An Interview with the New Finance Controller, Fr. Arun Panackal, S.J.



XT : Good morning Father 1 Congratulations on taking up this new role of the Finance Controller. We would like to ask you about your feelings and apprehensions?

Fr. Arun : Thank you very much. First of all, stepping into the role of Finance Controller at St. Xavier's Senior Secondary School, Deihi, fills me with a mix of emotions-excitement, humility, and a deep sense of responsibility. As a Jesuit priest, my primary calling has always been to serve, educate, and guide others in faith. Now, I find myself entrusted with an aspect of administration that is both crucial and complex-overseeing the financial stewardship of this esteemed institution.

At first glance, finance and mission may seem like separate realms. Yet, as I reflect on this responsibility, I realize that financial management is not merely about numbers; it is about ensuring that our resources are aligned with our mission of holistic education.

Every budget decision, every financial policy, and every allocation of funds must be made with the vision of serving our students, supporting our educators, and upholding the values of justice, integrity, and care for the marginalized. Of course, this new responsibility comes with its share of apprehensions. The world of financial planning and institutional administration is intricate, requiring both prudence and foresight. I recognize the challenges of balancing budgets while ensuring that no student is deprived of quality education due to financial constraints. The tension between financial sustainability and mission-driven generosity is real, but I trust that with discernment, collaboration, and God's grace, I will navigate these challenges wisely.

In this journey, I am reminded of St. Ignatius of Loyola's wisdom - "Act as if everything depended on you, but trust as if everything depended on God." This Ignatian principle reassures me that while I must be diligent, strategic, and transparent in my role, ultimate trust must always rest in divine providence. I also draw strength from the Jesuit tradition of discernment and collaboration. I am not alone in this mission. With the support of my fellow Jesuits, school administrators, teachers, and staff, I am confident that we can work together to ensure financial decisions serve our larger educational and spiritual purpose.

As I embark on this new chapter, I embrace both the challenges and the opportunities it brings. I pray for wisdom, courage, and humility to steward our resources in a way that reflects our commitment to excellence, service, and Justice. I always pray that this role deepens my formation and, in turn, helps me contribute meaningfully to the greater glory of God.

XT : Kindly tell us about your schooling and higher education?

Fr. Arun : I was born and brought up in Kerala. After my high school education, I joined the Society of Jesus of the Delhi Province. I had my senior secondary education at St. Philomena's College, Mysore, and my bachelor's degree at St. Xavier's College, Ranchi. For my postgraduate degree in philosophy, I was sent to Loyola College Chennai. It was a privilege for me to do my B.Th. at Gregorian University, Rome, Italy. Thereafter, I was ordained priest in 2019. After a brief service of two years in Delhi, I went to St. Joseph's College of Commerce, Bengaluru, to do my post graduation in commerce with a specialisation in finance and taxation. I also hold two postgraduate diplomas: one in Human Resource Management and the other in Marketing Management.

XT : We would be delighted to know about your role and responsibilities.

Fr. Arun : My roles and responsibilities are as follows: Overseeing the school's financial health, I need to prepare, monitor, and manage budgets. I must ensure that funds are allocated efficiently to support the school's academic and administrative needs. There is a need for Financial Compliance & Transparency in my job. My office is expected to ensure adherence to accounting standards and government regulations and make sure that Jesuit institutional policies are met in all the decisions. There should be an equilibrium in managing school expenses while balancing quality education with financial prudence. It is my responsibility to work closely with the principal, Jesuit leadership,



teachers, and administrative staff to align finances with the school's vision. Being a Jesuit school, there is a more fabulous call to support scholarships and financial aid programs to assist needy students.

XT : How would you describe your journey at Xavier's so far?

Fr. Arun : My journey as Finance Controller of St. Xavier's Senior Secondary School, Delhi, has been both enlightening and challenging. In the initial months, I found myself navigating a steep learning curve, understanding the intricacies of financial planning, compliance, and resource allocation within an educational institution. While numbers and budgets were not unfamiliar to me, the responsibility of ensuring sustainability while upholding the school's mission of inclusive education brought new perspectives. One of the most rewarding aspects has been working collaboratively with school leadership and administrative staff. Their dedication to the school's mission has been a source of inspiration, reinforcing the idea that financial decisions should always be made in the service of education and formation. As we are going through a tough phase, especially after COVID with regard to finance, it is pretty challenging to balance our values with the various needs of the school. But God has always been gracious in our journey, always opening another door when one door is closed. Challenges have been inevitable. Rising costs, maintaining infrastructure, and ensuring timely financial aid to deserving students have required creative solutions and adaptability. Yet, through discernment, patience, and a reliance on ignatian principles, I have grown more confident in my role. Every decision, no matter how small it is, is an opportunity to serve and contribute to the greater good.

XT : Do you have any message for the Xaverians?

Fr. Arun : As Finance Controller of St. Xavier's Senior Secondary School, Delhi, I want to assure you that every financial decision made is with your best interests in mind. Our mission is to provide you with an education that not only nurtures your intellect but also shapes your character, preparing you to be a man and woman for others.
