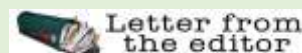

Greetings from the Office of Education and Council, CBCI !



I am extending to you the greetings of our Chairman Bishop, His Excellency Rt. Rev. Joshua Mar Ignathios, Bishop of Mavelikara and Bishop in charge of the CBCI office for Education and Culture and the two other Member Bishops, His Grace Rt. Rev. Thomas D'souza, Archbishop of Calcutta and His Grace Rt. Rev. George Antonysamy, Archbishop of Madras-Mylapore.

We are introducing this Newsletter basically to keep in touch with all of you as well as to keep you updated with anything new that may be happening regarding education that would affect our Catholic schools in the country. We will also keep you informed as to the various concerns and activities of the Office of Education and Culture, CBCI.

Right now as you may already know, with the Supreme Court verdict of 6th May 2014, exempting all minority educational institutions, aided and unaided, from the purview of the RTE, all our concerns regarding the violation of minority rights are now put to rest at least for the time being, concerning RTE. So we are now focusing once again on the important task of taking forward the "All India catholic Education Policy 2007" towards meaningful implementation to the extend of showing positive indicators of implementation in all our institutions. In fact we are giving you a report on the efforts being made in this regard in this letter. We have visited a number of Regions and Dioceses in this regard conducting training and animation programmes. In all the places we have visited, we have received utmost co-operation and help from the Bishops as well as the Regional and Diocesan Secretaries. I am so grateful to all of them. And in the coming months we will be covering many more Regions and Dioceses.

Needless to say that by implementing the Catholic Education Policy, we will also be implementing the salient features of the Statement of the Plenary Assembly held at Pala in the beginning of this year. In fact as a result of a study done at the CBCI Centre, in the middle of November, at the joint meeting of the Regional Deputy Secretaries and the CBCI Office Secretaries, we have co-related the two, and drawn up lines of action towards implementation. For all this we solicit your whole hearted cooperation and good will.

NASA PROVES THAT THE BIBLE IS TRUE

For all you scientists out there and for all the students who have had a hard time convincing these people regarding the truth of the Bible here's something that illustrates God's awesome creation and shows He is still in control.

Did you know that NASA's space programmers are busy proving what has been called 'myth' in the Bible is true? Mr. Harold Hill, President of the Curtis Engine Company in Baltimore, and a consultant in the space programmes, relates the following incident:

One of the most amazing things that God has for us today happened recently to our astronauts and space scientists at Green Belt, Maryland. They were checking out the positions of the sun, moon and planets out in space where they would be 100, and 1000 years from now. We have to know this as we do not want a satellite to collide with any of these in its orbits. We have to lay out the orbits in terms of the life of the satellite and where the planets will be so the whole project will not bog down.

Computer measurements and data were run back and forth over the centuries when suddenly it came to a halt, displaying a red signal, which meant that either there was something wrong with the information fed into it or with the results as compared to the standards. They called in the service department to check it out, and the technicians asked what was wrong.

The scientists had discovered that somewhere in space in elapsed time a day was missing. Nobody seemed able to come up with a solution to the problem. Finally one of the team, a Christian, said: "You know, when I was still in Sunday School, they spoke about the sun standing still....."

While his colleagues didn't believe him, they did not have an answer either, so they said: "Show us." He got a Bible and opened it at the book of Joshua where they found a pretty ridiculous statement for any one with 'common sense'. There they read about the Lord saying to Joshua: "Fear them not, I have delivered them into thy hand; there shall not be a man of them stands before thee." (Joshua 10:8).

Joshua was concerned because the enemy had surrounded him, and if darkness fell, they would overpower him. So Joshua asked the Lord to make the sun stand still!

That's right - "And the sun stood still and the moon stayed, until the people had avenged themselves upon their enemies. Is this not written in the book of Ja 's-her? So the sun stood still in the midst of heaven and hastened not to go down about a whole day." (Joshua 10:13).

