Sleep was a luxury in the concentration camp. It wasn't uncommon to wake up and find your bunking partner dead. We were all cramped up in small spaces full of lice and diseases. I didn't mind the mice and insects that were on constant move. I was used to them. But no matter how many nights I spent in the camp, I just couldn't get used to the cries and wails of people, both living and dead. No matter how many deaths I had seen, I still got teary eyed when I saw the lifeless bodies. Mostly mangled but very rarely untouched. I had often been floored with fear when I saw the desperation with which people clawed the bodies trying to find something acutely useful. The thought of being dead was a stark reality that was staring me in the face. But ironically, I was still hopeful. And I clung onto it, driving off its sweet essence, it was my last strain of sanity. The strain I should have lost when my mother and sister had been taken to the gas chamber, when three days later, all I had left was a prosthetic limb to remember my sister Libby by. I was only seven at the time and not too aware of the severity of the situation. But I knew that both my mother and Libby

aren't coming back. But the hope of being free still soared high in my heart. But this morning was different, not that it was sunny. The sun never shines in the barren land of a graveyard. But the fog around me seemed lighter. The morning though was still filled with groans and soft murmurs of faint prayers. The sirens had not gone off yet, curious I got up nudging Abel, a Polish boy who I had befriended in the short span of time here. Groaning, he swung his amputated leg around the broken frames of a bunk bed and we quietly sneaked up to the gate of our barrack. To our utter surprise the guards were still in the guard towers! My eyes met his dull ones and a grimace of a smile appeared on our chapped lips. We flung open the gates and stepped out cautiously afraid that the creak would cost us our lives. Sucking a deep breath we waited. Waited for footsteps, gunshots or a murmur. The silence was like a veil that was daring us to try and lift it. We roamed about the bunks for a short while swiftly sneaking up to the iron gates of the camp, that to our dismay were still locked. In the distance we heard the footfalls on a station. There in the fog we saw a soldier

ride up to the gate. He wore a red star. RUSSIAN! The soldier was Russian! Abel pushed me back uncertainly and we both staggered. "The war is over. You are free. But you can't leave the camp right now." He then pointed his rifle at the padlock and shot it. "The doctors and food arrive in an hour." Oh, what joy it was hearing those words. I remember running off with Abel as fast as our skinny legs could carry us through the camp. We screamed "we are free" at the top of our lungs in every language we knew till our throats became sore. Suddenly the veil lifted. Cries of joy echoed across the camp. Everybody got out of the bunkers. Those who couldn't walk, crawled out. The possibility of death suddenly ruled off. We were free. I was free. The lost gleam in their eyes returned. The wrinkles lessened. The tension relieved. I held onto Libby's prosthetic arm rubbing it slightly indent from her relentless probing at the coal of the same train that had bought us all here. Suddenly I wasn't free anymore.

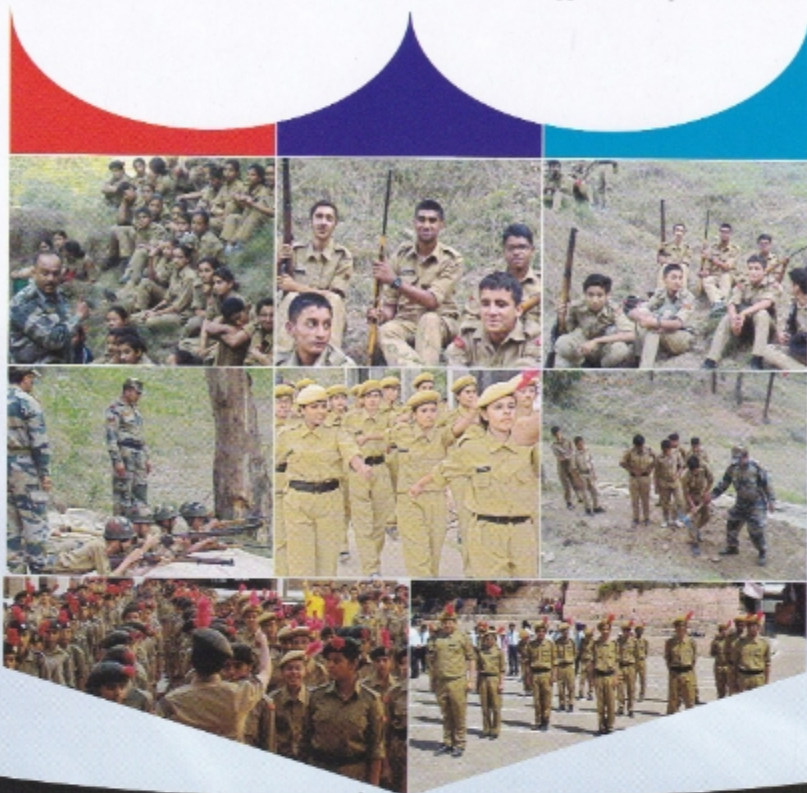

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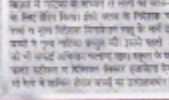
