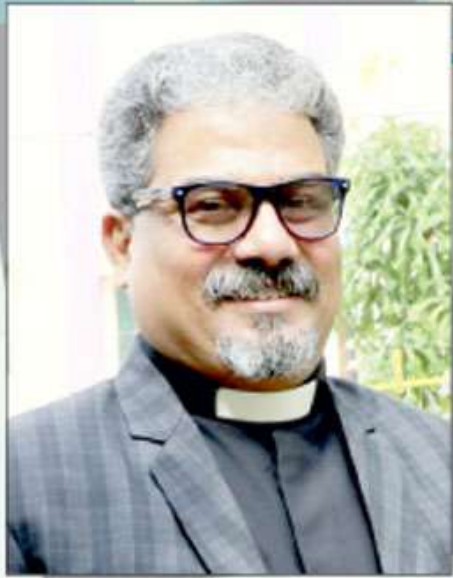

# Report of- Science Association

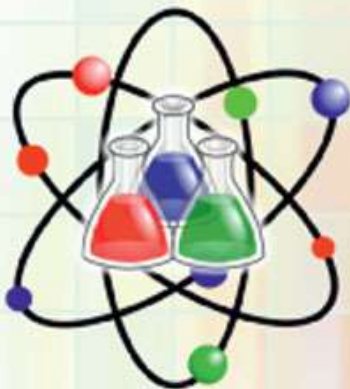