The astronauts and scientists said: "There is the missing day!" They checked the computers going back into the time it was written and found it, but it was not close enough. The elapsed time that was missing back

in Joshua's day was 23 hours and 20 minutes - not a whole day. They read the Bible again and there it was: "about (approximately) a day." These little words in the Bible were important, but they were still in trouble, because another 40 minutes were still unaccounted for, and this could mean trouble 1000 years from now.

Forty minutes had to be found because it can be multiplied many times over in orbits. As the Christian employee thought about it, he remembered somewhere in the Bible which said the sun went backwards. The scientists told him he was out of his mind, but once again they opened the Book and read these words in 2 Kings. Hezekiah, on his deathbed, was visited by the prophet, Isaiah, who told him he was not going to die. Hezekiah asked for some sign as proof.

Isaiah said: "Shall the sun go forward ten degrees, or go back ten degrees?" And Hezekiah answered: "It is a light thing for the shadow to go down ten degrees; nay, but let the shadow return backwards ten degrees." And Isaiah the prophet cried unto the Lord, and He brought the shadow ten degrees backward, by which it had gone down in the dial of Ahaz." (2 Kings 20:9 -11).

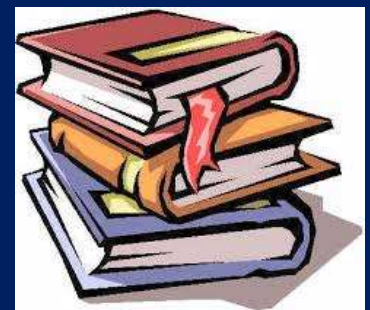
Ten degrees is exactly 40 minutes! Twenty-three hours and twenty minutes in Joshua, plus 40 minutes in 2 Kings accounted for the missing day in the universe!

Isn't this amazing? Our God is rubbing their noses in His Truth!

3rd April 2014 : National Consult of Regional Secretaries for Education and Culture

A day long National Consultation of all Regional Education Secretaries took place at the CBCI Centre in New Delhi on the 3rd April. The Chairman Bishop Rt. Rev. Joshua Mar Ignathios as well as the two member Bishops, Archbishop George Antonyswamy of Chennai and Archbishop Thmoas D'souza of Kolkata were present right through the day. The President of the CBCI His Eminence Basellos Cardinal Cleemis addressed the meeting in the morning. The main agenda items of the meeting were to plan how to carry forward the "All India catholic Education Policy 2007" towards implementation, evaluation and accreditation and certification in all our educational institutions; to sensitise about the importance of drawing up a Child Protection Policy for all our institutions and to plan for greater accountability of all educational institutions to the Regional and National office of the CBCI and to plan how to make the the Regional and National offices self financing. The latest situation of the Constitutional Bench of the Supreme Court hearing of the case on RTE by Private schools was also looked into. The meeting was from 10.00 AM to 4.15 P.M.



22nd , 23rd May 2014 – North Eastern Heads of Catholic Schools Meet :

On the above mentioned dates Fr. J. Manipadam met over 100 heads of Catholic schools of North Eastern India to initiate them and train them about the implementation of the All India Catholic Education Policy 2007 by way of initiating them to a process of showing positive and convincing indicators and leading toward evaluation and accreditation and certification of their respective institutions. Several sessions were conducted as a process and it was each followed by question answer sessions. Rt. Rev. Bishop J.Pullopallil, the Education in charge of the region was himself present for the meeting along with Rev. Fr. V.M. Thomas, the Salesian Provincial and Secretary of the region for Education and Sr. Molly the joint Education Secretary .



19th, 20th June 2014 : Training for Heads of catholic Schools of Jabalpur diocese

Two days' training programme was held for some 50 Principals and managers of Catholic schools of Jabalpur diocese on 19th and 20th of June 2014. The training was held at St. Aloysius senior secondary school at Jabalpur. The training on the implementation of the All India Catholic Education Policy was given by Fr. J. Manipadam.. Several sessions were conducted as a process and.



