SHEPHERD SPEAKS INSTRUMENTUM LABORIS

और मरिया का सहगामी जीवन



इस तीसरे सहस्राब्दी में कलीसिया को "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission" अर्थात एक सहगामी कलीसिया के लिए: एकता, सहभागिता और प्रेरित कार्य के मार्ग पर आने की चुनौती देकर संत पिता फ्रांसिस ने कॅथोलिक कलीसिया के लिए एकसाथ कार्य करने का एक परियोजना प्रस्तावित किया है। इस परियोजना को 9 से 10 ऑक्टोबर 2021 को रोम में और 17 ऑक्टोबर 2021 हर एक स्थानिय कलीसिया में उद्घाटन किया गया। प्रादेशिक स्तर पर अनेक महिनो के विचारविनिमय के बाद ऑक्टोबर 2024 को रोम में धर्माध्यक्षीय धर्मसभा का 16 वे सामान्य सर्वसाधारण सभा के रूप मे परिणत होगा। इसी बीच संत पिता फ्रान्सिस ने अखंड वैश्विक कलीसीया कि राय लेने के बाद Instrumentum Laboris नामक एक प्रांरभिक दस्तावेज को प्रकाशित किया है और इसे 3 भागो में बांटा गया है।

- 1. एकता को प्रसारित करो
- 2. प्रेरित कार्य में सहजिम्मेदार बनो
- 3. सहभागिता, शासन और अधिकार



यह दस्तावेज धर्मसभा के प्रथम सत्र का कार्यसूत्र है जो ऑक्टोबर 2023 को शुरू होगा। पवित्र मरियम सहगामी कलीसिया की आदर्श माता है और इसीलिए इस दस्तावेज का विश्लेषण मरियम के जीवन को मद्देनजर रखते हुए हमे करना चाहिए। Instrumentum Laboris का पहला भाग हमें एकता को प्रसारित करने की चुनौती देती है। यह एकता न्याय, सत्य, विस्थापितों का कल्याण, साझा कल्याण, आंतरपंथीय एवं आंतरधर्मीय संवाद और स्थानिय कलीसिया के सहकार्य पर आधारित होना चाहिए (Instrumentum Laboris B 1)। मरियम स्वयं मिम्न देश में विस्थापित थी और इसी संदर्भ में मरियम हम सबको विस्थापितों के आँसू के साथ एकरूप होकर हर एक विस्थापित के साथ सहगमन करने का न्योता देती है। मरियम सत्य और न्याय की दीपस्तंभ है और मरियम का स्तुतीगान इस तथ्य को अधिक बल देता है।

Instrumentum Laboris का द्वितीय भाग मिशन अथवा प्रेरित कार्य में सहजिम्मेदार बनने का न्योता देती हैं। लोकधर्मियों का और विशेष रूप से महिलाओं का कृपाउपहार कलीसिया में योग्य रिती से उपयोग करने के लिए और उसी तरह याजक वर्ग एवं लोकधर्मियों की साझा बाप्तिसमाई बुलाहट का उल्लेख करता है। सबसे महत्वपूर्ण बात यह है की विविध स्थानीय कलीसिया में सहजिम्मेदारी और साझा जिम्मेदारी उत्पन्न करने की प्रेरणा यह दस्तावेज हमें देती है (Instrumentum Laboris B 2)। सहजिम्मेदारी के नजरिये से यदि हम मरियम के जीवन का विश्लेषण करेंगे तो हमें समझ में आएगा की मरियम ने अपने प्रेरित कार्य को येसु के प्रेरित कार्य के साथ एकरूप किया और उसे पूर्णत्व की ओर ले गई और इसीलिए येसु हमारे मुक्तिदाता है और मरियम हमारी सहमुक्तिदायिनी है.

