

Dear Fathers/Sisters/Brothers and Lay faithful,

I am filled with joy as I pen these words following my Episcopal Ordination. First and foremost, I want to express my heartfelt gratitude to God for choosing me to shepherd the diocese of Itanagar. The inscriptions on the steeple of my home parish, "For nothing is Impossible for God" (Lk 2:37) resonates deeply within me. Like our blessed Mother, I humbly submit to God's will. Reflecting on my journey as a missionary and a priest, I recognize the immense responsibility and daunting challenges that lie ahead. However, I firmly believe that God's grace will always protect and guide me. I entrust my Episcopal ministry and mission to the maternal care of Mother Mary and the paternal guidance of St. Joseph who is the patron saint of our diocese.

I would like to express my indebtedness to His Excellency Most Rev. Dr. John Moolachira the Archbishop of Guwahati, who was the principal consecrator of my Episcopal ordination. My sincere appreciation extends to Most Rev. John Thomas and Most Rev. James Thoppil for being the coconsecrators. I thankfully acknowledge the participation of Msgr. Juan Pablo Cerrillos Hernandez, Deputy Head at the Apostolic Nunciature to India and Nepal.

The presence of all those involved in the work for Episcopal Ordination and the thanksgiving service and dinner on 16th October was a reassurance for all the manifold blessings God had bestowed on us. We did it together to glorify God. May the Lord who called us together continue to lead us forward, onward and may we march ahead to Glorify God.

We are not capable of changing our destiny though the power of human will alone. However, when we let Him work through us, He will create magnificent works reflective of His impeccable character and blueprint. Let us constantly be reminded that "Everything is possible for one who believes" Mk 9.23. The word of God constantly encourages us to believe in God. We take the impossible situations in our lives and turn them into great opportunities for Christ.

1. The annual Pastoral Conference

The annual Pastoral Conference this year was held at the NEDSF, Guwahati from 8th –to 11th September 2023 on the Theme, "*Fratelli Tutti* – Building Fraternity among ourselves and Other Faiths". It is an important topic that had a great bearing on the Church in Northeast India. I am dispatching the joint pastoral letter the outcome of the Pastoral Conference. 2. Northeast Bishops' Conference

The Archbishops and Bishops of the North East Region had their annual meeting at Bishop's House, Shillong from the 11th and 12th September. It is an annual feature that all the bishops come together to deliberate on all common matters pertaining to the Catholic Church in the region. I had the joy of attending such meeting for the first time. Many issues were discussed and reflected for the good of the Church.

3. Devotion to Holy Rosary

As all of us know that the month of October is especially dedicated to the Holy Rosary. Many of the Catholic faithful all over the world would organize special rosary services and pray the rosary in groups, sector, fellowships, families and neighborhood. I recommend that all our priests and religious take special care to pray the Holy Rosary individually and in groups, thus spreading the devotion to Our Blessed Mother Mary. The devotion of the rosary has been part of our tradition for almost a thousand years, having developed in the second millennium of Christianity. The Dominican Religious Order was instrumental in kindling the popularity of this devotion.

Various Popes over the centuries have given their endorsement and have persistently advocated for the Holy Rosary to be recited with heightened devotion and utmost fervor. This is especially emphasized in our churches and homes during the month of October. Hence, I urge all to recite this revered prayer and comprehend dignity, power, and excellence. The Holy Rosary is not merely a sequence of prayers; it is a testament to our faith and devotion. Embarking on this spiritual journey, let us appreciate the profound impact of the Holy Rosary on our lives.

4. Mission Sunday 22nd October

Pope Francis has extended an invitation to us all this World Mission Sunday to reflect on the story of Emmaus (Lk 24:13-35). He urges us to keep our hearts aflame with love and our feet with steadfast in our journey with Jesus. The narrative of Emmaus serves as a reminder of our own journey with Christ. When his Disciples recognized him they remembered, "Were our hearts not aflame within us, as he spoke to us on the road, as he explained the scriptures to us?" Immediately they rose to their feet (Lk 24:32-33).

We echo this sentiment through our call to deepen our faith and allegiance to Jesus, bearing witness to his Gospel and mercy in every aspect of our lives. Just as the Lord mandated his disciples to disseminate the Gospel far and wide, we too are endued with the same mission and zeal. We should strive to ignite our minds and hearts with the passion to spread his mission worldwide. The disciples of Emmaus embarked on their missionary work by sharing the news of our resurrected Lord with their community, friends, and acquaintances.

This is the day to remember and rekindle our baptismal call to propagate the Gospel. Let us also strive to embody and share God's love in our families, workplaces, and neighborhoods. On the 22nd of October, we are especially implored to pray for missionaries around the world. Let our prayers accompany them in their adversities, pains, and sufferings as they labor to disseminate the Gospel.

