

Message from National Education Secretary

Your Eminences, Graces, Excellencies, Fathers, Sisters, Brothers,

First of all wish you a grace filled Christmas and a Happy New Year ahead!

Even as lots of concerns are there in the Education scenario with Fee Regulation Act in the offing in different states with Gujarat and Jharkhand passing it and Chhattisgarh HC confirming that Minority Institutions are exempt from the mandatory 25% EWS admissions etc.. We had a chance to make a presentation regrading the proposals and concerns from the Catholic Church (CBCI) regarding education

to the new 10 member NEP drafting Committee on 4th December at 2.30 P.M. Dr. K. Kasturirangan and other members of the Drafting Committee were extremely kind and welcoming as they allowed about an hour of interaction with them. In the presentation submitted this time, we have made some path-breaking suggestions:

- * To safeguard the Constitutional Rights of the Minority Communities to establishing and administer their own educational institutions and in this regard to simplify the process of issuing the Minority Certificates.
- * To move towards having multiple Accreditation Bodies other than only NAAC, in the area of Higher Education in order to make it corruption free and enable accreditation of many more if not all colleges. So we have asked to allow the private Institutions and Associations like "Xavier Board of Higher Education" to establish an Accreditation Body to accredit colleges.
- * Considering the fact that 50 lakhs of children are still out of school, all those who are compassionately inclined to participate in the mission of education be roped in and as the Christian Missionaries have been pioneers rendering dedicated service in education for centuries, to be invited to start a "National Catholic Education Board" to further enhance School Education as there are already thousands of schools run by the Catholic Community.
- * As acute shortage of Higher education institutions in the country is no secret and as there is need for many more
 Universities, to establish a Central CATHOLIC University and in a particular state, cluster of colleges could be
 declared as CLUSTER UNIVERSITY with adequate financial support in addition to the existing universities.

The meeting which lasted about an hour took place at the Conference hall of the UGC New Delhi, and Dr. K.Kasturirangan and the other Drafting Committee members were extremely cordial and welcoming and mentioned that the omission regarding the contribution of the Christian Missionaries towards education in India, in the last NEP draft would be definitely looked into and the suggestions given and the concerns raised by us currently would also be studied and considered. The meeting ended with pleasantries shared over a cup of tea by Dr. Kasturirangan regarding his very happy acquaintance with the Vatican.

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

REPORT OF PROGRAMMES CONDUCTED BY THE CBCI OFFICE FOR EDUCATION AND CULTURE

10-12th August 2017: 3 days' Training for the Carmalite Sister Principals of the Central Province at Pune:

75 Sister Principals and managers of schools of the Central province of the Carmalite sisters had three days of training programme at the Jesuit Provincialate, Sanjeevan in Pune. 
1,2,3 October 2017: All India Catholic School Association's AGM at Chennai
