EVENTS Of the Month

AUGUST-SEPTEMBER, 2025

CLASS 1 SINGING COMPETITION:

It took place under the guidance of our Principal, Reverend Sister Lissy, and our Vice Principal, Sister Namita as well as Ma'am Manisha. The aim behind this activity was to provide students with practical application and exposure to the legal world and a glimpse of how courts in reality work. This inculcated legal reasoning, courtroom procedures and advocacy among the participants.

The activity began with heartfelt words of welcome to the eminent Judges for the event, Reverend Sisters, teachers and students, followed by an explanation of the concept of a Moot Court and its relevance, especially for the students who are studying legal studies and plan to pursue a career in this field. The cases challenged the participants to apply their understanding of constitutional provisions, especially, the Right to Life and explore the balance between environmental protection and individual rights.

The session ended with feedback from the faculty, acknowledging the students' efforts, performance and enthusiasm, especially because it was the very first time that they participated in an activity of this kind.

Our Patroness: Mother Mary - The Mother of Jesus.

From the very early years of our foundress Mary Ward's life, love for Jesus and trust in Mother Mary formed the foundation of her Spiritual life. Her devotion to Mother Mary was so great and tenderly dear that she urged her sisters to choose her as their special patroness; love and give reverence to her with all their strength and fly to her with filial confidence for all their necessities. She desired that devotion to Mother Mary should be the badge and uniform of the Institute. Hence, from the time of Mary Ward, the Congregation of Jesus and all its members have been distinguished by a particular reverence for Mary, the Mother of Jesus. Treasuring this sacred tradition our pioneering sisters dedicated our school to Mother Mary and christened it 'St. Mary's Convent School', which today is known by the name 'St. Mary's Convent Inter College, Prayagraj.

The sacred history of St. Mary's Convent Prayagraj as recorded by Mother Frederick Schoener IBMV in the book 'Under Mary's Mantle', tells us that, The blessing of the Convent building took place in 1887 on November 21st, on the Feast of Mother Mary's Presentation. There was a procession of the students, Sisters, priests and people, lead by Bishop Dr. Pesci from St. Joseph's Cathedral to the Convent. Entering the Convent they assembled around the statue of Mother Mary, which had been placed on a table, decorated with flowers. To quote Mother Schoener:

"A new beginning was created in the history of human kind when Mary was born. In God's gracious plan she was born to Joachim and Anne in their advancing years. God chose her from the first moment of her existence in the womb of her mother Anne and filled her with the gifts needed to fulfill her special role as the mother of God. Undoubtedly, the most glorious girl child to grace this planet as "our tainted nature's solitary boast" was Mary, the mother of Jesus."

Thus Mary's birth was a momentous event in the salvation history of mankind; and in her life we see the magnificent design of God's plan, for the human race unfolding gracefully.

At the time, when God consulted Mary about becoming the mother of His Son, she surrendered her life to Him saying, "Let it be done to me according to your word", and lovingly placed herself in the service of God and mankind.

The Sacred Scriptures reveal Mary as a humble yet courageous woman whose 'Yes' to God made possible the Incarnation. Truly her greatness was in responding freely and faithfully to what God had chosen her to be, from all eternity.
