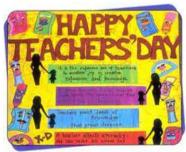




















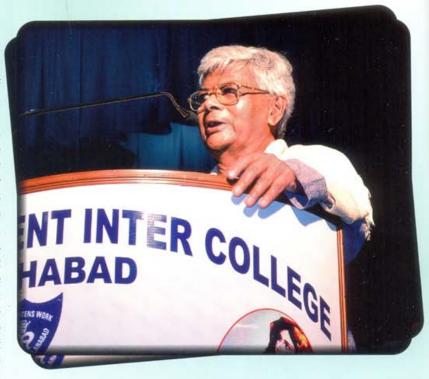




CHAIRPERSON SPEAKS

Dr. Manas Mukul Das is a retired Professor of eminence who has left an indelible mark on the history of English Department of University of Allahabad.

It was wonderful listening to young minds debating this morning. First, the gender issue and then the impact of technology on the quality of human life. There are many things involved in both these issues and it is not easy to take a stand either for or against on the two motions moved before the House earlier today. Children and teachers from many of the best schools in Allahabad are assembled here. Education should help us deliberate over the various problems that life brings before the individual and society. I



should like to share some of my thoughts and concerns with all of you present here.

There are three words in the English Language: debate, discussion and dialogue. Etymologically, the three words are different. 'Debate' derives from 'batter': to batter apart with a clash of ideas. 'Discussion' has its origin in 'quash'/'crush': to crush apart the conflict of views. 'debate' and 'discussion' both indicate a situation of conflict, 'dialogue', however, derives from 'logos', the universal moral order- order that holds the universe together into a cosmic whole. It is also the fountainhead of order, justice, and balance in society. 'Dia' means 'through'. 'Dialogue', therefore means 'through the logos': together trying to explore what is right, what is in accordance with the moral order. In a dialogue there is no opposite side. Everyone, together with everyone else, is trying to understand, through an understanding of the logos, what is the right way of thinking and acting/doing. It is a situation of togetherness, of harmony, not of conflict. How do we need to confront the problems facing society-gender discrimination, perils of advanced technology?

The problems are not easy to solve. They have many dimensions, many faces. From the flint knife and

the potter's wheel to the most advanced computer and space satellites- all is technology. Technology could perhaps be seen as the extension of human organs. The axe, the spade and the crane are extensions of the human hand; the bicycle, the car, the locomotive, of the feet; the microscope, the telescope, of the eye, and so on. For the first time in the twentieth century, technology invented a device that was an extension of the human brain. The computer can perform many functions of the brain faster than the brain itself. What will be the impact of such inventions on the future of mankind?

More than sixty years ago I was a student of the adjoining school across the wall-your brother school. We looked upon this school as our sister school. I have very fond, unforgettable memories of my school, the Cathedral, the teachers and my friends.

Education is not merely the filling of the brain with information and skills prescribed in the syllabus. A far more significant part of education is that which a child imbibes from the ethical, aesthetic, creative, emotional and intellectual atmosphere of the place where he/she is educated. These two schools have existed for 150 years educating many generations of students. We remember the wonderful teachers by the beauty of their lives. I also loved the austere beauty of the stone and exposed brick buildings. During the lunch recess, I often walked across to the cathedral. Sometimes I sat under the arches of the portico looking at the elegant Latin inscription above the huge front doors: Hic Domus Dei Et Porta Celli. Domus Dei, the House of God, the domain of the divine. Those days one could enter the Cathedral anytime through a side door always kept half open. I loved the silent beauty of the place. Every little detail remains etched in my mind: the play of light and darkness on the faces, garments and surroundings of the mute Biblical figures painted by nineteenth century Italian painters following in the tradition of earlier masters; the statues of the Madonna and Saint Joseph on the side alters; the lines and patterns showing on the polished stone surface of the pillars supporting the arches holding the vaulted roof; the workmanship on the ceiling; the candle stand holding tall candles; the altar railing; the oyster shells fixed in walls for holding holy water; the grains showing through the dark polish of the wooden pulpit, the benches and the pews; the organ pipes rising tall above the railing of the choir stand on the mezzanine floor at the back of the church; the echoes of the smallest sounds, even of the human breath, reverberating and filling the entire space within the Cathedral. I loved the silence of the place and that silence not only pervaded the space of the Cathedral but also the whole mind and therefore, all space. I attended many church services and masses but I related most profoundly with the Cathedral when I was absolutely alone there. Then its space became the space of my mind and its silence, a living silence within. In the stillness of those moments there was great beauty. Later in life, that stillness, that silence opened the gateways to many other silences.

Just before I retired from the University in 2002, a deeply questioning and authentically searching student asked me whether the education that was being given by our Universities, schools and colleges were helping students understand relationship with all things and whether or not it nurtured the creative faculty of the brain. Twelve years have passed and we are still exploring the process which can give birth to a mind that knows relationship and is creative. The key perhaps lies in the experience of silence. The silence of the mind is the field of dialogue, understanding and creativity.

Can we have an education to nurture such silent, dialoguing, creative minds?

