

1. Glow-in-the-dark coin

In 2017, the Royal Canadian Mint released a glow-in-the-dark coin for circulation to commemorate Canada's 150th birthday. Called a "toonie", the \$2 coin features boaters looking up at the aurora borealis. In the dark when lights are turned off, the northern lights scene depicted on the coin will glow turquoise. This was the first circulation coin to glow in the dark in the world.

Japanese square watermelons are more ornamental than they are tasty. As they are harvested much before they ripen, they are often inedible. But how are they grown? When the fruit starts growing on the vine, it is covered by a large, strong, cube-shaped box and the fruit assumes the shape of the box on maturity. It is said that these watermelons occupy limited refrigerator space and can be stacked up and stored easily unlike the natural variety.