May our compassionate God bestow upon them his blessings, granting them strength, wisdom, and resilience to overcome challenges and bring salvation to humankind. Let us partake in the missionary activities of the Church through our spiritual and material support.

The collection received in all parishes on World Mission Sunday should serve as a symbol of unity and mutual concern amongst the churches. Let's demonstrate generosity in our contributions.

5. Month of November

As we draw closer to the month of November, we approach a time specifically dedicated to offering prayers for the souls in purgatory, and for those who have departed before us. During this month, we remember and pray for our deceased family members, our friends, and our benefactors. Yearly, we dedicate our prayers to them and their loved ones, it's therefore important to remember and pray for all our departed loved ones and benefactors.

Visiting the cemetery, blessing the graves, and praying there is a traditional Catholic practice. Let's continue with these worthwhile customs, which encourage devotion and form an integral part of our Catholic heritage and tradition. I will be at Banderdewa to offer the Holy Eucharist and bless the tomb of late Br. Prembhai, who was a great missionary to our land.

6. Directory for Lay Catechists

The Conference of Catholic Bishops of India (CCBI) has published the Directory for Lay Catechists, which outlines directives and norms concerning the identity, formation, and role of lay catechists. This includes Sunday school catechists, teachers of catechesis in regular schools, and full-time

catechists in mission areas. The Directory for Lay Catechists was developed at the request of the Bishops, following Pope Francis's issuance of his Apostolic Letter, *Antiquum Ministerium*, on May 10, 2021.

This draft Directory was circulated among all Bishops as well as the Directors of Catechetics from each diocese, with over 40 Bishops providing their observations in response. The Directory's aim is to offer clear guidelines for bishops, directors of catechetical instruction, and lay catechists to better understand their identity and mission.

It serves as a helpful resource for parish priests, assisting with the appropriate selection of lay catechists, their adequate formation, and defining their specific roles within the parishes. Effectively, this Directory provides a roadmap for the lay catechist ministry within India. Copies of the Directory will be made available at Bishop's house.

7. Communio India 2nd Sunday of November

Communio India" is an initiative introduced by the Conference of Catholic Bishops of India (CCBI) to support all our Dioceses and Religious Congregations working in rural and mission areas, in their pastoral ministry. The objectives of Communio India are as follows:

- 1) To assist our dioceses and religious congregations that are working in mission areas.
- 2) To foster a culture of sharing among our people, to express solidarity with our needy brothers and sisters in the country.
- 3) To encourage our faithful to pray and assist the missions and missionaries, and to promote missionary vocations.
- 4) To inspire our lay faithful to serve in mission areas as lay missionaries.
- 5) To prepare all our faithful to become missionary disciples as envisioned by Pope Francis in *Evangelii Gaudium*.

8. Blessing of Sacred Heart Church Naharlagun

As we all know, the Sacred Heart Church at Naharlagun was a cherished dream of the parish community. It took them over a decade to reach this stage. We already had two major celebrations inside the not-yet-blessed church - the Silver Jubilee of the Bishop Emeritus John Thomas in 2019, and my Episcopal Consecration. Now, the construction of the church has been completed. On November 12, 2023, at 9:30 a.m., we will be blessing and dedicating the newly constructed church. I invite all who can participate in the dedication to join and bless the community with your presence.

9. Eucharistic Procession at St. Mary's Church Itanagar and Inauguration of the Jubilee 2025

Preparations and celebrations for Jubilee 2025 are currently underway. These events are being integrated into the ongoing Synodal Journey and the Strategic Planning process so as to discern God's Plan for the Church in India at this moment in history. The theme of the Ordinary Jubilee 2025 celebrations is 'Pilgrims of Hope.' The purpose of the Jubilee has three aspects: to celebrate Jesus, celebrate the Church, and celebrate our Faith. There are two years of preparation for the Jubilee: 2023 is the Year of the Council (Year of Learning) and 2024 is the Year of Prayer. The Holy Father wishes for all members of the People of God to study the four Constitutions of the Second Vatican

Council to draw inspiration and guidance for daily life. The preparations for the Ordinary Jubilee 2025 should be inaugurated in all dioceses.

In our Diocese, on Sunday, November 26, 2023, the Solemnity of Christ the King, we will inaugurate this occasion with special prayers and a Eucharistic Procession. This year, the Eucharistic procession for the Capital Complex will be held at St. Mary's Church. Most Rev. Dennis Panipitchai, the Auxiliary Bishop of Miao, has consented to be the main celebrant on this occasion. I request all parishes in the Capital Complex to participate in the celebration and receive the Lord's Blessings. Please inform Rev. Fr. I hope and pray that the Ordinary Jubilee 2025 strengthens the hope of all members of the Church. As 'Pilgrims of Hope,' let us continue to build communion, promote participation, and deepen our commitment to mission.