5th July 2014 : Orientation on Child Protection Policy :

A day's orientation cum training programme for 25 persons involved in teaching the poorer children of Delhi at the Kristu Raja School was conducted by Fr. Joseph Manipadam at the school premises. The programme was mainly to ensure that the children are protected from any kind of abuse and to ensure that the children's rights are upheld.

18th July 2014: Regional Education Committee Meeting : W. Bengal Region

Educational Secretaries from the various dioceses of Bengal had a day long meeting with the Archbishop of Kolkata, Rt. Rev. Thomas D'souza, Rev. Fr. Moloy D'Costa the Regional Education Secretary and Rev. Fr. J. Manipadam, the National Secretary for Education and culture, CBCI. The meeting was basically to prepare for the coming days' training programme on the implementation of the catholic Education Policy as well as to discuss the issues faced by the schools of this region. There were 15 Education Secretaries & office bearers



19, 20th July 2014: Consultation & Training to Implement the catholic Education Policy 2007 : W. Bengal Region

Around 50 persons, a team of six from each of the dioceses of W. Bengal attended the two days' training programme on how to implement the Catholic Education Policy 2007 by showing positive indicators and getting each institution ready for evaluation, accreditation and certification. The methodology was taught to each team from the diocese. The resource person was Fr. J. Manipadam. Archbishop of Kolkata, Rt. Rev. Thomas D'souza, Rev. Fr. Moloy D'Costa the Regional Education Secretary were presiding and animating too.



23,24th July 2014: Consultation & Training to Implement the catholic Education Policy 2007 : Mumbai

Around 200 persons, all Principals and managers of schools from the Archdiocese of Mumbai attended the two days' training programme on how to implement the Catholic Education Policy of 2007 by showing positive indicators and getting each institution ready for evaluation, accreditation and certification. The methodology was taught to each team from the dioceses. The resource person was Fr. J. Manipadam. His Eminence Cardinal Oswald Gracious and the Auxiliary Bishop of Mumbai and Fr. George Athaide the Regional Education Secretary were present and animated the sessions.

18th August 2014: Consultation & Training to Implement the catholic Education Policy 2007 : Agra

Around 62 persons, all Principals and managers of schools from the Archdiocese of Agra attended a day's training programme on how to implement the catholic education Policy of 2007 by showing positive indicators and getting each institution ready for evaluation, accreditation and certification. The methodology was taught to each head of the schools of the Archdiocese of Agra. The resource person was Fr. J. Manipadam. His Grace Archbishop Albert D'Souza who is also the Secretary General of the CBCI and the Diocesan Education Secretary presided.



22nd to 24th August 2014 : Colloquium on Education :Philosophy, Policy and Practice at Jaipur

Three days' discussions (colloquium) took place at Jaipur with 20 other leading activists and who is who of various Educational NGOs on policy matters, philosophies, and practices in the field of education. The participants were from different parts of the sub continent and it was an analysis and study about education as seen experienced and imparted in the subcontinent. Fr. J. Manipadam was also a resource person who contributed at the colloquium.

29th and 30th August 2014 : Training programme at Shillong

Two days' Training and orientation programme was held at the Archbishop's house Shillong on the implementation of the All India Catholic Education Policy 2007 on the 29th and 30th of August. The Resource person was Fr. J. Manipadam. Archbishop Dominic Jala and Fr. Richard also pitched in to animate the programme. It was attended by 74 heads and managers of Catholic schools of the region



1st & 2nd September 2014 : Training Programme at Aizawl

Two days' Training and orientation programme was held at the Bishop's house Aizawl on the implementation of the All India Catholic Education Policy 2007 on the 1st and 2nd of August. The Resource person was Fr. J. Manipadam. Bishop Stephen and Fr. Belthasar also helped to animate the programme. It was attended by about 50 heads and managers of catholic schools of Mizoram



31st August & 3rd September 2014 : Visits to some of the Schools of Shillong & Mizoram

After the programme for the heads of Catholic schools in Shillong and Mizoram, Fr. Manipadam also visited a few schools in Shillong and Mizoram namely the Don Bosco Technical School, St Paul's School, St. Mary's School, the Auxilium School, Don Bosco School High School etc. in places like Seling and Ritu in Mizoram and addressed the students at their assembly and had meeting with the teachers.



