

# Indian Everest Expedition 1965.

As the story goes Shri Radhanath Sikdhar, Chief Computer of the Survey of India after a series of calculations in 1952 jumped out of his seat with excitement, when he found out that Peak, XV. (The local name of this neak "CHOMOLUNGMA" meaning Goldess mother of wind was probably not known to the surveyors then, so they gave this non-de-plane) was found to be the highest mountain in the world. The peak was named after the then Surveyor General of India, Sir George Everest, who had done temarkable work in the survey of the Himalayas, Seventeen unsuccessful attempts were made to climb this peak since 1921. This led to the discovery of the new route to scale this peak via the South-East ridge in Nepal. Each team gained from the experiences of the past climbers, and they climbed, as it were, on the shoulders of their predecessors. The British Expedition led by Sir John Hunt was successful in scaling this reak in co.c. Eleventhirty on the aforences of May the 29th, was a great event in the annuls of human adventure. Sir Lémund Hillary, a New Zea'ander and Shri Tenring Norgey, an Indian from the Sheepa community on this day reached the top of Mount Everest. This success had not come carily. It was the 7th British attenues and several climbers including Mallery and Irvine who have become legendary figures in mountaineering, had lost their lives making gallant attempts to climb this peak. Although the great mystery about still continued. Every fresh attempt on Everest involves new problems due to the ever-changing shape of the icefall, making of new routes on the snow, ice and rock and watching weather conditions. The lare of Everest continued and other nations took up the challenge. The Swiss in 1916 were successful in sending two groups to the top and the Americans followed in 1963 in sending three more groups to the top-one of them was via the new West Ridge route. Indians were impired by the success of Shri Tenring Norgey and this provided a great incentive to mountaineering as an organised spore in India. It was due to the keen interest taken by late Shri Jawahar Lal Nehru. Prime Minister of India and the late Chief Minister of West Bengal, Dr. B.C.Roy, that the Himalayan Mountaincering Justinese was established at Darjerling in Nov. 1954. After 1965 the Nepal Govr. put a ban on all foreign expeditions in Nepal. This has been recently lifted. The Japanese are planning to stake this neak in 1970 and in 1971 and International Expedition is attention in

The story of India's third and successful expedition to Everest began on the 15th August 1564 when the Sponsoring Committee of the Indian Mountaincering Foundation, New Delhi, announced the selection of Commander, M.S.Kohli as leader and Lr. Cell, N. Kumar, now Principal of the Himalayan Mountaineering Institute, Darieeling, as Deputy Leader. After six months of careful preparations the train finally started off from New Delhi on Feb. aand, 1965. Most of the equipment was manufactured by the Indian Defence Ordinance factories. Besides this they provided a number of instant foods, i.e., pre-cooked rice, cal, roraths, meat, vegetables and other food items which were immensely liked by the team members at the high altitude camps due to their lightness and high nutritive value. Four days later they started their month long trek from Jayanagar, a small town in Darbhanga District on the Nepal-Bihar border. About 20 tons of food and equipment were carried by over 800 porters- nearly one third of them were womenwho were as sturdy as the men. The team consisted of 19 members including 14 climbing members, two doctors and two wireless operators. In addition one Nepalese Ligiton Officer, Lt. Rana Joined the team. Fifty sherpas had been recruited to assist them at high altitudes with Aug. Tshering as Sherpa Sirdar and Phu Dorice as Deputy Sirdar.

At every village they were very helpful in providing the team with fresh supplies of milk, milk products, fresh vegetables, eggs and chicken. Every day after trekking about 10-12 miles the team camped in new surroundings. This in itself was a memorable experience. The team halted at Thangboche (11.000 ft), the heavenly monastery near Everest and received the blessings of the incarrage Lama before they resumed their climb. On March 22, exactly a month after they had left Delhi they reached the Base Camp at the height of 17,800 ft. The party was now on the Khumbu glacier. After a day's roit, they were up early to make a route in the ice-fall, the first and main burdle on the way to Everest. Towers of ice of various shapes threatened to tumble down at any moment with a thunderous roar. There were crevases (long cracks on the ice) They used logs and aluminium ladders to bridge the crevases and ropes and rope ladders to make the steep slower on the ice safer for the climbers. It rook them four days of hard work on ice before they were on the top of the ice-fall, which they reached on 27th March. They were now in the Western Cwm of Everest. The Valley of Silence' as the Swiss lad called it. Compared to the ice-fall which presented a constant danger to life, the Western Cwm was safer. It had a gentle slope covered with layers of fresh mow with some hidden as well as onen crevanes. The party spent about a week in establishing their Advance Base Camp at 21,200 fr. and Camp III at 21,000 fr. Later they had to face the second big hurdle, the Lhoue face which rises abruptly above the Western Cwm to 26,200 ft, high South Col. The first to the South Col (Camp V) reached it on April the 16th. The team had carlier established Camp IV on the Lhotse face at a height of 25,000 ft. The climbers were now ready for the crucial phase of the climb. Summit teams were named. It was the first time in the history of an Everyt adventure that a snown attempt was being launched so early in the season.
