



IN CONVERSATION WITH FR. Anishraj, SJ

Q.Could you share some details about yourself and your family? What inspired you to join the Society of Jesus?

Fr. I am from Tamil Nadu and come from a simple, middle-class family. My father is a fisherman, and my late mother was a homemaker. I have a sister who is married and settled in Saudi Arabia with her family. Despite our hand-to-mouth existence, my childhood was filled with happiness and warmth. My mother was a deeply pious and prayerful woman who nurtured a spiritual atmosphere in our home. The disciplined life of my parents inspired both my sister and me to live up to their expectations. I fondly remember how the people in our village would use our names as examples while guiding or reprimanding their children.

My strong inclination toward prayer and my simple lifestyle led me to actively participate in various church activities. I was always fascinated by the life of a priest, and this innocent childhood admiration gradually turned into a deep-seated desire to become one. As a child, I often heard stories of St. Francis Xavier and the miracles he performed, which left a lasting impression on me. At the time, I did not realize that he was a Jesuit. However, I aspired to be like him. As I grew older, I came to learn about the Jesuits and the immense respect they commanded among the people due to their missionary work. This realization awakened a strong calling within me—to follow in their footsteps and serve as a missionary, bringing hope and aid to those in need. This conviction ultimately led me to join the Society of Jesus.

Q. How do you see the school evolving in the next five years?

Fr.: Growth is a continuous journey, not a destination. I have witnessed tremendous progress in our school since my time here as a brother. Over the next five years, I envision our school transforming into an epicentre of academic excellence, moral integrity, and holistic education. I aim to see greater integration of technology in the teaching-learning process, making education more interactive, accessible, and innovative.

At the same time, it is essential to remain deeply rooted in our values, shaping students who are not only intellectually competent but also socially responsible and spiritually grounded. I want to foster an inclusive environment where differences are embraced and appreciated, allowing us to learn from one another. Additionally, I hope to see stronger collaboration among students, teachers, and parents, ensuring that our school continues to nurture well-rounded individuals who contribute meaningfully to society.

Q. As a leader, how do you stay motivated and focused on your goals?

Fr: As a leader, my motivation comes from my faith and the belief that my work is part of a larger mission. Daily prayer and reflection help me stay centered and focused on my purpose. I also find inspiration in the progress and success of my students, as well as in the dedication of my fellow teachers and staff. I believe it is unwise to take oneself too seriously—no one is invincible. We all share a common mission, and collaboration with trustworthy people who share the same vision strengthens my resolve. Even the most talented and intelligent individuals make mistakes, while sometimes the simplest and most humble people achieve extraordinary things. Anyone can complete tasks, but it is not just about getting work done—it is the integrity and sincerity with which we do them that truly matter. This belief keeps me grounded. I try to set clear, achievable goals and constantly remind myself that the ultimate aim is to serve and uplift others. The challenges we face only strengthen our determination to lead by example and guide the community toward our shared objectives.

Q. If you could give a piece of advice to students, teachers, and parents, what would it be?

Fr: To students: Work hard, stay curious, and never lose sight of your values. Be compassionate toward your parents, teachers, and fellow students. Education is not just about gaining knowledge but about becoming a person of integrity and kindness.

To teachers: Remember that you are shaping the future. Teach with dedication, inspire through your actions, and continue to learn and grow alongside your students. Never stop learning—whether from your students, colleagues, or new experiences.

To parents: Be present in your children's lives, support them, and trust the educational process. Your involvement and encouragement are crucial to their success.

A child's education is a partnership between students, teachers, and parents. When we work together, we create an environment where every child can thrive.

Q.When you transfer to a new school after some time, do you struggle to adapt to the new environment?

Fr: Biologically, our bodies and minds are wired to resist change. We tend to get comfortable with the status quo, whether it is good or, surprisingly, even if it is bad. However, as the ancient Greek philosopher Heraclitus aptly put it, "Change is the only constant." Embracing this reality can be liberating, allowing us to adapt, grow, and evolve in the face of life's inevitable transformations. Yes, transitioning to a new school comes with its challenges, but I see these as opportunities for growth and learning, offering a fresh perspective. Every school has its own culture, traditions, and community dynamics, along with its own sociological uniqueness. It takes time to understand and adapt. Building trust and rapport with new students, teachers, and parents is a priority for me in such situations. However, my faith and experience guide me through these changes. I approach each new assignment with an open mind and a willingness to learn from others. The diversity of these experiences enriches my perspective and strengthens my commitment to my mission of education and service.












INTER HOUSE SPORTS ACTIVITIES (CLASSES VI TO VIII)

POSTER MAKING: PROMOTING CREATIVITY






QUIZ CONTEST: A BATTLE OF BRILLIANCE
