Greetings from the CBCI Office for Education and Culture!

Let me begin by wishing each and every one of you a very Happy Easter!

As we bring out another issue of the e-news letter from this CBCI Office for Education and Culture, I want to include in this message mainly the part of the CBCI Plenary Statement that deals with Education. The theme for the plenary assembly of Bishops gathered at the St. John's National Academy of Medical Sciences in Bangalore from the 2nd to the 9th of March 2016, was, "Response of the Catholic Church to the Present day Challenges in India." Various concerns confronting the Church in India was studied and responded to. The final statement that deals with education is given below:

4.5. THE EDUCATION APOSTOLATE

Educational Institutions need to rise above the maintenance mode to impart holistic education with a heart for the poor and the marginalized instead of merely creating parallel power centres or finding solace in campus glory. The CBCI Education Policy has clearly stated: "The Catholic educational institutions are to provide inclusive and holistic education especially for the marginalized and girls enabling them to live life to the full and responsibly, thus transforming the individual and society" (AICEP 2007).

Proposals:

1. *Having recourse to legal action when Constitutional provisions are violated and the appointment / approval of staff, issue of Minority certificate, grant in aid, scholarships and other support systems are denied.*
2. *Promoting Faith formation of Christian students and value education, reaching out to those living in "social and geographical periphery" and providing quality education in the slums and rural areas.*
3. *Recognizing the need to positively promote higher education institutions, to form persons of character and conviction, capable of delivering quality leadership and administrative service upholding the constitutional values and the socialistic, secular and democratic character of our country (National Education Coordinators' Meet, 18 December 2015).*
4. *Networking with local, district and state leaders and administrators and befriending people of the neighbourhood and all people of good will to ensure administrative autonomy proper to the Minority institutions.*
5. *Providing educational opportunities, especially to the socially backward and girl children, and ensuring administrative transparency, financial accountability and participatory management.*

Needless to say, it will be our endeavor to consider with utmost seriousness the above statement regarding our education ministry that comes from the highest Church authority in India and ensure that we put into practice the proposals that have been drawn up and forwarded to us. Let us all work in a united manner to ensure that the educational services that we impart is truly inclusive and holistic.

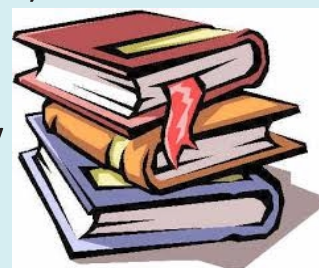



REPORT OF PROGRAMMES CONDUCTED BY THE CBCI OFFICE FOR EDUCATION AND CULTURE

World Congress on Catholic Education convened by the Sacred Congregation for catholic Education and the International Office of catholic Education, Rome: 18th-22nd Nov. 2015

Participated along with the Chairman Bishop, Rt. Rev. Joshua Mar Ignathios, at the Global Congress of Catholic Education at the Vatican organized by the Sacred Congregation for catholic Education and the International Office for catholic Education (OIEC). The Congress discussed and presented papers regarding Identity and Mission of Catholic Education, Challenges and difficulties, Training of trainers and encountering the Challenges with rene passion. The Congress was attended by 2500 delegates from all countries in two different venues viz. at the Focolare hall near Castle Gondolfo and at the Consolata auditorium on Via Consolazione at the Vatican. The last session was presided over by Pope Francis himself who addressed the Congress jointly at Paul VI auditorium at the Vatican itself. The Congress as a whole was beneficial in assessing the challenges involved in the ministry of Catholic Education on a world wide basis and served to look at the various solutions and resume the ministry of education with added enthusiasm and renewd passion to fulfill the teaching mission of the Church.



