
### Children's Day


















### Reflections







Through different teaching activities we provide them an atmosphere, where our little minds develop imagination skills and become confident about their abilities.


Learning becomes fun and the concepts they learn through the activities are retained in their minds. They develop the skills which are needed to be creative, in an enjoyable manner.

### 50th Anniversary of Moon Landing

पीढ़ी अंतराल को समाज के प्रत्येक क्षेत्र में प्रत्येक पहलू में देखा जा सकता है, किन्तु इसकी नींव समाज में इकाई परिवार से ही पड़नी शुरू हो जाती है। जिससे पारिवारिक कलह और तनाव का जन्म होता है। लेकिन सहज मानवीय—अभिव्यक्तियों को पीढ़ी—अंतराल की श्रेणी में नहीं रखा जा सकता। किसी अबोध बालक का किसी अपरिचित प्रौढ़ के गोद में जाने से मना कर देना पीढ़ी—अंतराल नहीं कहा जा सकता। समाज में माता—पिता प्रतिबंधों और अनुशासन के प्रतीक माने जाते हैं। यह कुछ सीमा तक तो उचित माना जा सकता है, किन्तु आवश्यकता से अधिक अप्रासंगिक प्रतिबंध और गैर—तार्किक अनुशासन समाजिक प्राणी के भीतर साहस और अवज्ञा की सहज भावनाओं का निर्माण कर देती है, क्योंिक वह भी बिना संघर्ष के अपनी स्वीकृति चाहता है। अतः जीवन में नई स्फूर्ति के लिए यह आवश्यक है कि नूतन—पुरातन का स्थान ले। लोगों को समय के साथ खुद को बदलना होगा जिससे कि वो बच्चों की बातों को आसानी से समझ सके और बच्चों को भी बड़ी पीढ़ी को अपनी बात समझानी चाहिए और उनकी बात भी समझनी चाहिए क्योंिक समय के साथ संस्कार नहीं बदलते हैं। हम सब को मिलकर इस पीढ़ी अंतराल को खत्म करने का प्रयास करना चाहिए।




### वृक्षा रोपण

## कारगिल विजय दिवस

कारिंगल विजय दिवस स्वतंत्र भारत के लिए एक महत्वपूर्ण दिवस है। इसे हर साल 26 जुलाई को मनाया जाता है। कारिंगल युद्ध के 20 साल पूरे हो चुके हैं। पाकिस्तान के साथ दो पूर्ण युद्ध के बाद यह एक सीमित युद्ध था। यह लगभग 3 महीने चला। पाकिस्तान के ऑपरेशन कोह—ए—पैमा का जवाब भारत ने ऑपरेशन विजय से दिया था। इस युद्ध का एक परिणाम यह हुआ कि पाकिस्तान में एक बार फिर लोकतंत्र खत्म हो गया था। पाकिस्तान के कोह—ए—पैमा या ऑपरेशन कारिंगल का मुख्य उद्देश्य कश्मीर और लद्दाख के लिंक को खत्म करना था। ऑपरेशन कोह—ए—पैमा की तैयारी पूरी तरह से पाकिस्तानी सेना के तत्कालिन अध्यक्ष परवेज मुशर्रफ ने की थी, जिसकी जानकारी पाकिस्तान के बड़े टॉप जैनरलों को नही थी। दिसम्बर 1998 से ही इन अधिकारियों ने भारतीय इलाकों में पाकिस्तानी सैनिकों और आतंकियों को भेजना शुरू कर दिया था। घुसपैठियों के नियोजित रणनीति के अंतर का पता चलने के बाद भारतीय सेना को अहसास हो गया कि हमले की योजना बहुत बड़े पैमाने पर किया गया है। इसके बाद भारत सरकार ने ऑपरेशन विजय से 2,00,000 सैनिकों को भेजा। यह युद्ध अधिकारिक रूप से 26 जुलाई 1999 को समाप्त हुआ। इस युद्ध के दौरान 527 सैनिकों ने अपने जीवन का बलिदान दिया।
