुरक्षा के लिए कितनी महत्वपूर्ण है।

अभी संपूर्ण विश्व महामारी से उभर भी नहीं पाया था कि सीमा विस्तारीकरण एवं वर्चस्व के उद्देश्य से दो देशों के राष्ट्र प्रमुखों के अहम की पराकाष्टा ने पूरे विश्व को तृतीय विश्व युद्ध की ओर धकेल दिया है। पहले ही कोरोना के कारण विश्व की अर्थव्यवस्था निम्न स्तर पर पहुँच चुकी है। वहीं इन दो देशों (रूस, यूक्रेन) के टकराव ने पूरी मानवता को संकट में डाल दिया है। हथियारों की होड़ व प्रयोग से पर्यावरण एवं जलवायु परिस्थितिक तंत्र पर बहुत बुरा प्रभाव पड़ रहा है, जिसके घातक परिणामों ने पूरी मानवता को खतरों में डाल दिया है।

अब ऐसी विषम परिस्थिति में भारत की भूमिका और भी महात्वपूर्ण हो जाती है, क्योंकि भारत के लगभग सभी देशों से मैत्री संबंध हैं, विशेषकर रूस से भारत का प्राचीन समय से राजनीतिक, सामाजिक व्यापारिक व आर्थिक संबंध रहे हैं। ऐसे समय में सभी प्रभावशाली देश (अमेरिका, ब्रिटेन आदि) चाहते हैं कि भारत इस समय युद्ध को रोकने में मध्यस्थ की भूमिका निभाए और भारत इस संबंध में प्रयास भी कर रहा है जो निश्चित ही मील का पत्थर साबित होगा।














SOCIAL JUSTICE ADVOCACY

Class 4B stood first, 5B got second position and 4A secured the third position.



It is all about exploring the Moon. In this workshop, students learnt about our natural satellite, the Moon, and other features of the moon.




E. R. JUSTICE MEET 2022






MISSION IN PROGRESS