2 days' Visit to the Catholic Schools in Europe after the Congress to learn and get a first hand knowledge of the effectiveness or otherwise of the Teaching Mission of the catholic Church :

Knowing the processes and systems practiced in some of the Catholic Schools of Europe was the intention of the two days' (24th-25th Nov) visit to the various Primary and Secondary Catholic schools of Europe. While we had excellent learning experience of the way they conduct the Primary education which was child friendly, interactive, child centered and highly effective, the Secondary or high school education was much the same as what is done in India. But what shocked us was the way the teaching of catechism and Value education was so neglected and absent that the large part of the population was consequently becoming atheists.



Training of Diocesan Teams from the dioceses of West Bengal in Kolkata on 3rd-4th Dec. 2015:

Some 25 heads of schools and diocesan Education Directors (at least 3 from each Diocese) were trained to do the evaluation and assessment of the Catholic Educational institutions in each of the Dioceses of W. Bengal Region by Fr. Joseph Manipadam with logistical and resource material and software support from Mr. Ambrose Rajan Paul on the 3rd and 4th of December at the Archbishop's house in Kolkata. The training was basically on how to use the "All India Catholic Education Policy Handbook" that was made for the purpose of doing it in a very methodological and systematic way to evaluate the effectiveness of the implementation of the Catholic Education Policy showing indicators of implementation as well as to assess the structural, academic, operational and administrative quality of each institution. The training program was attended by the Archbishop himself and representatives from each diocese along with the Diocesan Education Directors. .



Training of Diocesan Teams from the dioceses of Jharkhand in Ranchi on 5th Dec. 2015:

Some 35 heads of schools and diocesan Education Directors (at least 3 from each Diocese) were trained to do the evaluation and assessment of the Catholic Educational institutions in each of the Dioceses of Jharkhand Region by Fr. Joseph Manipadam with logistical and resource material and software support from Mr. Ambrose Rajan Paul on the 5th of December at the Archbishop's house in Ranchi. The training was basically on how to use the "All India Catholic Education Policy Handbook" that was made for the purpose of doing it in a very methodological and systematic way to evaluate the effectiveness of the implementation of the Catholic Education Policy showing indicators of implementation as well as to assess the structural, academic, operational and administrative quality of each institution. The training program was attended by Bishop Charles Soreng and representatives from each diocese along with the Diocesan Education Directors.



Training of Diocesan Teams from the dioceses of Chattisgarh in Raipur on 7-8th Dec. 2015:

38 heads of schools and diocesan Education Directors (at least 3 to 4 from each Diocese) were trained to do the evaluation and assessment of the Catholic Educational institutions in each of the Dioceses of Chattisgarh Region by Fr. Joseph Manipadam with logistical and resource material and software support from Mr. Ambrose Rajan Paul on the 7-8th of December at the Pastoral Centre in Raipur. The training was basically on how to use the "All India Catholic Education Policy Handbook" that was made for the purpose of doing it in a very methodological and systematic way to evaluate the effectiveness of the implementation of the Catholic Education Policy showing indicators of implementation as well as to assess the structural, academic, operational and administrative quality of each institution. The training program was attended by Archbishop Victor and representatives from each diocese along with the Diocesan Education Directors. This training was preceded by the drawing up of the statutes for the Chattisgarh Christian Education Association for registering it as a registered association for which representations from other Christian denominations were also participants.



Training and Seminar for 250 Vincentian Fathers and their Staff at Angamaly in Kerala on 11th and 12th Dec. 2015 at their Provincialate.

Some 250 participants of which 30 were Vincentian Fathers and the rest were the lay staff from their Educational institutions across the state of Kerala. The training was conducted by Fr. Joseph Manipadam assisted by software and resource material prepared by Mr. Ambrose Rajan Paul from Kolkata. The sessions covered themes like Making the catholic Institutions Relevant for Today, The Efforts by the Government towards the New National Education Policy, The Proposals given by the Catholic Church to the Government towards the new National Education Policy, the Disturbing Trends in Today's Political Scenario etc. The two days' programme was well accepted. The first day was arrivals, registration and orientation sessions.