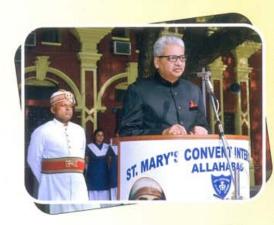

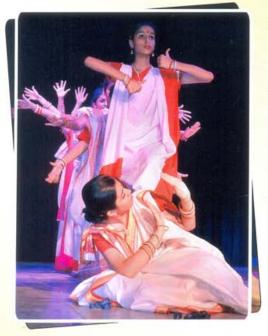
Reports

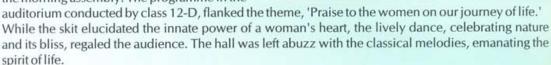

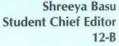
The sisters were greeted by the entire school the morning assembly. The programme in the

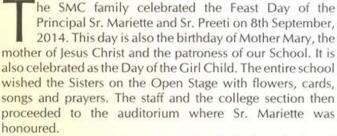

daughter Navinanshu, who left us sixteen years ago, but remains always close to my heart. At this moment I would also like to remember, with gratitude, Sr. Christina, the then principal of St. Mary's Convent Inter College, who was kind enough to visit our family in 1998, along with her colleagues, to console us and also offered to create an award in the name of our daughter.

Let me congratulate Anindita Gujarati for having excelled in high school mathematics, in her college, and pray to God that she continues to get success in whatever she chooses to do in her life. She secured 99% marks in mathematics. I also take this opportunity to congratulate all the girls, of all the classes, who have received awards and excelled in other subjects and events organized by the college.

As the Navinanshu Memorial Award concerns the excellence in Mathematics. I wish to make the budding mathematicians of this college, aware of the highest award in Mathematics, given to any individual in the world. This award is popularly known as the 'Fields Medal' and is given every four years in the 'Biggest International Meet in Mathematics, called 'International Congress of Mathematicians-'ICM'.

Dear Students, I wish to draw your attention to the important fact that our country has no Fields Medalist in 78 years of its history. Born in Canada, American Professor at Princetan University Manjul Bhargav of Indian Origin, is one of four recipients of the 'Field Medals', awarded in Seoul, South Korea, this year. Thus he has become the first person of the Indian origin to get this honour in 78 years of its history.

Every discipline is equally important, equally challenging and equally rewarding. What you need to do is to listen to your conscience and try to explore, within yourself, the discipline you are most comfortable with and which you wish to study and pursue. God has gifted each child with some talent or the other, you have to just find it out during your school days. But for this you will have to work hard on each and every subject, without ignoring or discriminating any one. Sincere advice from your teachers and parents, must be kept in mind.

Lastly I wish to bring to your notice that you are all very privileged to be here, in this wonderful environment and thus you have great opportunity to prepare and equip yourself for the challenges in life, under the able guidance of your teachers. You should keep in mind that there are thousands of children, who don't get into schools like yours, and even millions who don't afford to go to schools at all. Therefore you have also a great responsibility towards your those brothers and sisters, who are deprived of proper education and consequently deprived of all the opportunities, you may have. You should have sympathetic attitude towards them and earnest desire to do something for their betterment in life.

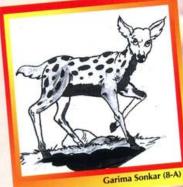

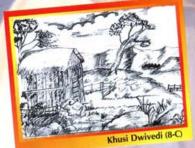

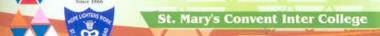

riends of Mary Ward he first international meeting of 'Friends of Mary Ward' was organized at Loyola -Azpeitia in Spain. It was a three day programme i.e. from 7th to 9th of August 2014. Seventy six member from all over the world attended the conference. The General Superior of the Congregation of Jesus - Sr. Jane, explained to us how Mary Ward was not very sure of what was God's will for her. Later on , with the help of the three key 'Graces' Mary Ward knew exactly what she had to do. She understood absolutely clearly and without any doubt that her group of companions and she must form an institute based on the constitutions of the Society of Jesus.

Sr. Jane highlighted three key phrases in the Just soul, each associated with a particular virtue-First- the virtue of freedom -that of referring all to God, being in right relationship Second-the virtue of justice - being in right relationship with other people, whether near or far, and of being in right relationship with our world and with creation. Third – the virtue of sincerity – being in right relationship with oneself, being such as we appear and appearing such as we are, which means transparency. Mother General also spoke about 'love' - firstly love for God and stemming from that, the importance of our relationships with each other. She mentioned that the quality of our lives is directly related to, and dependent on, the quality of our relationships because, in the end, those are the things that endure in our lives and give them value.

On the second day we were asked to prepare and present - Power Point Presentations. A secondary position in the society entails this deep-seated patriarchal mindset. Ordered subjugation has become an unwritten code, unflinching obedience- a recognized principle.

It is time we come out of our cocoons of passivity to take charge of the situation. The moment we vanquish our reluctance to initiate change, the moment we win the battle against our inherent insecurities, a new India is born. The moment we consider our mother no less than our father, the moment we refuse to succumb to any sort of injustice meted out to us, a new India is born.

The tide of change awaits our shores. If we embrace it, we shall have laid the foundation of a changed world. It is rightly said, a woman is like a tea bag. It's only in hot water that you realise how strong she is.

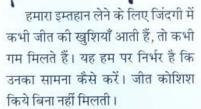
The waters are hot, the time is right. Let us show them our real strength.
