

**NOTICE TO PARENTS / GUARDIANS****Dear Parent/Guardian,**

The Management constantly endeavours to promote student well-being and holistic development. As part of this commitment, a Cyber Security Awareness Session was conducted on Monday, December 01, 2025, for students of Classes VI to XII in collaboration with **Ahaan Foundation under the Cyber Security and Support Unit of Jaipur Police Commissionerate**. The session focused on Cybercrimes Committed by Minors and the Legal Consequences under the POCSO Act, enabling students and teachers to gain crucial insights into responsible digital conduct and online safety.

Following the session, several students voluntarily reached out to the counsellors from Ahaan Foundation for one-on-one interaction regarding their queries and concerns. This response clearly reflects the significance and urgency of addressing cyber safety in the present digital era.

In consideration of the session outcomes and safety of our students, the Management feels it is vital for parents to stay informed and proactive in guiding their children. Hence, we wish to bring your urgent attention and sensitise you about the growing incidents of cyber misconduct involving minors and the strict legal provisions related to such acts.

Instances such as image morphing, creation or circulation of indecent content, sharing inappropriate photographs or videos, cyberbullying, stalking, misuse of social media accounts, and forwarding obscene material — even when done casually or without malicious intent — are considered **serious criminal offences under the Information Technology Act (IT Act), the Indian Penal Code (IPC), and the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act**.

The Management has *zero tolerance* for cyber offences. If your ward is involved in any such act, it will lead to strict consequences, including legal action wherever applicable.

Ignorance of the law is not considered an excuse. Even forwarding an inappropriate image/video without consent is treated as an act of harassment and exploitation, carrying serious legal consequences.

To ensure the digital safety and accountability of every child, we urge all parents to:

- Monitor and supervise their child's online activities
- Educate them about respectful and lawful digital behaviour
- Encourage responsible use of social media and communication platforms
- Guide them to report cyber abuse rather than engage in or ignore it

Our collective responsibility is to ensure a safe, respectful, and secure environment for all students — both offline and online. With your cooperation and support, we can empower our children to make informed and responsible digital choices.

Let us work together to safeguard every child's future in the digital world.