Training and Orientation programme for 150 Diocesan Education Directors and Education Coordinators of Religious Orders of Karnataka Region in Bangalore : 13th-14th Dec. 2015:

About 150 participants Diocesan Education Directors and Education Co-ordinators from the various Religious Congregations from the dioceses of Karnataka Region participated in the training programme to evaluate the implementation of the “All India catholic Education Policy” and other orientation about the forthcoming new National Education Policy and the Church’s concerns regarding the same and the suggestions presented by the Church to the Government, the CBCI Child Protection Policy etc. The programme held in the Karnataka Regional Social Service Centre, Bangalore, animated by Fr. Joseph Manipadam and Fr. Eugene Lobo was held on the 13th and 14th of December 2015. The software and logistics assistance was done by Mr. Ambrose Rajan paul



18th Dec. 2015 : A National Consult by CBCI Education Office with National Education Coordinators from Religious Congregations at the Salesian Provincial House, New Delhi:

A national level consultation was organized by the Education Office of the CBCI to get the collaboration of all the National and Provincial Coordinators of Religious Congregations concerning the implementation of the Catholic Education Policy, implementation of the CBCI Child Protection Policy and to find out ways and means of better collaboration with the Church’s Hierarchy and to discuss about the challenges concerning the new National Education Policy that is being prepared by the Government. The meeting was attended by 80 Education Coordinators of Religious Orders. The day’s programme was presided over by His Eminence Basileos Cardinal Cleemis - the President of the CBCI himself, His Grace Archbishop Albert D’Souza – Secretary General of CBCI, His Excellency Bishop Joshua Mar Ignathios – Chairman of the CBCI Office for Education and facilitated by Fr. Joseph Manipadam SDB – Secretary, CBCI Office for Education and Culture.



19th Dec. 2015 : Centre for Civil Society and Other Educational NGOs discuss the Pros and Cons of the New Education Policy of the Government in New Delhi:

Fr. Joseph Manipadam was invited to Facilitate a day long Consultation with various educational NGOs at the India Habitat Centre in New Delhi to discuss and view critically the proposed new National Education Policy that the Government was contemplating. A set of four panels with four panelists in each, presented their views followed by discussions by participants. The interactive consultation was meant to create awareness, analyze, pre-empt and be prepared to face consequences of the new National

The National Conference was also meant to see if there were any further suggestions that could be added to the already submitted suggestions from the NGO, Centre for Civil Society.

21,22 Dec. 2015: General Body Meeting of the Xavier Board of Higher Education at Christ University, Bangalore:

45 Heads and representatives of various colleges Catholic Colleges of India met together for a special General Body Meeting at the Christ University in Bangalore to further analyze and understand the mind of the Government and find out the reason why the present Government is keen on going for a new National Education Policy. Fr. Joseph Manipadam was invited to Facilitate and enumerate at a two days' Consultation with various inputs on the disturbing trends and what the proposals and suggestions from the CBCI are and what the College Associations have suggested etc. The presentations by Fr. Joseph Manipadam was followed by discussions and further proposals to the Government etc towards the new National Education Policy that the Government is contemplating. The reason for such an interactive consultation was to become aware, analyze, pre-empt and be prepared to face consequences of the new National Education Policy as and when it comes out.



7th January 2016: Initiation of the Evaluation of Implementation of the Catholic Education Policy at Gandhinagar, Gujarat:

On 7th of January 2016, 55 heads of schools and teachers attended the full day programme of training to initiate the evaluation of the implementation of the catholic Education Policy using the "AICEP Implementation Handbook" The training was conducted by Fr. Joseph Manipadam and Fr. Royston S.J in English and Gujarati languages. Other matters discussed were concerning the "CBCI Child Protection Policy" and the concerns regarding the new National Education Policy that the Government was drafting.



8th January 2016: Initiation of the Evaluation of Implementation of the Catholic Education Policy at Rajkot Bishop's House premises for the Rajkot diocese in Gujarat:

On 8th of January 2016, 125 teachers and heads of schools attended the full day programme of training to initiate the evaluation of the implementation of the catholic Education Policy using the "AICEP Implementation Handbook" The training was conducted by Fr. Joseph Manipadam and Fr. Royston S.J in English and Gujarati languages. Other topics taken up were "CBCI Child Protection Policy" and the concerns regarding the new National Education Policy that the Government was drafting. Bishop Gregary Karotempel was present and presided over the meeting during the first half.



