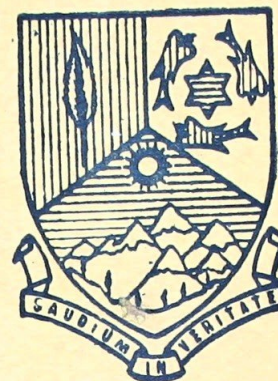

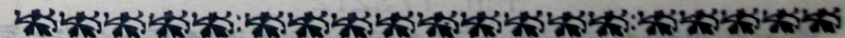

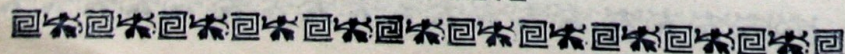

Its coverage of the English language amply justifies the *Guardian's* review of the last edition as a 'meaningful pocket of social history'.

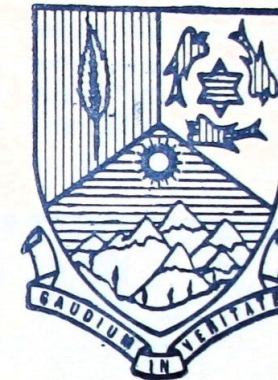

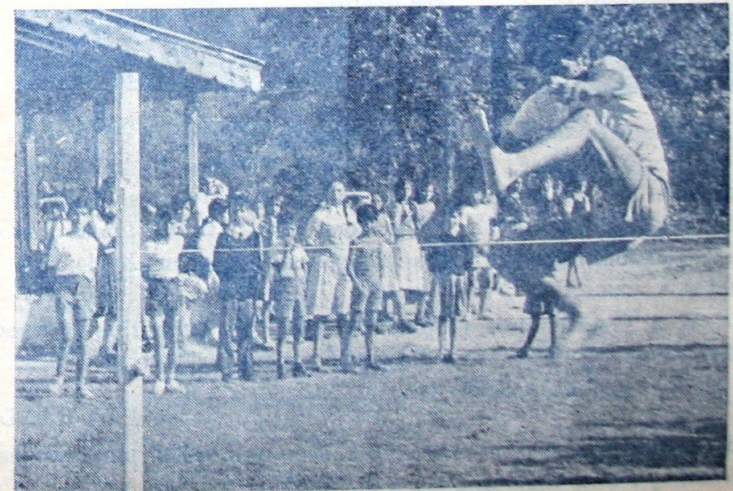

The present level of corruption in our society will never allow the formation of a welfare state of the type our great leaders, Gandhiji and Pandit Nehru, dreamt of.

The most important task, then, that our government has to tackle is to try and eradicate corruption. No doubt, some steps have been taken in that direction but unfortunately these have been only short-term measures. Perhaps more ruthless measures should be adopted for doing away with corruption at all levels, starting with the top level of government and society. We, for our part as students, have to try and see that we ourselves are not poisoned by this atmosphere of corruption around us. We should have principles to stand by and not just do things or follow practices because 'everyone else is doing it'.

However, for our society as a whole to develop a higher sense of human values, it is very essential for our leaders to set an example in the line of honesty and integrity.
