In this context, I would like to share something from Joyce Rupp’s book, **Open the Door**, which I am reading presently:

‘The image of the key opening a door to freedom led me to view the door as a potent symbol for spiritual growth – What needs to be unlocked in me? How could I release and discover more of my potential to be my best self? What closed doors were helpful, which ones held me back? I compared the movement of opening a door to my desire to be my authentic self. Each opening is an occasion to learn and accept what is truest about who I am. There is great freedom in this process which helps me to recognize my genuine self, the one God created me to be, which leads to self-acceptance and harmony.

The full person God created us to be contains more than we can imagine. Opening the door of our heart allows us entrance into the vast treasure of who we are and to the Divine Presence within us. We have an immeasurable amount of love and tenderness in us if only we open the door to discover it, and grow into the fullness of who we are. The Holy One is forever startling us with the prospect of further growth. This needs intention and awareness. We develop this alertness through pauses of silence, focused prayer, meaningful worship, deliberate reflection and dialogue with spiritual companions. Anytime we slow down and choose to stop and consider what is happening (or not happening) in our life, we are preparing ourselves to open the door of our heart.

When I open the door of my heart to God I risk being spiritually transformed into a person whose life continually manifests goodness. I make a decision about the direction I want to go, whether forward or backward. The choices and decisions I make determine whether I enter the unknown territory of growth or turn back and cling to the safety of who I presently am.'



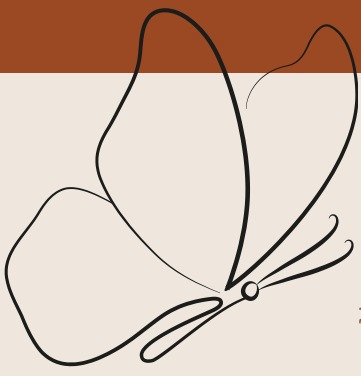

MARY WARD – A PILGRIM WALKING THE PATH OF GOD’S WILL

To know Mary Ward is to love and admire her. For me, it means walking the journey of my life as she did hers. Mary Ward, to me, is one of the most extraordinary and outstanding women in the Church and in history. She was a pioneer of the contemplative-active religious life for women, advocating a non-cloistered life and self-governance for religious women. She also recognized religious as lay persons in their rightful place and therefore encouraged them to dress in lay clothes, despite facing contempt and ridicule from many.

Mary Ward’s courage and daring were unmatched. She crossed the Alps three times for the work of the Institute. She travelled through war-torn Europe and traversed the English Channel, unafraid of the dangers such journeys posed for women. She braved persecution in England and served there fearlessly. She recognized the importance of widespread education for the girl child and the upliftment of women. She faced imprisonment, accusations, and criticism with calmness and dignity. But her greatest sorrow was being rejected by the Church she loved, branded as “a heretic, schismatic, and enemy of Holy Church,” and eventually dying in isolation, having lost all that she had strived for. Such difficulties would have sapped the confidence of most women, but not that of Mary Ward.

What was the secret of Mary’s drive, her passion, her courage, and her daring? On studying her life more closely, I saw that Mary Ward was committed to following God’s will, no matter what it cost her or how it might disrupt her life. “We have but one occupation – to fulfil the will of God in everything,” she says. At every stage of her calling, she was careful to discern her next step, striving to do exactly what God asked of her, even if it brought difficulties or criticism.

At the tender age of ten, she discerned that she should receive Holy Communion, even though it meant going against what appeared to be her father’s instructions. In her prison cell, there is a beautiful account in her biography of her discernment about how she should proceed further. It was God’s will that she sought and rejoiced to fulfil. Even in prison, Mary Ward did not back down. Instead, she calmly wrote secret letters to her sisters, encouraging them to continue the work for God.

One of her notable quotes is: “The way of love is the way of the Cross, but all who walk in it shall have life eternal.” What depth of vision, what courage, and what dedication! Yet what loneliness, challenges, and heartaches it can bring.

This is news from Maria Sick Shelter, where Sr. Regina works under the Barishal Diocese. It is a small project serving the very poor and needy patients who cannot afford to visit a doctor or obtain the medicines prescribed for them.

Sr. Regina leads a team that visits different villages every month—sometimes twice if necessary, and if there are sufficient funds for medicines and doctors' fees. Patients receive free check-ups and medicine. It is a truly satisfying service, though challenging at times. Sr. Regina is confident in her work and gives herself wholeheartedly to it. People are overjoyed whenever she visits the villages and offer her fresh vegetables, fruits, rice, cow milk, fish, and whatever else they can give with full gratitude.

She enjoys a very good rapport with all the parish priests, who refer patients from their parishes—those who cannot afford private doctors or proper medication.








