Principal's Message

My maiden visit to USA was very educative. The driver of the bus in Kennedy Space Center (KSC) NASA was a grandmother. She greeted the students very warmly. "Hey kids, I am reminded of my school days as a teacher." She told us that she learned to drive bus after retirement. She chose this job because as a driver and a guide in KSC she can arouse the curiosity, thirst for knowledge amidst visitors and keep alive the teacher in her. In another incident, I met a senior citizen. He appeared to me a person of Indian origin. Probably his body had weathered many storms and was no longer flexible. He silently went about cleaning the restroom in the airport. I was moved to help him, but in an alien land I did not dare to do so. I can narrate many incidents that made me question my outlook of life. I comprehended that people out there are disciplined, have 'work culture' (sweat of the brow earn livelihood) and 'work ethics' (honesty and integrity in the chosen undertaking). Probably, this distinguishes them from us and helped them to build a strong nation. Work is an expression of inner self, talents, capabilities and capacities. For students, work is study. Disciplined study habits and reflection on life experiences leads to higher knowledge. This knowledge is power. In the highly technological age, as part of learning: adapting to and manipulating the machine is essential, yet traditional method of storing things in memory (like poems, couplets, facts, formulas, dates, idioms, tables etc) is absolutely necessary. Many students memory is short and they seem to possess no long term memory. They just study for exams and not for life. Students need to develop long term memory and for this present evaluation methods need urgent changes. There are few observations that trouble me often. Many students want achievements, recognition, high grades and quick results. Those who are employed hope to work minimum and reap greater pay! And every one is desperately counting the holidays. I am reminded of a line from our school song: 'we get what we put in'. Can we ask this question: Do I really deserve what I get? What I get, are they just results of policy decisions? The changing scenario of the digital generation is a paradox: wanting instant gratification without involvement in the process of becoming and yet aspiring for that with greater efficiency all things will somehow work out. As Xaverian we should develop passion for EXCELLENCE, putting little more than what is expected. Let us be the change we want to see out there. I hope the views and ideas expressed in this magazine are one way of 'standing up' to be counted. My sincere thanks and well wishes to all the writers, editorial team and all who helped to bring out in this edition of Xavier Times. Bible says: Faith is the assurance of the things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen (Heb.11:1). I have full faith as members of this great institution that we will contribute our might in the nation building exercise by the value that we create with disciplined life style, work culture and ethical practices. So you can imagine my excitement as I set off for my walk in my newly acquired footwear the next day. About 20 minutes into the walk, one of my shoe laces came undone. And as I stopped to tie my laces I didn't think too much about it but when it happened a second time I sensed that there might be a problem with those rounded smooth nylon laces in my new shoes. Have you faced a similar problem? Sounds familiar?

The shoe laces coming off soon became a regular recurring phenomena. My wife and I would be walking along talking about the day gone by and the day ahead when I would discover that my laces have magically slipped come undone and I would find myself interrupting the flow of the conversation and the walk to tie my shoelaces. I

began to wonder why the Nike folks couldn't provide better laces given the high price they were charging. I even thought of writing to the CEO to share my predicament. Meanwhile I could sense my wife's irritation mounting too. As I sat there on the pavement to tie my shoelaces yet again I would bet she was thinking 'Why couldn't his parents teach him to tie his shoelaces right?'

Determined to set it right, and yet unsure of what I should do, I googled it. "How to tie shoelaces?"Bingo! Google quickly enlightened me that there are in fact two ways of tying shoe lace. Congratulations Dear Jubilarians



The Head Boy (JUNIOR)





A Visit to Council of Scientific and Industrial Research

On 4th November 2016, 41 students from class 11A, along with Mrs. Nazneen Chowdhry, visited the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research, Delhi University. There the students received information about the various ongoing researches in the field of Biology.

First, we studied about Pharmacogenomics which aims at decreasing the total cost of healthcare by creating drugs targeted to cure the disease at the gene level. Next, we studied about Spirometry which is a simple breathing test that measures lung volumes and allows for diagnosis of air flow obstruction. We also learnt about adulteration and how to detect urea in adulterated milk. We found that none of the companies in the market today provide unadulterated milk! Next, we witnessed DNA Isolation and later divided ourselves into two teams to compete for 'DNA Decoding'. After that we learnt about Waste Management and how Bioplastic has successfully been developed which is easily degraded by bacteria. Finally we studied about some common diseases like Rheumatoid Arthritis and Diabetes.

Then, after a short break, we returned to the school by 11:30 a.m. We learnt a lot from this visit and would like to express our heartfelt gratitude to Fr Principal, Sir Devasia and Nazneen ma'am for providing us with this opportunity and would like to request them to encourage more such visits.