13th September 2014 : Executive Committee Meeting of AINACS at New Delhi:

A day long Executive meeting of the All India Association of Catholic School took place at the AINACS Bhawan in Dwaraka, Delhi. All the executive members (office bearers) of the organization were present. Mostly it was a planning session to finalize the details of the forthcoming AGM that would be held at Jalandhar in the first week of October. Other matters regarding the National Office were discussed and finalized.

22nd -24th September 2014 : Consultation and Training of Trainers programme at CBCI, Delhi ::

22nd September was basically the day of arrival of the participants and planning for the next two days of the Training of Trainers programme. On 23rd and 24th September we had two full days of training programme. After the Orientation session by Bishop Joshua Mar Ignatius, the Bishop in charge of the Education and Culture Commission of the CBCI and introduction of the participants, a brief sharing of the initiatives taken in each region towards the implementation of the Catholic Education Policy was done. After which a number of sessions with reflection and sharing by all followed for the next two days on the topics : How Catholic are our Catholic Schools, The All India Catholic Education Policy and its Salient features, Translating it from Policy to Action, How to show Positive Indicators of Implementation, and How effective is the way we are running our Institutions etc. There were in all 30 participants from all the different regions of India. Similarly regarding the Self financing project that was already discussed and passed by the Standing Committee of Bishops, the unanimous proposal by all at the meeting was that the Office of Education and Culture do a calculation considering the type, number and strength of the Education institutions of the various dioceses of each Region and ask the Bishop in charge of Education in each Region exactly what is the amount that is expected from each Region and leave it to each of them to decide the modality and amount of collection from each diocese from all institutes run by both diocese and religious orders, depending on the situation of each diocese.



9th & 10th September 2014 : Animation and Training for Heads of Catholic Schools of UP and UK



Two days training and animation programme was conducted by the Office of Education and Culture, CBCI for all the heads of catholic Schools of Uttar Pradesh and Utterkhand on the 9th and 10th September at Jhansi. The programme was conducted at the Primary school Auditorium in the Bishop's House complex. The training was taken by Fr. Joseph Manipadam and it was basically about the implementation of the All India Catholic Education Policy and the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act 2012. After the two days' programme a day was spent also in visiting some of the Catholic Schools of Jhansi.

2nd-5th Oct 2014: 47th Annual Convention and AGM of the (AINACS) All India Association of Catholic Schools in India :

It was held at St. Joseph's School at Defence colony Jalandhar from the 2nd to the 5th of October 2014. Around 400 participants from all over India took part in the meeting. Fr. Joseph Manipadam was present as an Ex-Officio Executive member of the AINACS as it is affiliated to the CBCI office for Education and Culture. He presided over both the two Executive meetings as well as the AGM and the evaluation meeting at the end of the AGM. He also insisted about the importance of the Implementation of the Catholic Education Policy and presented a full session on ensuring that the method of Education in our schools need to be truly formative and scientific. He also insisted that as an Association affiliated to the CBCI, the Bishop in Charge of the office of Education and Culture should be invited to the meeting hence forth.



8th and 9th Oct 2014: Training and Animation for Heads of catholic Schools of Diphu Diocese :



Diphu diocese is in a very remote hill area of Assam almost totally belonging to the Kharbi Anglong district of Assam mostly inhabited by the Kharbi tribal people, some of whom have taken to militancy in the past few years. Some 50 heads of catholic schools had their training and animation mainly on the implementation of the catholic Education Policy of 2007 and on the Child Protection Policy that is to be drawn up as a follow up of the "Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Bill 2012 passed by the Government and on other matters of concern from the CBCI. The resource persons for the training programme was Fr. Joseph Manipadam .