Instrumentum Laboris का तृतीय भाग सहभागिता, शासन और अधिकार के संदर्भ को सुस्पष्ट करता है। पिवत्र आत्मा के मदद से प्रभेद करके एक सेवक नेता के रूप में कार्य करने का न्योता दस्तावेज देती है। इसी प्रकार से सहगामीत्व और मंडलीय व्यवस्था का योग्य उपयोग कलीसिया की संरचना को मजबूत करने का न्योता देती है (Instrumentum Laboris B 3)। जब मिरयम को ईश्वर की माता बनने की बुलाहट मिली तब मिरयम ने पिवत्र आत्मा की मदद से योग्य प्रभेद किया और प्रभु की ईच्छा को महत्व देकर वे एक सेवक नेता बन गई। काना के विवाह समारोह में हम इस तथ्य को स्पष्ट रूप से देख सकते है। मिरयम उस पिरवार की पीडा को पहचानती है और इसीलिए निवन हव्वा के नाते वह निवन आदम येसु के समक्ष मध्यस्थी करती है और येसू उन्हें नया दाखरस (नया जीवन) प्रदान करते है। मिरयम योसेफ के साथ कठिन पिरिस्थिती में भी सहगमन करती है और हमें मंडलीय व्यवस्था का महत्व समझाती है।

प्रेरित कार्य और मिरयम

येसू के वंशवृक्ष मे मरियम का उल्लेख है क्योंकी ख्रिस्त के प्रेरित कार्य में सहभागी होकर उन्होंने मुक्ती के इतिहास मे महत्वपूर्ण स्थान प्राप्त किया है। मरियम ईशमाता बनने के लिए सहमत होती है और येसु के साथ सहगमन करती है, ख्रिस्त के दुःखभोग और क्रूसमरण में एकरूप होकर सभी मिशनरी अथवा धर्मप्रचारको का आदर्श बनती है और इसलिए उनके प्रेरित कार्य की चरम सीमा थी उनका पवित्र उदग्रहण।

तीर्थयात्री कलीसिया अपने स्वभावधर्म के अनुसार मिशनरी है (Ad Gentes 2)। प्रेरित कार्य गतिशील क्षितिज में संस्थापित है जहाँ से हम सहगामी कलीसिया के बारे में विचार करते है और जो हमे परमानंद का प्रचोदन प्रदान करता है। इसके द्वारा हमे मुक्त होकर जीवन का भी त्याग करके दुसरों के कल्याण के बारे सोचने की प्रेरणा मिलती है।

इस धर्मसभाई वर्ष मे मिरयम हम सबको उत्तम मिशनरी बनने की बुलाहट दे रही हैं। माता मिरयम से प्रेरणा लेकर अपने बपितस्मा की बुलाहट के अनुसार खीस्त के प्रेरित कार्य में सहभागी होने की कृपा माँगे।

Before the school reopened on June 29th, the principal and 35 members of the staff met to prepare for the new academic year and the inaugural programme for the school. The academic session was marked by a variety of activities at the institution. The school was blessed with heavenly guidance and protection for the new term on July 1st, 2022. Mrs. Sonia Biden served as the Resource Person for the Teacher's Orientation, which was held on 5 July. On July 9, the School Cabinet was inaugurated, and Ministers, Parents, Captains, and Meritorious Students were honoured. Writing competitions were held for students in grades V through VIII, showcasing artistic expertise, creativity and teamwork in classrooms. Approximately 500 students from Std. 5-7 took part in the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav (75 Years of Indian Independence) celebrations.

The school administered examinations to students to assess their comprehension and learning ability. In addition, an open day was held to update parents about their child's progress. Parents were urged to engage in their children's academic advancement and on 14 November 2023, a prayer service and cultural programmes were held to commemorate Children's Day. A prayer service and cultural programmes were held on Teacher's Day to show appreciation and gratitude to teachers. English elocutions were held for pupils in grades V through XI to prepare them for public speaking. A 9-day Novena was held to celebrate the virtues of St. Joseph. 
THE FEAST OF THE SACRED HEART


EVENTS IN CHURCH 2023-24




