Typically, posters feature a combination of text, images, and graphics arranged in a visually appealing layout. Book- First Flight - ‘A Tiger in the Zoo’ "A Tiger in the Zoo" by Leslie Norris highlights the contrast between a tiger’s life in captivity and in the wild. The poem shows the tiger’s quiet anger as it paces behind bars, far from its natural home. It reflects on the loss of freedom and dignity animals face in zoos. The poem encourages respect for wild creatures and their right to live freely. Read the poem and prepare a creative and visually appealing poster on the theme "Save Tigers".</p> <p>Your poster should:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reflect the emotions and message of the poem. • Include a powerful slogan or caption. • Use imagery, drawings, or symbols to show the contrast between a tiger in the wild and a tiger in captivity. • Encourage awareness about tiger conservation and their natural habitat. <p>Be creative in both visual design and message.