9th January 2016: Initiation of the Evaluation of Implementation of the Catholic Education Policy at Vadodara (Baroda) diocese at Vadodara in Gujarat:

42 teachers and heads of schools participated at the full day programme of training to initiate the evaluation of the implementation of the catholic Education Policy using the “AICEP Implementation Handbook” at the Bishop's House in Vadodara. The training was conducted by Fr. Joseph Manipadam and Fr. Royston S.J in English and Gujarati languages. Other topics taken up were “CBCI Child Protection Policy” and the concerns regarding the new National Education Policy that the Government was drafting. Bishop Godfrey Rozario was present during the whole day and presided over the meeting.



9th January 2016 : Joint Visit to some of the catholic Schools of Baroda in Gujarat by CBCI National Education Secretary and the Gujarat Catholic Education Secretary:

The evening hours of the days Fr. J. Manipadam, the National Catholic Education Secretary and Fr. Royston the GEBCI Secretary were there in Baroda in Gujarat, they also visited some of the Catholic Schools to get a first hand knowledge as well as to interact with the Heads of those schools to get acquainted with the ground realities of the Catholic Education situation and matters related to the school administration and its difficulties in Gujarat.



10th January 2016: Initiation of the Evaluation of Implementation of the Catholic Education Policy at Nadiad in Gujarat for the Personnel in Educational Institutions of Nadiad and outskirts of Ahmedabad:

At Nadiad in Gujarat, 60 participants were there both Heads of Institutions and teachers to learn about how to do the evaluation of the implementation of the Catholic Education Policy, using the “AICEP Implementation Handbook”. Other matters taken up at the day-long training included “The CBCI Child Protection Policy” and concerns regarding the new National Education Policy now being drafted by the Government. The training was conducted by Fr. Royston and Fr. Joseph Manipadam. The Vicar General of the diocese was present throughout the day.



13th January 2016 : Programme for Heads of Catholic Schools of Jalandhar Diocese:



13th Jan. 2016 : One full day programme on the implementation evaluation of the Catholic Education Policy, the CBCI Child Protection Policy and concerns regarding the new National Education Policy was held at the Bishop's House in Jalandhar for 130 Heads of catholic Schools. The programme was animated by Fr. J. Manipadam of CBCI Education Office and Fr. Xavier T.C. the Diocesan Education Director.



14th January 2016 : Training Programme for Heads of Catholic Schools of Agra Diocese:



14th Jan. 2016 : A truncated training programme on the implementation evaluation of the Catholic Education Policy and the CBCI Child Protection Policy was held at the Akbar's Chapel at the Bishop's House in Agra for 70 Heads of catholic Schools. The programme was animated by Fr. J. Manipadam of CBCI Education Office. The programme was shortened due to a bereavement in the diocese.

23rd January 2016: Golden Jubilee of Mysore Diocesan Educational Society:



3000 persons, Heads of Catholic Educational institutions, Staff, Managers and three Bishops namely Archbishop Bernard Moras of Bangalore, Bishop Thomas Vazhappilly of Mysore and Bishop Francis of Shimoga attended the day long programme. The Secretary of the CBCI Office for Education, Fr. Manipadam attended as a Guest of Honour mainly to take the opportunity to impress upon the Diocesan Education Secretary and the Bishops to take initiatives to see that the institutions of the dioceses should move effectively towards implementation of the Catholic Education Policy and try and evaluate the institutions. The Bishops have agreed to do it and fixed an orientation programme for the Mysore diocesan Education personnel for the 8th of March 2016.