10th and 11th Oct 2014: Training and Animation for Heads of catholic Schools of Dibrugarh Diocese:

It was held at St. Joseph's School at Defence colony Jalandhar from the 2nd to the 5th of October 2014. Around 400 participants from all over India took part in the meeting. Fr. Joseph Manipadam was present as an Ex-Officio Executive member of the AINACS as it is affiliated to the CBCI office for Education and Culture. 12 Oct 2014: Seminar for 160 teachers from 5 different Catholic schools of Jorhat

At Don Bosco school Jorhat the fathers grabbed the occasion of the presence of Fr. J. Manipadam, Secretary for the Office of Education and Culture, CBCI, in Assam to organize a day's training programme for all the teachers of 5 Catholic schools of the Jorhat town. Jorhat is known as the Knowledge and Cultural capital of Assam. The programme was about being effective as teachers and teaching according to the policies of the Catholic Education Policy of 2007.



13th 14th Oct 2014: Training and Animation for Heads of catholic Schools of Dibrugarh Diocese :

Tezpur diocese is again in Assam almost totally populated by the Adhivasi community working in the tea gardens. Some 52 heads of catholic schools had their training and animation mainly on the implementation of the Catholic Education Policy of 2007 and on the Child Protection Policy that is to be drawn up as a follow up of the "Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Bill 2012 passed by the Government and on other matters of concern from the CBCI. The resource persons for the training programme was Fr. Joseph Manipadam. Bishop Michael Acasius presided over and Bishop Robert Kerketta too was present for the programme.



24th to 26th Oct 2014 : Executive Board meeting of the Xavier Board of Higher Education in India :

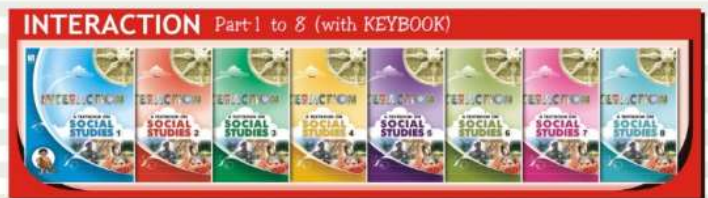


Since the Xavier Board of Higher Education is the only Association for colleges that are affiliated to the CBCI, the Secretary, Office of Education and Culture, CBCI attended that meeting held at Nagpur from the 24th to the 26th October 2014. There were around 30 Board members. The main task was to revise and amend the Constitutions of the Xavier Board of Higher Education. So in the process on behalf of the CBCI, the Secretary ensured that the Association keeps the link with the CBCI, that it takes to heart the Policies of the Catholic Church as found in the "All India catholic Education Policy 2007", participates in the activities launched by the Education and Culture Office of the CBCI and shares its concerns. The Secretary of the Office of Education and Culture remains a member of the Executive Board and has a vital role to play in the Board meetings with at least one session assigned to him and the Bishop in Charge of the Office of Education and Culture is invited to all the Annual General Assemblies and Triennial assemblies.

10th and 11th November 2014: The Joint meeting of the Regional Deputy Secretaries and CBCI Office Bearers and CBCI Office Secretaries:

The above mentioned meeting took place at the CBCI Centre, New Delhi presided over by His Grace Philip Neri on the first day and His Grace Albert D'souza on the second day. At the meeting the Reports from the various regions were presented by the Regional Deputy Secretaries. A summing up and response to the reports, was done by Fr. Paul Munjeli of caritas India. Fr. Manipadam presented a session about the Restructuring and the concept and scope of the Core Team as well as the present days concerns facing the Church in India today. The Second day was animated by Bishop Thomas Dabre of Pune and he animated a session on the implementation of the Statement drawn up at the Plenary Meeting at Palai in the beginning of the year. A study on the Statement was followed by drawing up of an action plan to implement the statement in each diocese and in each region. Next the office Secretaries of the CBCI responded to the Regional Deputy Secretaries expressing their views on the scope for collaboration by the Regional Deputy Secretaries and the CBCI Office Secretaries with regards to the respective tasks of each CBCI office. A short session on Capacity building was taken to conclude the two days' meeting, by Fr. Freddy D'souza, director of Caritas India. In all 27 participants attended the meeting on both the days.
