Word of the day

Laconic

The word laconic means "using very few words" and can be used to describe a person, a speech or even a writing style. The usage of the word has come down relatively, following the highs it experienced up until the 19th Century.

The word, which can also be used to express ideas such as "concise" and "abrupt", has an interesting etymology. Laconic derives from the place Laconia – the district around Sparta in southern Greece in ancient times. The inhabitants of Laconia famously cultivated this skill of conveying much by saying just a few words, thus giving laconic its meaning.

The following example illustrates it perfectly. When Philip of Macedon (King of the kingdom of Macedon) threatened the people with, "If I enter Laconia, I will raze Sparta to the ground," the Spartans' reply was, "If." Little said, much conveyed!

Usage: Her replies might be laconic, but it doesn't mean she isn't paying attention to the conversation.