25th January 2016 : Programme for Implementation and Evaluation of Implementation of the All India Catholic Education Policy for representatives of various dioceses of Kerala at POC Kochi:

25th Jan. 2016 : One full day programme on the implementation and evaluation of the implementation of the Catholic Education Policy, the CBCI Child Protection Policy and concerns regarding the new National Education Policy was held at the Pastoral Orientation Centre, at Kochi in Kerala 75 Heads of Catholic Schools and Colleges from the dioceses of Kerala. The programme was animated by Fr. J. Manipadam of CBCI Education Office and Fr. Jacob George Palakkapilly, the Diocesan Education Director.



1st & 2nd February 2016 : Programme for Implementation and Evaluation of Implementation of the All India Catholic Education Policy for representatives of various dioceses North East India at Guwahati:



On 1st and 2nd February 2016, programme on the implementation and evaluation of the implementation of the Catholic Education Policy, the CBCI Child Protection Policy and concerns regarding the new National Education Policy was held at the Pastoral Orientation Centre, Guwahati for representatives from the various dioceses of the North Eastern part of India. The programme was animated by Fr. J. Manipadam of CBCI Education Office and Fr. Amalraj, the Regional Education Director.

3rd February 2016 : Programme to assess effectiveness of Implementation of the All India Catholic Education Policy from an on the spot visit and interaction with students and management of School at Sashipur in Assam:

Visited a Catholic School situated at a very remote border area of Assam near Bhutan, to assess what would be the impact of the Catholic Education Policy on a school functioning in such a place and what efforts are being made by the school management for it. Held interactive sessions with students and visited the school premises and interacted with the staff and Management. It was also noted that being a Don Bosco School, they had also taken steps to maintain the Catholic quality and the Don Bosco Charism from the Congregation's side as well.



4th, 5th February 2016 : Programme to assess effectiveness of Implementation of the All India Catholic Education Policy from an on the spot visit and interaction with students and management of School at Kumerikatta in Assam:



Visited a Catholic School situated at a very remote border area of Assam, to assess what would be the impact of the Catholic Education Policy on a school functioning in such a place and what efforts are being made by the school management for it. The students were mostly Adhivasi children. We held interactive sessions with students and visited the school premises and interacted with the staff and Management. It was also noted that being a Don Bosco School, they had also taken steps to maintain the Catholic quality and the Don Bosco Charism from the Congregation's side as well.

6th, 7th February 2016 : Programme to assess effectiveness of Implementation of the All India Catholic Education Policy from an on the spot visit and interaction with students and management of School at Barapani near Shillong in Meghalaya:

Visited along with Mr. Ambrose R. Paul a Catholic School situated on the way to Shillong in Meghalaya at a very remote area of Meghalaya, to assess what would be the impact of the Catholic Education Policy on a school functioning in such a place and what efforts are being made by the school management for it. The students were mostly Khasi children. We held interactive sessions with students and visited the school premises and interacted with the staff and Management. It was a school run by the Franciscan Brothers. The school was St Francis D'Assisi School at Mount Umber with some five hundred children.



8th,-11th February 2016 : Intense Training programme for Young Deacons who would take charge of Education Ministry in the catholic Church, at the Training Centre in Shillong



Thirteen young Deacons who would be serving as priests soon in the education Ministry of the Catholic Church in the Northeastern part of India were given intense training as to the content of the Education Policy of the Catholic Church, How to implement it methodically and how to evaluate implementation through assessment of the indicators expected to be shown etc. The training was for a few days. It was given by Fr. Joseph Manipadam of the CBCI Office for Education. It was a residential programme.

22nd February 2016 : Programme for the Diocesan Edu. Directors and Representatives of M.P Region in Bhopal:

A full day programme was conducted by Fr. Joseph Manipadam and Fr. Thomas Attummel about the implementation and Evaluation of the implementation of the catholic Education Policy at the Social Service Centre at Bhopal. 45 participants from the various dioceses of Madhya Pradesh were present. Rt. Rev Leo Cornelio, the Archbishop of Bhopal and the Education Chairman Rt. Rev. Antony Chirayath were present right through the day.
